One MAFFS C-130 airtanker and support personnel from the 152<sup>nd</sup> Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard) and one MAFFS C-130 airtanker and support personnel from the 146<sup>th</sup> Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) have been deployed to Port Hueneme, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Sixty Fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest Area.

Two hundred forty-five soldiers from the 14th Brigade Engineer Battalion and the 1st Battalion, 17th Infantry Regiment based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Boise National Forest. NIMO (Team 2) is assigned to support the military contingent.

**Wapiti**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Fourteen miles west of Stanley, ID. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Middle Fork Complex (2 fires)**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 3). Nine miles east of Garden Valley, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Fish Creek**, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 1). Twenty-two miles southeast of Moran, WY. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Boulter**, West Desert District, BLM. Twenty-five miles west of Santaquin, UT. Chaparral, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs, backing and creeping. Structures, energy infrastructure, transportation infrastructure and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

**Snag**, Boise NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 2). IMT is also managing the Boulder, Dollar, Goat and Wolf Creek fires. Ten miles east of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Boulder**, Boise NF, USFS. Nine miles southwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Dollar**, Boise NF, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Goat**, Boise NF, USFS. Eleven miles southeast of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Wolf Creek**, Payette NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Cascade, ID. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Communication infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

\* **Anderson**, Southwest Area, Utah DOF. One mile northwest of Toquerville, UT. Brush, hardwood slash and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened.

**Flat**, Southwest Area, Idaho Department of Lands. CIMT (GB Team 6). Eleven miles north of Idaho City, ID. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Limepoint**, Payette NF, USFS. Three miles southwest of Cuprum, ID. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, single tree torching and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Iron Peak**, Dixie NF, USFS. Five miles northeast of Paragonah, UT. Chaparral and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Residences threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Diamond Complex (2 fires)**, Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 4). IMT is also managing the Middle Fork fire. Eighteen miles southwest of Chemult, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Middle Fork**, Crater Lake NP, NPS. Fourteen miles northeast of Union Creek, OR. Brush, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Homestead Complex (5 fires)**, Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). Thirty miles northeast of Glide, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Williams Mine**, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 13) back to local unit will occur tomorrow. Four miles northwest of Trout Lake, WA. Brush, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Willamette Complex (4 fires)**, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7) and CIMT (EA Team 1). IMTs are also managing the Ore fire. Eight miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Transportation and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Ore**, Willamette NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Blue River, OR. Brush and timber. Closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Pioneer**, Southeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 3). Started on private land 10 miles southeast of Stehekin, WA. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Whisky Creek**, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). IMT is also managing the Sandstone fire. Six miles southeast of Cascade Locks, OR. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Sandstone**, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Nine miles southwest of Ripplebrook, OR. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lane 1**, East Lane Unit, ODF. CIMT (AK Team 1). Fifteen miles southeast of Springfield, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**2620 Road**, Olympic Region, Washington DNR. Twenty miles northwest of Bremerton, WA. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures, energy and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Crazy Creek**, Ochoco NF, USFS. Sixteen miles northeast of Paulina, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Ruby**, North Cascades NP, NPS. Thirty-two miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

**Red**, Deschutes NF, USFS. Eighteen miles west of Crescent, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Upper Ruby**, Colville NF, USFS. Sixteen miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Medium slash and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with creeping, spotting and smoldering. Structures threatened.

**Battle Mountain Complex (2 fires)**, Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. Eight miles north of Ukiah, OR. Grass, hardwood litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

The mid-level trough of low pressure which advanced through the northwestern US over the weekend will continue weakening and lift into the Northern Plains Monday into Monday night. Low relative humidities and gusty west to southwest winds at 15-25 mph with gusts up to 40 mph will linger over north central Colorado and central and eastern Wyoming Monday afternoon. Relative humidity levels of 10-20 percent are forecast over the Great Basin, western Arizona and the deserts of southern California along with warming temperatures as weak ridging builds into these areas.

A strong cold front and mid-level trough of low pressure is expected to advance eastward through the Pacific Northwest, northern Great Basin and northern Rockies late Monday night into Wednesday evening. Gusty west winds and areas of low relative humidities will affect these areas as these features move through. Any wetting rainfall will be confined to the Washington Cascades on Monday.

Temperatures will drop slightly across the Southern Plains but remain above normal. Minimum relative humidities will also improve slightly over the High Plains but are still expected to drop into the 20s. Above normal temperatures will persist over the rest of the Plains and Mississippi Valley as an upper ridge of high pressure remains in place over the central US.
