Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot temperatures will build across the southern half of the West today with widespread temperatures above 100°F, with some locations nearing or exceeding records for the date. Temperatures will remain closet to normal across the Florida peninsula today, with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms will develop across the eastern Plains through the Mississippi Valley this afternoon, with some storms likely to be severe from northern Missouri into Minnesota. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are also likely to spread eastward into the Appalachians and Deep South this evening. Much of the Northeast will remain dry, but relative humidity will remain elevated and winds light. Slightly above normal temperatures and isolated thunderstorms will continue for much of Interior Alaska, with the warmest and driest conditions in the Upper Yukon Basin along with breezy afternoon easterly winds. Trade winds and windward showers will continue to diminish for across Hawai'i.
