B. MULISTATE PROFESSIONAL RESPONSBILITY EXAM (MPRE)

To be eligible for admission, you must have: (a) Achieved 85 or higher within the 36 months prior to your application for admission to the Oregon State Bar; or (b) have been admitted in another jurisdiction where passage of the MPRE is required for admission and has substantially and continuously engaged in the practice of law for at least 12 months in that jurisdiction.
