- 16 Q Okay. What else did he say that you can recall?
- 17 A Well basically, the gist of it was, I think
- 18 Markopolos had kind of painted him as a, you know, as a
- 19 less-than-stellar individual and, you know, Grant was just
- 20 basically responding that he knew what the issues were, he
- 21 was smart enough to ask the right questions and that he
- 22 wasn't troubled by it.

- 24 ask the right question, he knew the issues, Grant was
- 25 referring to the meeting that he had with Markopolos?
