NMC Invests in Community and Business

he Norco Manufacturing
Complex takes pride in its
role as an industrial leader in
the community. Whether it is
through record-breaking contributions
to the United Way of St. Charles or
helping develop the workforce of
tomorrow through scholarships in
science, technology, engineering and
math (STEM) and process technology
(P-TECH), the Norco Manufacturing
Complex looks for ways to meaningfully
contribute to the community where its
employees live and work.

"Supporting our community, ensuring the safety and well-being of our neighbors, and reaching out to those in need are important aspects of our operations in St. Charles and surrounding parishes," said NMC General Manager Don Weaver. "Equally crucial to our operations is identifying ways to re-invest in our business to remain competitive in the industry and a major employer in the area. This is why we're so excited about the Louisiana Refining System."

In March, Motiva Enterprises announced plans to integrate its Norco and Convent refineries through a multi-phased project to connect the two through a series of pipelines and modify operations to take advantage of each refinery's strengths.

Norco Manufacturing Complex is operated by Motiva Enterprises and is comprised of Motiva's Norco refinery and Shell's Norco chemical plant. The projects included in the Louisiana refining system do not involve the chemical plant.

According to Weaver, the Norco and Convent refineries will remain separate operating facilities but work together to create opportunities that will utilize the combined crude capacity of 505,000 barrels per day for the combined sites. "The integration will bring all the major refining assets of both refineries together in a highly competitive system," he said.

The integration process begins with the planned construction of the Maurepas Pipeline System, which includes a 35-mile and a 34-mile intermediates pipeline enabling Norco and Convent to exchange feedstocks, and a 34-mile crude pipeline connecting a terminal in St. James Parish to the Norco refinery. The pipelines will be owned, constructed, maintained and operated by SemGroup Corporation, a publicly traded midstream services company.

"The pipelines will enable us to connect to crude sources as well as exchange products with the Convent refinery," said Weaver. "That's where the true integration begins."

Following pipeline construction, Motiva plans to implement additional projects as part of the integration strategy to take advantage of the best units at each refinery. For example, the fluid catalytic cracker (FCC), which is where the conversion process from crude oil to gasoline, diesel, and other refined products begins, will be idled at the Convent Refinery in favor of the newly upgraded megascale FCC at the Norco refinery. A reconfiguration of the existing hydrocracker at Norco is also planned, which is expected to further improve the performance of the Louisiana Refining System as a whole.

"The Louisiana Refining System brings the best aspects of Motiva Enterprises' Norco and Convent sites together as one of the top five of North America refineries in capacity," Weaver emphasized. "It is a great project for Norco, great for Convent, and economically beneficial to Motiva Enterprises and the Louisiana communities we operate in. Instead of two medium-sized refineries, we will have a highly competitive refining complex that is well-positioned in Louisiana for the long run."

"The benefit for the Norco Manufacturing Complex is that it really solidifies the vision for Norco as a major crude refining site," he continued.

"This is an exciting time for Motiva," added Production Manager Dai Nguyen. "NMC has been in the Norco community for almost 100 years. We want to make sure we are here for the next 100 or more." He emphasized that the integration will allow NMC increased access to more economically efficient crude oils, the base manufacturing component. This is a significant win for Norco."

No layoffs are anticipated as a result of the Louisiana integration project and the construction during the refinery portions of the project could involve up to 700 temporary jobs during its peak. During pipeline construction, SemGroup has estimated that up to 500 temporary construction jobs could be needed.

"The development of the Louisiana Refining System and collaboration with Motiva's Convent Refinery has significant potential to improve the Norco Manufacturing Complex's competitive position and our continued role as an industrial leader in the Norco community," Weaver said. "This project is a game changer for our complex, opening the door for additional growth and development as the stepping stone for future opportunities. That is good not only for our business, but for our community, too."
