The Court inquires of Mr. Brown if he has provided ADWR with copies of the proposed abstracts.

Mr. Brown states they were mailed to ADWR and he doesn't know what happened. However, amended abstracts have been prepared based on the information received from the Objectors and were sent out to all the parties. Mr. Brown further

states that there should be no remaining issues in regards to priority dates and quantity of water.

Ms. Parks advises the Court that that ADWR is in the process of reviewing the proposed abstracts.

Discussion is held regarding the amended Statement of Claim 36-48809 in which the priority dates were changed to 1885 based on information received from the San Carlos Apache Tribe.

Ms. Herrmann states that she hasn't seen the amended abstracts due to a computer problem. Ms. Herrmann further states that she has talked with Amy Brown regarding the new abstracts and from what she has heard it is likely that the Tribe won't have any objections.

IT IS ORDERED that ADWR shall review the proposed amended abstracts and file a report by **November 18, 2019**.
