# YOUR GIFTS IN ACTION

**MORE THAN 5,714 GENEROUS DONORS** made a tangible impact on our work in advancing the health and well-being of our community in 2023.

**UNRESTRICTED DONOR GIFTS** help support areas of Greatest Need, where more than \$5 million was designated in 2023 to enhance hospice and bereavement services, expand cancer programs and services, develop women's and children's projects and support research across the Greater Sacramento and Central Valley markets.



**SUTTER HEALTH GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION** programs in Amador, Davis, Roseville, Sacramento, and Modesto (beginning July 2025) match doctors from diverse backgrounds with our care centers, helping us attract more doctors to improve access for community members and align with Sutter's mission to expand graduate medical education and training.

**NEW ROBOTICS** at Sutter Auburn Faith Hospital will help orthopedic surgery patients by increasing accuracy and efficiency, providing access to more patients as a result.



The recently added **SUTTER AMADOR RURAL TRAINING TRACK**, part of expanded graduate medical education, retained one of the first-year residents to become a full-time Sutter physician.



**BEREAVEMENT SERVICES** provided through Sutter Care at Home (SCAH) are available to anyone in the community free of charge. 80% of the counseling costs are made possible through philanthropic donors, with more than 4,600 grieving family members served in 2023 alone.

Visits increased 4.1% across **IN-HOME CARE THROUGH SCAH** including advanced illness management, hospice care, infusion therapy, respiratory care, bereavement and grief support and much more. At Sutter Auburn Faith Hospital, donors support programs and services including the Hospice Service Line, community/staff education and supplies and bereavement services for anyone within Placer, Nevada, and El Dorado counties.



**INTEGRATIVE CANCER THERAPIES** at Sutter Memorial and Sutter Medical Center, Sacramento, provide cancer patients with non-medical offerings to help with their healing through art, photography, writing, music, gardening and fitness/movement classes.

**SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT** for bladder tumors



and reconstruction surgery are helping to improve patient outcomes at Sutter Tracy, and new surgical vascular microscopes will improve the care we offer to surgical oncology patients at Sutter Sacramento.

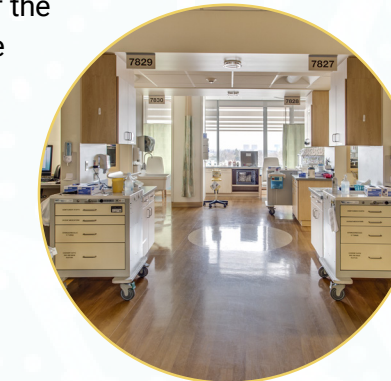
**NEW AND EXPANDED**

**INFUSION CENTERS** are also serving more patients throughout the Central Valley and Sacramento areas.

Sutter Memorial received high-risk maternal fetal upgrades including **NEW ANTEPARTUM SUITES TO CARE FOR WOMEN REQUIRING LONGER HOSPITAL STAYS, PLUS HIGH-TECH BABY LEO NICU BEDS** to care for the tiniest patients. Sutter Tracy installed new smart beds for increased safety during childbirth.

**CUDDLE COTS** at Sutter Amador and Sutter Memorial provide grieving parents with the invaluable gift of time with their deceased baby, helping parents to heal during a difficult time.

At Sutter Sacramento, **NEW NICU GIRAFFE OMNIBEDS AND WARMERS** maintain thermoregulation of the preterm infant while allowing direct observation. This is essential for the care of critically-ill premature infants.



**TRANSESOPHAGEAL ECHOCARDIOGRAM AND STATE-OF-THE-ART IMAGING** with Coronary Computed Tomography Angiography allows care teams at Sutter Amador to get better imaging of heart and artery disease to improve patient outcomes, decrease the length of hospital stays, and get patients to the best care center.

**CORONARY COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY ANGIOGRAPHY (CCTA) MODULE** added to CT scanner at Sutter Amador Hospital to examine the arteries that supply blood to the heart. Used as an initial test for patients with stable chest pain, CCTA provides a quick alternative method of assessing cardiac performance to serve more patients.

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Sutter Center for Psychiatry serves adults and adolescents with inpatient and outpatient services. Generous donors will help **EXPAND AND ENHANCE SERVICES** to the community. More patients will benefit from interventional psychiatry therapies including Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT) and Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) and a multipurpose observation unit will be created to support safe patient discharge and safe patient monitoring when needed.

offering personalized, non-clinical support to manage anxiety and depression has been downloaded more than 11,500 times in all 50 states, with nearly 4,000 accounts created by adolescents and their adult champions.

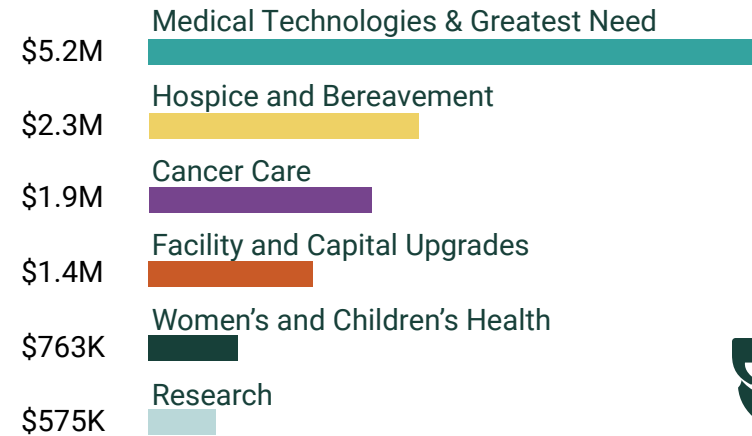


## Donor Gifts Invested by Type

## Making an Impact with Planned Giving

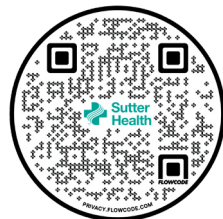

# THE POWER OF ONE GIFT

AT A GLANCE



## ACCESS

**Graduate Medical Education** expansion in five areas—Amador, Davis, Roseville, Sacramento and Modesto.

**Cardiovascular and robotic surgery** technologies allow us to serve more patients.

Home care visits through **Sutter Care at Home (SCAH)** increased **4.1%** while bereavement services continued free of charge to anyone in the community.



## HEALTH EQUITY

Our nationally recognized team of health equity leaders contributes to ongoing research and programs to put "quality" in **equality**.

- **Asthma Program** to ensure consistent treatment with underrepresented populations leading to lower visits to emergency or urgent care.
- **Behavioral Health Screening** research to determine causes for lower screening rates in underrepresented populations and increase screening for all.
- **Comprehensive Gender Care Program** provides broader cultural competency education and specific health record modules to record patient preferences, plus gender care advocates and a consolidated web presence for the LGBTQ+ community.
- **Examination of Cardiovascular Admission Rates** to ensure access to the same medications for all populations.
- **Maternal and Birth Equity Research** identifies and quantifies disparities in maternal outcomes to help mitigate and prevent maternal and infant health disparities within our system. In 2023, we launched three pilot programs focused on improving perinatal mental health screening, breastfeeding, and doula care services for at-risk patients.



## ONCOLOGY

**Enhanced Integrative cancer therapies** at Sutter Memorial and Sutter Medical Center, Sacramento.

**New and expanded infusion centers** across Greater Sacramento and Central Valley markets.

**Specialized equipment** for reconstructive and vascular surgeries.



## WOMEN/CHILDREN

**High-risk maternal fetal upgrades** including new antepartum suites at Sutter Memorial.

**Cuddle Cots** at Sutter Amador and Sutter Memorial help grieving parents.

**Smart beds** for increased safety during childbirth at Sutter Tracy.



## CARDIOLOGY

**Transesophageal Echocardiogram** and state-of-the-art imaging with Coronary Computed Tomography Angiography improve patient outcomes.

**Advanced imaging** of heart and artery disease decreases length of hospital stays.

- **The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Health Equity fellowship** is the first-of-its-kind in the U.S. and aims to help reduce health disparities by developing the next generation of health equity-focused nurses and nursing leaders. Fellows will research and provide services in focus areas including Maternal Health & Birth, Mental Health, Chronic Disease and Equity in Care Transitions.
