Thunderstorms with large hail, heavy downpours, and gusty winds developed across central Maryland during the early afternoon. In Montgomery County, dime to golf ball sized hail damaged vegetation and dented roofs and cars in Darnestown, Gaithersburg, Rockville, Derwood, Olney, and Brookeville. In Gaithersburg, high winds downed trees and power lines. One tree fell onto a day care center on Oakmont Street. Another tree fell onto a house on Hutton Street. Trees and power poles were downed onto Route 28 near Muddy Branch Road. About 2500 customers lost power as a direct result of the storm. In Howard County, a wind gust of 62 MPH was recorded in Laurel and a gust of 46 MPH was reported in Ellicott City. Hail up to golf ball size fell in Columbia and Ellicott City. In Baltimore County, quarter sized hail was reported in the northern and western sections of Baltimore.

Scattered thunderstorms moved through Northern Virginia during the evening of the 12th. The storms contained damaging winds and hail. In Washington County, a few trees were downed on the south side of Hagerstown. Dime sized hail fell in Mt. Aetna. In Frederick County, a small tree was downed in Lewistown. In Montgomery County, a large tree fell onto the Olney Theater and

damaged residential quarters. A home in Olney was also damaged when trees and power lines fell onto it. Route 355 was closed in Germantown after trees and power lines fell onto the highway between Gunners Branch and Middlebrook roads. Trees were downed and a the roof of a porch was blown off near Crooked Creek in Rockville.

In Howard County, several trees and power lines were downed onto roads and structures. In Savage, one house was damaged by the high winds. In Elkrigde, one house was severely damaged by a downed tree on Elkrigde Heights Road. One fire fighter who responded to the scene was injured. In addition, an apartment building was damaged and a chimney was downed. In Columbia, a large tree on Shaker Drive narrowly missed falling onto a crowded porch. A 62 MPH wind gust was recorded in Laurel. In Baltimore County, 20,000 customers lost power after trees downed power lines. In Arbutus, a large tree fell onto a home and seriously damaged the structure. Other trees were downed onto roads and cars. Twenty trees were downed across the southern part of Baltimore. Heavy downpours flooded roads after drains became clogged with debris. Small trees and large limbs were downed by 51 MPH in Dundalk. A 53 MPH wind gust was recorded in Catonsville.

In Harford County, quarter sized hail was reported in Edgewood. Winds gusted as high as 55 MPH at Aberdeen Proving Grounds. In Anne Arundel County, about 10,000 customers lost power after trees fell onto power lines in the northern portion of the county. A wind gust of 45 MPH was recorded at BWI Airport. Two trees were downed onto houses in Glen Burnie. In Prince George's County, trees were downed onto wires in the Bowie area.

Scattered showers and thunderstorms moved through the region during the afternoon and early evening hours of the 13th. These storms produced damaging winds, large hail, and heavy downpours. The storms came to an end during the late evening hours after a strong cold front pushed through. The winds behind the front gusted to 50 MPH and some locations reported downed trees from these winds.

In Allegany County, a thunderstorm wind gust of 57 MPH was recorded at the Cumberland Airport. Trees and power lines were downed in Frostburg. In Washington County, thunderstorm winds downed trees, power lines, and traffic signs in Hancock and Clear Spring. A wind gust of 41 MPH was recorded in Hagerstown. In Frederick County, a thunderstorm downed a few trees on Gatlin Road in the western portion of the county. A wind gust of 41 MPH was recorded in Frederick. In Carroll County, post frontal winds downed tree limbs and wires in Eldersburg and Westminster. In Baltimore County, nickel to quarter sized hail was reported in Baltimore. The hail came down so long that it accumulated to a depth of 3 inches. In White Marsh, golf ball sized hail fell. Thunderstorm winds downed trees and power lines in Catonsville, Essex, and Baltimore. Widespread power outages were reported in Baltimore. In Harford County, dime sized hail was reported in Abingdon and quarter sized hail fell in Edgewood. A thunderstorm wind gust of 55 MPH was recorded on Spesutie Island on the grounds of Aberdeen Proving Ground.

In Howard County, a thunderstorm downburst estimated at 75 MPH occurred in a 10 square block area of the St. John's Manor subdivision 2 miles northwest of Ellicott City. This neighborhood is near the intersection of Route 29 and 40. Numerous trees were downed onto power lines, roads, and structures in the area. Two homes were heavily damaged by downed trees. Downed trees and wires blocked Old Frederick Road between Dogwood Road and Rogers Avenue. A total of \$150,000 in damage was reported and 7,700 customers lost power as a direct result of the storm. In addition, a wind gust of 49 mph was recorded at Laurel. In Montgomery County, a funnel cloud was photographed one mile southwest of Rockville. A wind gust of 55 MPH was recorded in Damascus. In Anne Arundel County, a post frontal wind gust of 51 mph was recorded at BWI Airport. A large tree branch was downed onto three cars in Maryland City. Another large branch was downed onto a mobile home in Severn. Officials recorded 30 reports of downed power lines scattered from Annapolis north to the Baltimore County border. In St. Mary's County, trees were downed by a thunderstorm in Tall Timbers and on Piney Point.

Showers that produced damaging winds moved south through Maryland east of the Chesapeake Bay between 3:00 and 7:30 PM EDT. In Allegany County, winds between 50 and 65 MPH were reported by a spotter in Frostburg. Across the county, numerous trees and power lines were downed. In Cumberland, an unattached gabled roof blew off a building on Bond Street. The debris damaged structures nearby. A wind gust of 58 MPH was recorded at the Cumberland Regional Airport. In Frostburg, a power line and a street light were damaged. Lightning started a fire at a home in Cumberland which damaged the roof and the second story. In Washington County, several trees and wires were downed in Hagerstown and Smithsburg.

In Frederick County, trees were downed in Frederick and Walkersville. A power line was downed onto Water Street Road in Walkersville. In Carroll County, limbs were downed in Eldersburg and Westminster near Route 97. In Baltimore County, trees and power lines were downed in Cockeysville and Baltimore. On Berkshire Road in Dundalk, the roof of a row house under construction was blown off. A wind gust of 50 MPH was recorded in Catonsville and a gust to 48 MPH was recorded in Perry Hall. In Howard County, a tree was downed in Ellicott City and limbs were downed in Columbia. In Montgomery County, a wind sensor recorded a wind gust of 87 MPH in Clarksburg. Trees were downed in Glen Echo, Potomac, Chevy Chase, Gaithersburg, Cabin John, and Silver Spring. Some downed trees led to temporary road closures. Pea sized hail was reported in Olney. Nearly 11,000 customers lost power across the county as a direct result of the storm. In Anne Arundel County, trees and a few power lines were downed in Annapolis, Glen Burnie, and Midlothian. In Prince George's County, trees were downed in the District Heights, Suitland, and Oxon Hill areas. In Calvert County, four trees were downed in the Chesapeake Beach area. In Charles County, trees were downed in Waldorf. A wind gust of 45 MPH was recorded in Pomfret.

Scattered thunderstorms pushed through Southern Maryland between 7 and 9 AM EDT on the 18th. These storms produced damaging wind gusts in addition to three waterspouts. High wind gusts downed trees in Charles, Calvert, and St. Mary's Counties. Communities reporting downed trees included Nanjemoy, Malcolm, Wallville, St. Leonard, and Dunkirk. On the Potomac River, a waterspout formed about three miles north of the Route 301 bridge. It became a tornado as it struck land about 2 miles south of Faulker at F1 strength (60 to 80 MPH winds). It stayed on the ground for 5 miles and was 50 yards wide. The tornado first struck Popes Creek Road, then pushed east to Budds Creek Road near the intersection of Route 301. Next, it crossed the Wicomico River near the Zekiah Swamp Natural Environment Area. Several boats were damaged. Finally, it crossed Allens Fresh Road before dissipating about 1/2 mile south of Newport. Along its rural path it downed several trees, removed shingles and screen doors from homes, and destroyed a few sheds and barns. Two other waterspouts were spawned on the Chesapeake Bay. The first waterspout formed near Parker Creek, east of Prince Frederick on the Western Shore. It flipped a boat and sent the three people aboard into the water. One person was injured. The other waterspout formed near the Eastern Shore off Blackwater Point on Tighman Island. A wind gust of 42 knots was recorded at the Choptank River Sensor nearby.

A cold area of high pressure from Canada pushed into the mid-Atlantic region on the 19th and remained overhead through the 22nd. This caused skies to clear, winds to drop to zero, and temperatures to plummet into the mid 20s to lower 30s during the early morning hours of the 20th, 21st, and 22nd. Several backyard gardeners and local farmers lost tender vegetation to the late season frost. Damaged vegetation included soybeans, tomatoes, sweet potatoes, squash, cucumbers, beans, and young Christmas trees. Monetary losses were estimated to be in thousands of dollars.

Another round of thunderstorms with very heavy rainfall moved through Allegany and Montgomery Counties during the afternoon of the 27th. In Allegany County, significant flooding occurred just east of Cumberland along the west slope of Martin Mountain after Elk Lick Run overflowed its banks. Flood waters damaged property in a 2.5 mile area along Baltimore Pike (Route 144) from Rocky Gap Road to Hinkle Road near Interstate 68. An apartment complex on Baltimore Pike was surrounded by flood waters. Twenty people had to be evacuated and were eventually displaced after 12 rental units sustained major flood damage. Twenty homes nearby were significantly damaged by flooding, including one which was moved off its foundation by the rushing water. An additional 50 to 75 homes sustained minor flood damage. Up to 15 private driveway bridges across Elk Lick Run were damaged and a parking lot was washed away. Three feet of creek water spilled onto Interstate 68 which forced officials to shut down the road for over an hour. Four to five inches of rain was believed to have fallen in this area in only 2 hours. In Montgomery County, dime sized hail fell in Germantown. Small creek flooding was reported in Damascus after 2.69 inches of rain fell. A few cars were stalled in high water on Clopper Road in Gaithersburg where 3.05 inches of rain was recorded. Water rushed through a home along Buck Lodge Road in Boyds. Several people were trapped in a pickup truck on West Old Baltimore Road when Ten Mile Creek overflowed in Clarksburg. Rushing water also left debris on several roads across the county.

A total of 3 inches of rain fell in the southeast portion of the county. In Fauquier County, a spotter recorded a wind gust of 66 MPH and dime to quarter sized hail in Warrenton. Damage was reported to trees and power lines in town. Just east of Warrenton, golfball sized hail fell at the intersection of Route 29 and Route 643. About 3 miles south of Warrenton on Route 643, walnut sized hail was reported. In Prince William County, dime sized hail fell twice in Manassas. A wind gust of 50 MPH was estimated by a spotter. In Loudoun County, a few trees were downed and dime sized hail fell just south of Hamilton. Dime to quarter sized hail was reported in Leesburg and South Riding. Golfball sized hail fell in Round Hill. A gust of 52 MPH was recorded at the Leesburg Airport. Scattered showers and thunderstorms moved through the region during the afternoon and early evening hours of the 13th. These storms produced damaging winds, large hail, and heavy downpours. In Mineral County, trees were downed in Keyser. In Berkeley County, trees were downed in the western portion of the county, including in the community of Hedgesville. In Morgan County, small limbs were downed in Berkeley Springs and trees and power lines were felled in Sleepy Hollow. The storms came to an end during the late evening hours after a strong cold front pushed through. The winds behind the front gusted to 50 MPH and some locations reported downed trees from these winds.

Showers that produced damaging winds moved south through the Eastern Panhandle between 3:30 and 5:00 PM EDT. Over 3000 customers lost power as a direct result of the storm. In Grant County, trees were downed in Petersburg. In Mineral County, a 58 MPH wind gust was recorded at the Cumberland Regional Airport just east of Wiley Ford. Trees were downed onto a road in Fort Ashby. Trees fell onto power lines in the Patterson Creek, Ridgeley, and Fountain areas. In Hardy County, a few tree limbs were downed. In Hampshire County, trees and power lines were downed onto Spring Grade Road and Arnold Road. In Morgan County, Route 522 South was closed by downed trees and power lines 10 miles south of Cacapon. Trees and power lines were also downed in Berkeley Springs. Power outages were reported in the Detour Road, Rock Gap Road, Oakland Road areas, in addition to several locations from Berkeley Springs to the Berkeley County border. In Berkeley County, a wind gust of 62 MPH was recorded at the Martinsburg Airport. Trees and power lines were downed countywide. In Jefferson County, a 3-foot diameter oak tree was blown onto a 1987 Toyota Celica traveling along Route 9 about 3.5 miles from the Virginia border. The driver of the vehicle, a 49 year-old woman, was killed. Trees and power lines were also downed in other parts of the county.

Scattered thunderstorms with large hail and very heavy downpours moved through the Eastern Panhandle between 3 and 7 PM on the 26th. In Hampshire County, up to 2 inches of golfball sized hail fell just southwest of Capon Bridge on the west side of Schafemaker Mountain (between Cooper and Bear Garden on Route 50). Hail chunks and shredded leaves accumulated on Route 50 between Cooper Mountain and Capon Bridge. A few minutes after the hail stopped, it began to melt and locally dense fog formed. In Capon Bridge, quarter sized hail was reported. Heavy rains caused creeks to overflow their banks. A driveway along Route 50 in Capon Bridge was washed away by floodwaters. In Hardy County, 2.30 inches of rain fell in Wardensville. In Morgan County, golfball sized hail fell about 7 miles south of Berkeley Springs. In Berkeley Springs, grape sized hail was reported. In Berkeley County, golfball sized hail was reported on Route 9 just east of Martinsburg. Nickel sized hail fell in Bunker Hill. In Jefferson County, golfball sized hail fell in Shepherdstown near Route 480. In Kearneysville, baseball sized hail was reported. Numerous trees were downed in the vicinity. Power was knocked out in Charles Town and Ranson. Heavy downpours flooded basements and yards. High water was also reported on Route 480 near Shepherdstown.
