BY REQUEST OF MAYOR STRICKLAND AND COUNCIL MEMBER FEY

A RESOLUTION relating to the City's Climate Action Plan; expressing the City's support of Life Cycle Assessments and life cycle thinking in its relevant legislative and management decisions and encouraging the public and private entities in the City to do the same.

WHEREAS the 2008 Tacoma Climate Action Plan calls for City government to lead by example, and

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma recognizes its responsibility to minimize negative impacts on human health and the environment while supporting a diverse, equitable, and vibrant community and economy, and

WHEREAS the International Organization for Standardization ("ISO") 14040 defines Life Cycle Assessment as a technique for assessing the potential environmental aspects and impacts associated with a product or service. A product's life cycle impacts include the environmental and economic effects throughout a product's lifetime including new material extraction, transportation, manufacturing, use, and disposal, and

WHEREAS life cycle thinking and life cycle assessment offer a strong scientific basis to ensure that the desired environmental outcomes of City actions are achieved, and

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma utilities use clean technologies, and WHEREAS life cycle data substantiates the benefits of using cleaner utilities for business operations, and

WHEREAS life cycle data is used by researchers and product manufacturers to develop Environmental Product Declarations ("EPDs"), and

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WHEREAS EPDs can create a competitive advantage and showcase life cycle performance opportunities for companies in the City of Tacoma; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City of Tacoma commits to integrate Life Cycle
Assessments and life cycle principles in its relevant purchases and operations,
becoming a Life Cycle City.

Section 2. That the City of Tacoma will maintain and provide ongoing life cycle inventory data for its utility operations. These data shall include the utility's usage of energy, water, fuel, and other relevant products, air and water pollution, and waste emitted.

Section 3. That the City of Tacoma will educate City employees in life cycle thinking and principles.

Section 4. That the City of Tacoma will work with higher education and community partners to increase citywide capacity for life cycle thinking and support regional efforts.



Section 5. That the City of Tacoma will support Life Cycle Assessments and life cycle thinking in its relevant legislative and management decisions and will encourage public and private entities in the City to do the same.
