

Service Animal Licensing Guidelines

The Nebraska Humane Society offers pet licensing for Service Animals at no charge to the owner.

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), a service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. The task(s) performed by the dog must be directly related to the person's disability.

Emotional support, therapy, comfort, and companion animals are not considered Service Animals under the ADA (as they have not been trained to perform a specific job or task) and do not qualify for free pet licensing. Cats and mini pigs also do not qualify for Service Animal licensing.
