COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING JULY 2024

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): July was hot and humid for the most part with a little relief coming at the end of the month. Heat indexes were breaking records from temperatures in the 90's and low temperatures in the 60's and 70's. The District was mostly dry with scattered and fast moving thunderstorms passing through. Colonies are doing very well with very few reports of insect issues. Although the hot weather did result in some bloom and foraging issues, bees gathered what they could on sourwood, clovers, alfalfa, bee-balm, tickseed, corn, Rudbeckia, Clethra, joe-pye weed, milkweed, bergamot, and other wildflowers.

ALABAMA: Most beekeepers completed their honey harvests in July, once major nectar flows turned off. A good harvest was reported by many. Temperatures were above average at the start of July, but then transitioned to being normal for the rest of the month. Dry conditions occurred throughout the state for most of July, although precipitation in southern regions during late July meant that only northern regions experienced drought-like conditions by the end of the month. In some cases conditions were severe. This may have affected summer blooms and forced more stored honey to be consumed in colonies. Crape myrtle bloomed in many areas, offering colonies a source of pollen. Other bloomers included Bidens, Ironweed, Hibiscus and Cotton. Beekeepers throughout the state reported small hive beetle to be a problem, worse than usual. Many beekeepers also treated for varroa once their honey harvest was complete.

ARIZONA: The monsoon season started once again throughout the month of July. With this, increased rainfall was expected. Arizona showed 1.24 inches of rain for the month. However, this is down .56 inches from the normal month-to-date. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor July's precipitation allowed Arizona to maintain its Moderate Drought status as seen the last few months.

Beekeepers continue honey production and strengthening the bee population numbers in hives. There have been some hives lost due to excessive heat and related conditions.

The demand for honey once again remains good throughout most of the state. The increased rainfall of monsoon season aids in flower blooming and overall honey production. Some melon production and citrus were still sources of pollen but decreased towards the end of the month. Cactus bloom and alfalfa are still prominent pollen sources as well. Monsoon season in Arizona will continue the next few months.

ARKANSAS: During the month of July temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation was above normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state had normal soil moisture. There was an area of abnormally dry conditions along the Southeast border of the state.

CALIFORNIA: No report issued.

FLORIDA: Temperatures were much above normal for the month over the entire state. Precipitation was above normal in North Florida and below normal in South Florida except for part of southwest Florida which was also above normal. Bee health was fairly good in the north and the Panhandle and about average in other parts of Florida, sometimes alternating between fairly good and slightly worse than normal at times. Supplemental feeding was generally not needed in the north but widespread in other areas. Better rainfall in the Panhandle and north enabled some beekeepers to split hives and/or treat for mites. The bees were too stressed in most other areas with high temperatures and dry conditions resulting in less flying and bee activity. There were few sources of natural food with small amounts of palmetto scattered around the state along with some wildflowers and cotton in the Panhandle and north. Many bees were still pollinating crops or producing honey in northern states. These bees are expected to begin returning between the middle of September and early November, avoiding the stress caused by Florida's high summer temperatures. Practically no honey for commercial use was produced except for small amounts of wildflower honey, mainly baker's grade. There was some Tupelo honey still stored at the end of the month with very light supplies of any other types of honey. Brazilian Pepper will be the next major source for honey production and is expected to begin blooming in late August or early September in some areas and spreading around the state by late September to early October.

GEORGIA: July weather conditions had warm temperatures and moderate rainfall, creating a good environment for flowering plants which bees rely on for nectar and pollen.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of July temperatures were average in Idaho. Precipitation in Idaho was normal. Utah had temperatures that were average and precipitation that was below normal. Colorado had average temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was below normal for July.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in July Southern Idaho had abnormally dry to moderate drought and Northern Idaho had moderate to severe drought. Utah is currently under no drought to moderate drought conditions in Northern Utah. Colorado had normal soil moisture to severe drought.

Prices for the month of July were between \$2.00 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.20-2.25 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.50-\$3.00 per pound.

ILLINOIS: The weather for July was normal with lots of rain. Beekeepers report that most of their bees are in good condition. Beekeepers also report that there are very little wildflowers left for the bees. Beekeepers report a good amount of production in the month of July and think this year will yield a better than an average amount of honey. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level with wholesalers waiting to see where prices go. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of July were normal. There was more rain than usual. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on wildflowers, such as clover and alfalfa. The bees are said to be in fair condition. Beekeepers report a good amount of honey flow and that some of what it is of good quality. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: In Kentucky beekeepers enjoyed a productive summer nectar flow in July 2024, with plenty of coneflowers, brown-eyed susans, coreopsis, bee balm, mints, and knotweed blooming from the beginning of the month until the end. Even though there were stretches of excessive heat,

the nectar flow seemed to be consistent if not prolific. Even with the heat, the colonies seemed to withstand small hive beetle, normally a foe when high temperatures encourage female small hive beetles to lay their eggs. There have been the usual problems such as hives going queenless, varroa mite populations increasing, and European foulbrood in a few cases, but these are to be expected. Honey sales remain consistent throughout the state as well.

LOUISIANA: During the month of July temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well above normal across the state, thanks to hurricane Beryl. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, normal soil moisture conditions exist across most of the state. There was an area of abnormally dry conditions in the Southeast corner.

MICHIGAN: Summer has finally arrived in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. July has been mostly hot and humid with the regular bands of scattered storms working their way across. The last few weeks have been very dry for most of the U.P. It has been a challenging summer with the bees. Currently the common statement from the seasoned beekeepers is that they have never had any of these issues 10 years ago. Wildflowers are everywhere, so hopefully things will pick up. Wildflower honey retails for \$9.00/pound.

MINNESOTA: During the month of July temperatures were average across the whole state. Precipitation for July was below normal for the North end of the state, the South end of the state saw above normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in July, Northern Minnesota had no drought and Southern Minnesota had no drought.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.20-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of July.

MISSISSIPPI: During the month of July weather temperatures were typical for summer, averaging high of 92 F and low of 72 F. There was high humidity with thunderstorms.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: No report issued.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: The weather improved as July moved ahead, moisture supplies were generally good. Sunflowers were mostly emerged in early July on virtually all by the end of the month. Bloom began slowly later in the month. The alfalfa was in generally good shape and by the end of the month the first cutting was all but completed. The second cutting was underway and although behind last year was ahead of the average. The weather was generally good for bee activity.

OHIO: Ohio has had above normal temperatures. Most of Ohio was in a mild drought until the past week. Rain fall in many areas of Ohio helped to bring most areas out of the drought. Still about 1 inch below normal in some areas. Corn and soybeans needed the rain, in most area's soybeans started to bloom. Honeybees are busy obtaining nectar from the early beans. A very heavy nectar flow has kept beekeepers busy managing their colonies, adding more room for the bees to store honey, keeping the brood areas open to give the queens the ability to keep laying eggs. Ohio had an early swarm season with large swarms, mostly feral honeybees, in early April. Those swarms have produced large colonies. Now have produced close to 100 pounds of honey. Very healthy colonies. We are catching late feral swarms. The swarms that have been sampled are from an area in the south west quadrant of Ohio, the swarms were caught along the major river areas from the large trees that grow along the rivers. The swarms have very low varroa populations, lower than last year. Natural Selection with high recombination rates within the feral bee populations keep mite populations low.

Honey Prices have remained stable around \$5.50 to \$6.00 per pound wholesale \$9.00 to \$16.00 per pound retail.

Heat and drought were the dominant factors in July that caused some colonies to devour stored honey and some colonies to swarm or abscond. In Cleveland, the average temperature was 83 degrees F with limited rainfall, in fact some areas received an inch or more below normal. Central Ohio had 3 days at 94 F with an average of 87 degrees and was under 2.70" in rainfall. Southwest Ohio (Cincinnati area) averaged 86 degrees and was below in rainfall.

Most of the flowering trees and shrubs have passed bloom however the Rose-of Sharon is still flowering as well as the Panicked Goldenraintree in central and northern Ohio. The yellowwood tree peaked bloom in southwest Ohio two weeks ago. Many perennials in fields are also providing nectar and pollen for bees as well as soybeans. In Cleveland and Central Ohio, populations of spotted lanternfly are present which provide sticky sweet excretions for bees.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of July temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Eastern Oklahoma had normal soil moisture. It was abnormally dry conditions throughout the Central and Western parts of the state.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: In Tennessee, the Sourwood nectar flow in the mountains of East TN appears to have been a good one this year. Beekeepers are reporting higher than average harvests in areas with Sourwood and sumac. Retail prices across the state are holding steady at \$16 a pound for wildflower honey and \$20 a pound for sourwood.

TEXAS: During the month of July temperatures were below normal across most of the state. Precipitation during July was well above normal across the Eastern part of the state thanks to hurricane Beryl. The Western part of the state had slightly below normal precipitation. According to the U.S. Drought

Monitor website, Eastern and Central Texas had mostly normal soil moisture with an area of abnormally dry soil across North Central. West and Far West Texas had moderate to extreme drought conditions.

WASHINGTON: July started with hot summer weather. While the harvest of cherries and raspberries continued, blueberry bloom proliferated. Apricot harvest began to decline as the harvest for peaches began. Other vegetable crops such as peas, squash, carrots were moving along as the sweet corn began. Summer weather continued hot and fires burned in a number of areas in Central Washington. Harvest of soft fruit continued as the weather remained hot. Late in the month the weather cooled somewhat but was still dry. By the end of the month the hay cutting was nearly complete. Some wildflower sources were still available in the mountains, at least the areas not on fire.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of July were in line with the monthly expected average. There was slightly less rain for this time of year. There has been no problem with insects. Generally, bees are in fair to good condition. Little foliage remains for the bees. Production was good for some, and a little less for others. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
