This is fair use no matter how you look at it. This is for interpretability only and I the purchaser of the DVD and DVD drive should be able to use them with any OS I choose.

If someone chooses to use DeCSS or any other means to copy DVD's and distribute them, they should be held criminally liable for their actions, and that is that.

I also believe that it is fair use to make backup copies of my software and media for my own protection and that the MPAA or a pack of Lawyers should have no say in this matter.
