- Q. You said that you worked with the managers, the
- 24 on-site property managers?
- 25 A. Yes.

- 1 Q. To make sure they understood what Mr. Sterling
- 2 wanted. What did you mean by that?
- A. In their training when they came in for
- 4 training, to make sure that they filled out the
- 5 paperwork the way he wanted it filled out and when he
- 6 laid out stipulations as the type of tenants he wanted
- 7 in his building, to relay that information to them when
- 8 he told me to do so.
- 9 Q. What did he tell you about the types of tenants
- 10 he wanted in his building?
- 11 A. He wanted tenants that fit his image, that if
- 12 he had put work into the building would not tear it
- 13 down
- He didn't want kids, which he also referred to
- 15 as brats, in his building because he didn't want them to
- 16 mess up the work he had paid to have done in these
- 17 buildings.
- He didn't want blacks, sometimes he called them

- 19 dark skin, because they smell.
- He didn't want Mexicans because they just sit
- 21 around and smoke and drink all day.
- He didn't want Section 8. I went to a Section
- 23 8 training. He sent me with a specific list of
- 24 questions that he wanted answered which all pertained to
- 25 how to evict Section 8 tenants.

- 12 Q. If you were delayed or hasn't gotten
- 13 Mr. Sterling the information on the tenant as he had
- 14 asked, would he get angry with you?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. What would he say?
- 17 A. His retaliation at me if I didn't provide
- 18 information was that I was stupid, I needed to learn the
- 19 Asian way. Sometimes he would tell me I was getting
- 20 more stupid as I got older, I needed to learn from the
- 21 younger girls in the office.
- He would also tell me that I needed to learn
- 23 the Asian way from his younger girls because they knew
- 24 how to please him, give him what he asked for. This was
- 25 the type of retaliation remarks I would get from him.

- 7 Q. Did Mr. Sterling tell you that he was planning
- 8 to purchase the Ardmore building?
- 9 A. No.
- 10 Q. Did he ever tell you he was planning to
- 11 purchase buildings in Koreatown?

- 12 A. Yes.
- Q. What did he say about his plan to purchase
- 14 buildings in Koreatown?
- 15 A. He said that he was going to purchase -- this
- 16 was after he purchased Ardmore and he purchased Hobart
- 17 and he was going to purchase, I also recall, Alexandria
- 18 Court or Street -- he was going to purchase more
- 19 buildings because he decided that he wanted just Korean
- 20 tenants because he had found that these tenants would
- 21 take what he gave them and not talk back.
- And he was jovially saying, "Isn't that great,
- 23 I don't have to spend any more money on them, they will
- 24 take whatever conditions I give them and still pay the
- 25 rent, so I only want Korean tenants, so I'm going to

1 keep buying in Koreatown."

- 8 Q. Do
- 9 you recall any tenants being evicted from the Ardmore
- 10 building?
- 11 A. No, I just recall one person he wanted out.
- 12 Q. Do you recall that person's name?
- 13 A. I recall meeting her. She had a lovely
- 14 personality. She was an elderly black woman. I recall
- 15 she -- what is coming to mind is she showed me a number
- 16 of photos of her children and family and making a
- 17 comment about her name being common and having so many
- 18 relatives with the same name. I can see her clearly. I
- 19 am hazy on her name at the moment.

- Q. Do you know why Mr. Sterling wanted her out, did he tell you why?
- A. This woman was in an apartment and the
- 23 adjoining apartment had had a water leak from some
- 24 construction being done in that apartment that had
- 25 caused this leak which flooded her bedroom and her

l apartment.

- When I arrived with Brenda, the bedroom -- the
- 3 apartment was still under a couple of inches of water
- 4 and a lot of her personal things on the floor in the
- 5 closet and on the floor of the bedroom were damaged,
- 6 they were floating in water.
- When I reported back to the office to
- 8 Mr. Sterling what had taken place in this incident at
- 9 the building, he asked for the details and I gave him
- 10 the details of everything that I saw and heard at the
- 11 time.
- He asked who she was and I, at that time, gave
- 13 him the information that I had on her from her lease and
- 14 that she was a Section 8 tenant and he said, "Is she one
- 15 of those black people that stink," and I know I defended
- 16 her against the stink remark, and I did acknowledge that
- 17 she was a black woman and she appeared elderly to me. I
- 18 didn't know her exact age.
- When I reported she was requiring that she be
- 20 reimbursed for the damage and perhaps given compensation
- 21 for what had been ruined of her belongings he said, "I
- 22 am not going to do that, just evict the bitch," and I
- 23 remember trying to defend her to him and the next day
- 24 the building was given to Brenda and I wasn't allowed on
- 25 the property anymore after that.
