S. F. No. 668: An Act to amend Chapter 323, Session Laws of Minnesota for 1931, being an act relating to wild animals, amending Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5568, as amended, and Section 5574, with respect to the spearing of fish.

S. F. No. 681: An Act to repeal Chapter 278, General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1931, entitled "An Act requiring banks and certain corporations to report to the Minnesota Tax Commission information as to their net income, net profits and taxes paid, providing penalty for failure so to do."

S. F. No. 839: An Act relating to the time of holding annual meetings in certain school districts.

S. F. No. 1083: An Act relating to the bond of Probate Judges.

Sir: I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate File No. 805.

It is the public policy of the State of Minnesota, as declared by the Legislature, to permit the State Game and Fish Commissioner unrestricted supervision and control over commercial fishing. This bill

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would change that public policy solely in the case of Rice County. If the Legislature desires to change the public policy of the state with reference to the supervision of commercial fishing it should make it applicable to all counties.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

Mr. MacKenzie introduced—

S. F. No. 1355, A bill for an act to appropriate money to reimburse the party therein named for injury caused to his farm by the flooding thereof by reason of the construction of a dam in the state drainage system.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Messrs. Lennon and Morin introduced—

S. F. No. 1356, A bill for an act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 2673, as amended by Laws 1931, Chapter 39, relating to vehicles exempt from license tax on motor vehicles.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Motor Vehicles and Motor Tax Laws.

Mr. Lommen introduced—

S. F. No. 1357, A bill for an act directing the Department of Conservation to create and maintain a pike fingerling hatchery at the site of the present hatchery at Lake Vermillion.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Game and Fish.

Mr. Buckler introduced—

S. F. No. 1358, A bill for an act to appropriate money for the payment of a soldier's bonus to Otto G. Johnson.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Messrs. Hanson, Larson, A. S., Bridgeman and Peck introduced—

S. F. No. 1359, A bill for an act relating to loans by state board of relief for funding or refunding indebtedness of certain school districts, and providing the matter of payment thereof and for the issuance and payment of certificates of indebtedness of the state issued in connection therewith.
