Sir:

I am returning Senate File No. 1448 without my approval.

The bill has been proposed to enable the new village of Falcon Heights to establish a municipal liquor store in the neighborhood of Snelling and Larpenteur.

The bill would make two changes. Present laws provide that no liquor can be sold on the fair grounds or within one-half mile of the fair grounds. The bill modifies this section by providing that liquor establishments must be 1,000 feet or more from the fair grounds. The other provision of the present law that would be amended by this bill is one which states no liquor can be sold within one mile of the University Farm of the School of Agriculture of the University. The bill would amend this by making the law read that no liquor can be sold within one mile of the administration building on the Farm School campus.

I do not believe that we should relax even by small amounts the protective regulations that have been included in our laws to keep liquor places a reasonable distance from the University Farm School and the fair grounds. The provisions have been included in the law because of a conviction on the part of school authorities, sponsors of the state fair and others interested in the welfare of young people that liquor places should not be too accessible to the Farm School or the fair grounds. It does not seem good policy to reduce the limits.
