GAME 4 STATS: 5 points (2-4 FG, 1-2 3FG), 2 rebounds and 1 block vs. BOS (6/14/24). **NOTES:** Jones Jr. recorded the most 20-point games in his career in a season (6) and 10-point games in a season (27). He notched playoff career highs in points in three consecutive games (5/13/24-5/18/24), including 22 points in a series-clinching Game 6 win vs. OKC (5/18/24).

GAME 4 STATS: 6 points (2-4 FG, 2-3 3FG) and 2 rebounds vs. BOS (6/14/24). **NOTES:** Washington Jr. notched a playoff career-high 29 points, becoming just the sixth player in Mavs history to notch at least seven 3-pointers in a playoff game...became the second player in Mavs history to record a game with at least 30 points, five steals and two blocks (4/5/24)(Mark Aguirre vs. DEN, 12/5/87).

GAME 4 STATS: 7 points (1-2 FG, 5-6 FT), 4 rebounds and 1 block vs. BOS (6/14/24). **NOTES:** Gafford set the longest streak of made field goals in the play-by-play era with 33 after going 5-of-5 vs. GSW (3/13/24), the second-longest streak in NBA history...recorded the franchise record for most field goal makes in a game without a miss (12 FGs, at CHA, 4/9/24).

GAME 4 STATS: 21 points (10-18 FG, 1-6 3FG), 4 rebounds and 6 assists vs. BOS (6/14/24). **NOTES:** Irving's 48 points vs. HOU (4/7/24) is his Mavericks career-high...became the second player in Mavericks history to record at least 40 points and 10 assists in a game (Luka Dončić) (1/11/24)...became the fifth player in Mavericks playoff history to record 40-5-5 in a postseason game after 40-7-5 vs. LAC (4/28/24).

GAME 4 STATS: 29 points (12-26 FG, 0-8 3FG, 5-7 FT), 5 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals vs. BOS (6/14/24). **NOTES:** Dončić notched 73 points at ATL (1/26/24) to set a new career-high and franchise-record for single-game scoring...set the single-season franchise record for most 3-pointers in a game (258, now 262) after his first 3 at GSW (4/2/24)...passed Mark Aguirre for most points in a single season in franchise history with 2,332 points after facing CHA (4/9/24)...became the first player in NBA history to average 33.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 9.0 assists in a season...recorded 36 points in series-deciding Game 5 at MIN (5/30/24), his most points in the playoffs this season.

QUICK HITS

- **NBA FINALS GAME 5:** The No. 5 seed Mavericks (50-32) are making their third NBA Finals appearance in franchise history (2006, 2011) and are facing the No. 1 seed Celtics (64-18). The Mavericks are currently down in the series, 1-3, after Boston recorded a 107-89 win at the TD Garden (6/6/24), Boston recorded a 105-98 win in Boston (6/9/24), Boston recorded a 106-99 win in Dallas (6/12/24) and Dallas recorded a 122-84 win in Dallas (6/14/24). The Mavericks and Celtics are squaring off for the first time ever. The Celtics won the 2023-24 season series, 2-0. The Celtics have taken six of the last 10 regular season meetings, including four straight and five of the last 10 regular season matchups in Dallas. The Mavericks have also taken four of the last 10 regular season road meetings with the Celtics.
- **WESTERN CONFERENCE FINALS RECAP:** In the Western Conference Finals, the Mavericks defeated the Timberwolves 4-1 after Dallas recorded a 108-105 win in Minnesota (5/22/24), Dallas recorded a 109-108 win in Minnesota (5/24/24), Dallas recorded a 116-107 win in Dallas (5/26/24), Minnesota recorded a 105-100 win in Dallas (5/28/24) and Dallas recorded a 124-103 win in Minnesota (5/30/24) to clinch a berth to the NBA Finals.

SERIES NOTES: The No. 5 seed Mavericks (50-32) are making their third NBA Finals appearance in franchise history (2006, 2011) and are facing the No. 1 seed Celtics (64-18)...The Mavericks are currently down in the series, 1-3, after Boston recorded a 107-89 win at the TD Garden (6/6/24), Boston recorded a 105-98 win in Boston (6/9/24), Boston recorded a 106-99 win in Dallas (6/12/24) and Dallas recorded a 122-84 win in Dallas (6/14/24)...The Mavericks and Celtics are squaring off in the postseason for the first time ever...The Mavericks are 40-46 (.465) all-time against the Celtics franchise (24-19 at home, 16-27 on the road)...The Mavericks lost the 2023-24 season series 2-0, after Boston recorded a 119-110 win in Dallas (1/22/24) and Boston recorded a 138-110 win in Boston (3/1/24)...The Mavericks have won one of the last five, four of the last 10, nine of the last 20 meetings and 31 of the last 50 meetings...In the first matchup of the 2023-24 season series, the Celtics recorded a 119-110 win in Dallas (1/22/24)...In the second matchup, the Celtics defeated the Mavericks 138-110 in Boston (3/1/24)...Boston won the 2022-23 season series, 2-0, after they recorded a 125-112 win at the TD Garden (11/23/22) and a 124-95 win in Dallas (1/5/23)...The first win of the 2022-23 series snapped a four-game losing streak for the Celtics against the Mavericks...Despite the recent four-game skid (2/23/21 to 3/13/22), the Celtics have now taken 11 of the last 16 meetings (since 2016-17)...The Mavericks have won 2-of-5, 9-of-15, and 20 of the last 30 meetings in Dallas...Following their victory over the Mavericks in the last matchup of the 2023-24 season series (3/1/24), the Celtics have now won six of the last eight matchups in Boston...**Luka Dončić** is averaging 29.9 points (.502 FG%, .435 3FG%), 8.8 rebounds and 7.5 assists in 11 career games (5-6 record) against the Celtics, including 32.8 points (.510 FG%, .413 3FG%), 9.8 boards and 7.9 assists in his last nine games against the franchise (since 2019-20)...In his two most recent games against Boston, **Dončić** recorded 33 points, 18 rebounds and 13 assists in a 119-110 loss in Dallas (1/22/24) and 37 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists in a 138-110 loss in Boston (3/1/24)...**Dončić** has hit a game-winning 3-pointer in two of the last four meetings with the Celtics at American Airlines Center (2/23/21 and 11/6/21), becoming the only Maverick to hit multiple game-winning baskets against the same opponent over the last 20 seasons...In 2020-21, **Dončić** knocked down two late-game go-ahead 3-pointers, including the game-winning triple with 0.1 seconds remaining, in the club's 110-107 win over Boston at the AAC (2/23/21) en route to becoming the second player over the last 25 seasons to make multiple go-ahead 3-pointers in the final 20 seconds of a game (Dan Dickau)...**Dončić** finished with 31 points, 10 rebounds and 8 assists vs. Boston (2/23/21) for his 100th career 20-point, 5-rebound, 5-assist game, becoming the second-fastest player (21 years, 361 days; 162 games) to reach 100 games of 20-5-5 in terms of both games played (Oscar Robertson, 115) and age (LeBron James, 21 years, 43 days)...Last season, **Dončić** hit a game-winning triple at the buzzer in the Mavericks' 107-104 victory over the Celtics at the AAC (11/6/21), marking his fourth career game-winner with under 2 seconds remaining (including postseason) and his second against Boston in a calendar year...He became the only player since 1997-98 to have four game-winners with under 2 seconds remaining (including playoffs) before turning 23 years old...It was also **Dončić's** third career buzzer-beater and he tied **Dirk Nowitzki** (3) for the most buzzer-beaters in franchise history...The Mavericks swept the Celtics for the second straight year in 2021-22 (2-0 in 2020-21, 2-0 in 2021-22), after Boston swept three of the previous four season series (2-0 in 2016-17, 2-0 in 2017-18, 2-0 in 2019-20)...Dallas also swept 5-of-6 season series from 2010-11 to 2015-16 (2-0 in 2010-11, 2-0 in 2011-12, 2-0 in 2013-14, 2-0 in 2014-15, 2-0 in 2015-16)...The 2018-19 campaign was the only time in the last nine seasons (2013-14 to 2021-22) that the clubs split the season series, 1-1 (something that could take place for the second time in the last 10 seasons with a Dallas victory on 1/5/23).

CONNECTIONS: Celtics center **Kristaps Porziņģis** appeared in 134 games (all starts) with the Mavericks over two-and-a-half seasons (2019-21), averaging 20.0 points (.448 FG%, .345 3FG%, .831 FT%), 8.8 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.7 blocks in 30.9 minutes...**Porziņģis** was originally acquired by Dallas along with **Tim Hardaway Jr.**, **Trey Burke** and **Courtney Lee** from New York in exchange for **Dennis Smith Jr.**, **DeAndre Jordan**, **Wesley Matthews** and two future first-round picks (1/31/19), before re-signing with the club (7/12/19) and being traded to Washington in exchange for **Spencer Dinwiddie** and **Dāvis Bertāns** (2/10/22)...Mavericks guard **Kyrie Irving** spent two seasons with Boston (2017-19), averaging 24.1 points (.489 FG%, .404 3FG%, .881 FT%), 4.4 rebounds, 6.1 assists, 1.3 steals and 32.6 minutes in 127 games (all starts) with the Celtics while being named an All-Star starter with the franchise in both years (2017-19)...Mavericks center **Dwight Powell** appeared in five games for the Celtics as a rookie in 2014-15 before being acquired by Dallas as part of the Rajon Rondo trade that sent **Jae Crowder**, **Brandan Wright**, **Jameer Nelson**, a 2015 first-round pick and a 2016 second-round selection to Boston (12/18/14)...Celtics forward **Oshae Brissett** (Toronto), Mavericks guard **AJ Lawson** (Toronto), Mavericks forward **Olivier-Maxence Prosper** (Montreal) and **Powell** (Toronto) and are all from Canada...Mavericks center **Dereck Lively II**, Mavericks forward/center **Markieff Morris** and Celtics guard **Lamar Stevens** all hail from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania...Celtics center **Al Horford** and Mavericks guard **Tim Hardaway Jr.** were teammates on the Hawks during the 2015-16 season...**Al's** younger brother, **Jon Horford**, spent three seasons teaming with **Hardaway Jr.** at Michigan (2010-13), where they helped the Wolverines reach the NCAA championship game together in 2013...Celtics guard **Jrue Holiday** (Mission Hills), Mavericks Two-Way guard **Brandon Williams** (Los Angeles) and **Hardaway Jr.** (Orinda) all hail from California...Mavericks Assistant GM/VP of Basketball Operations **Michael Finley** appeared in 21 games for Boston in 2009-10...Celtics forward/center **Luke Kornet** was born in Lantana, Texas, and attended Liberty Christian High School in Argyle, Texas...Mavericks center **Dwight Powell**, Mavericks guard/forward **Josh Green** and Celtics guard **Jaden Springer** are all alumni of IMG Academy (Bradenton, FL)...**Green** was a teammate of **Springer** at IMG Academy (Bradenton, FL), where they both earned McDonald's All-Americans honors and led the Ascenders to their first national championship in 2019...Celtics forward **Jordan Walsh** was born in Dallas, Texas, and attended Faith Family Academy in Dallas, Texas...Mavericks Head Coach **Jason Kidd** (2nd, 1994) and Celtics guard **Jaylen Brown** (3rd, 2016) both went on to become top-3 picks and All-Stars after playing collegiately at California...Celtics assistant coach **Sam Cassell** appeared in 16 games (12 starts) for Dallas in 1996-97 after being acquired by the Mavericks (along with **Finley**, **A.C. 50-WIN EXPERIENCE

The **Dallas Mavericks** qualified for the playoffs for the fourth time in the last five seasons and the 25th overall playoff appearance in the franchise's 44-year history.

The Mavericks have secured a playoff spot for the 19th time in the last 24 years. Only Boston (20) and San Antonio (19) have as many appearances in that span of time (since 2000-01). To garner a playoff spot, the team recorded their 50th win (at MIA, 4/10/24), marking the 16th 50-win season in franchise history and Dallas' second under Head Coach Jason Kidd (52-20, 2021-22). Prior to Jason Kidd's tenure, the Mavericks did not reach 50 wins in a season since six years prior in 2014-15.

The Mavericks won 16 of their last 20 games, going 16-2 (3/7/24-4/10/24) prior to the final two games of the season in which several starters were unavailable.

The 16-2 stretch marked the Mavericks' best 18-game span since the 2010-11 season when the team won the NBA Championship.

During that stretch of games, the Mavericks went on several win streaks, going 4-0, 7-0 and 5-0 to capture the No. 5 seed in the Western Conference and will face the No. 4 seed Los Angeles Clippers (51-31) in the first round. The team faces the Clippers in the postseason for the third time in the past five years, with the Clippers having the 2-0 series advantage against Dallas in that span of time.

The Mavericks are 20-23 (.465) all-time in NBA playoff series (15-20 in best-of-7 series, 5-3 in best-of-5 series). Dallas is 109-124 (.468) all-time in postseason games, including 92-109 (.458) in best-of-seven series playoff games. The Mavericks are 3-3 (.500) all-time in the Western Conference Finals. Dallas holds an all-time record of 18-16 (.529) in third-round games (9-7 at home, 9-9 on the road). Prior to this season, Dallas has never made the conference finals as a No. 5 seed or lower.

The Mavericks have only encountered the Timberwolves once in the playoffs, a 3-0 sweep in the first round in 2002.

The Dallas Mavericks beat the Minnesota Timberwolves in the Western Conference Finals in five games to clinch the franchise's third NBA Finals appearance and first time in the Finals since 2011, when the team won the NBA championship.

WESTERN CONFERENCE FINALS NOTES

- Dereck Lively II shot 16-of-16 from the field through the five-game Western Conference Finals series against the Timberwolves, marking the most field goal attempts in any playoff series in NBA history without a miss.
- Lively II also set the record for the most consecutive field goals made in the postseason (in the play-by-play era) with 19 (now 21) after his first field goal make in Game 5.
- Luka Dončić became the fourth player in NBA history to notch at least 450 points, 150 rebounds and 150 assists in a single postseason run
- Dončić (36) and Kyrie Irving (36) became the second duo in NBA history to each score 35+ points while clinching a spot in the NBA Finals (Jerry West, Elgin Baylor, 1962).
- Dončić is the first player to enter the NBA Finals leading the league in points, rebounds, assists, field goal makes, 3-point makes and free throw makes in the playoffs.
- By winning Game 5 in Minnesota, the Mavericks have recorded 32 road wins through the regular season and playoffs, matching the second-most single-season road wins through the regular season and playoffs (35 away wins, 2011).
- Since the NBA adopted the 16-team playoff format (1983-84), the Mavericks became just the third team to beat three opponents with at least 50 wins (Houston Rockets, 1995; Los Angeles Lakers, 2001).
- The Mavericks are the sixth team in NBA History to make the NBA Finals as fifth-or-lower seed and the first Western team to do so since 1995 Houston Rockets (No. 6 seed).

R3, GAME FIVE: STAR STUDDERD

The Dallas Mavericks beat the Minnesota Timberwolves in Game 5 (5/30/24), 124-103, closing the series in a dominant fashion and recording the second-largest playoff win for the Mavericks this postseason (30-pt win at LAC, 5/1/24).

In the win, Luka Dončić notched an efficient 36 points (14-22 FG, 6-10 3FG, 2-3 FT), 10 rebounds, five assists and two steals in a series-deciding Game 5. Of his 36 points, he scored 20 points in the first quarter, marking the second quarter in his playoff career he has scored at least 20 points (21 points vs. GSW, 5/22/22, Q4). He started the game shooting 4-of-4 for 10 points within the first three minutes of the game. With 20 points in the first quarter, Dončić became the first Maverick player in postseason history to have multiple 20-point quarters (22 at PHX, 6/1/06; 10 at LAC, 4/21/24).

Since the play-by-play era, Dončić joined Steph Curry (5), Jamal Murray (5), LeBron James (4), Donovan Mitchell (4), Paul George (3), Allen Iverson (3), Michael Jordan (3), Khris Middleton (3), Dwyane Wade (3), Russell Westbrook (3), Giannis Antetokounmpo (2), Devin Booker (2), Kobe Bryant (2), Jimmy Butler (2), Anthony Davis (2), Kevin Durant (2), Kyrie Irving (2), Nikola Jokić (2), Damian Lillard (2), Paul Pierce (2) as the list of players who have had multiple 20-point quarters in their postseason career.

His 36-point performance marked his most points in a playoff game this postseason (prev. 35 at LAC, 5/1/24). Combined with Kyrie Irving's 36-point performance, the Mavericks duo became the first pairing to record at least 35 points in the same playoff game in franchise postseason history and the first pair to do so this postseason.

The duo has recorded at least 30 points in four games this playoff run, the most by any duo in the postseason this year. Eight different Mavericks pairing have recorded at least 30 points in the same game in the postseason but the duo of Irving and Dončić are the only pairing to have multiple games of such instances.

Gafford notched his 13th block in the series against the Timberwolves, recording his 11th consecutive playoff game with at least one block. His 11 straight games with such instances is the first to do so since Al Horford recorded 11 straight playoff games with a block in 2022. The last Maverick to do so in the playoffs was DeSagana Dio (2006).

R3, GAME TWO: LUKA MAGIC

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Minnesota Timberwolves in Game 2, 109-108, to take a 2-0 series lead back to Dallas.

Teams have taken a 2-0 lead in the NBA Conference Finals 64 times in playoff history, accumulating a 58-6 record (.906) when starting a seven-game series 2-0 in the third round.

There have only been 16 instances where a team has started a series 2-0 with both wins occurring on the road for a 16-0 record.

Despite being down 18 points early in the game (55-37), the Mavericks clawed back from the deficit in the second half to complete the tied-third-largest comeback in Mavericks playoff history. It marked only the second time the Mavericks have come back from an 18-or-more point deficit in the conference finals (19 pts vs. SAS, 5/27/03).



Luka Dončić hit the game-winning 3-point shot over reigning Defensive Player of the Year and four-time winner of the award, Rudy Gobert in the final seconds of the game.

With this shot coming within the last five seconds of the game, Dončić has now hit two career postseason game-winning field goals with under five seconds remaining (vs. LAC, 8/23/24). Only LeBron James (7) and Paul Pierce (3) have more since 1998.

Dončić recorded 32 points, 10 rebounds and 13 assists in the Game 2 win at MIN (5/24/24), marking his eighth career playoff triple-double and his fourth 30-point triple-double in the playoffs. He tied Oscar Robertson for 10th-most triple-doubles in the playoffs with eight and became fourth player (Nikola Jokić, Wilt Chamberlain and Magic Johnson) to record four triple-doubles in the span of five games.

R3, GAME THREE: DYNAMIC DUO

The Dallas Mavericks beat the Minnesota Timberwolves in Game 3 (5/26/24), 116-107, to take a commanding 3-0 series lead. No team in the NBA has ever come back from a 3-0 series deficit.

The Mavericks have their first 3-0 series lead since 2011, when the team swept the Los Angeles Lakers in four games en route Dallas' 2011 NBA championship. The team has only had a 3-0 series lead four other occasions (vs. LAL, 2011; vs. MEM, 2006; vs. POR, 2003; vs. MIN, 2002), winning each.

In the win, Mavericks duo Luka Dončić and Kyrie Irving both recorded 33 points, marking the third time this playoff run that the pair have notched at least 30 points in the same game – the only duo to do so multiple times this postseason (Joel Embiid, Tyrese Maxey; Nikola Jokić, Jamal Murray; Devin Booker, Kevin Durant; Paul George, James Harden). This is the first starting backcourt to each score 30-plus points three times in a playoff run in the last 50 years, per ESPN. The duo of Irving and Dončić are the only pair of Mavericks teammates to each record 30 points in the same playoff game multiple times, marking the ninth time a Mavericks pair have such instances.

With 33 points, Irving surpassed Jason Kidd (2,043) in playoff points after amassing 2,060 career playoff points. He enters Tuesday's Game 4 with a 14-0 record in closeout games in the playoffs. Mavericks head coach Jason Kidd has a 5-0 record in closeout games in the postseason so far.

Dereck Lively II started the game 3-of-3 from the field before leaving the game in the first half. In starting the game on perfect shooting, Lively extended his consecutive field goal streak to 18 made field goals, dating back to Game 6 of the series vs. OKC (5/18/24). His 18 consecutive field goals made in the postseason ties the NBA record (since play-by-play era, 1996-97) for most consecutive field goals made (18, Chris Andersen, 2013).

With 33 points (10-20 FG, 5-11 3FG, 8-10FT), seven rebounds, five assists and five steals, Dončić joined Khris Middleton as the only other in NBA playoff history to have at least 30 points, five rebounds, five assists, five steals and five 3-pointers in the same game, (Middleton, 38-10-5-5 w/ 5 3s at BKN, 6/17/21).

R3, GAME ONE: DUO DANCING

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Minnesota Timberwolves, 108-105, in Game 1 for the first Game 1 win under head coach Jason Kidd (previously 0-5 in Game 1s with the Mavericks).

Mavericks duo Luka Dončić and Kyrie Irving both recorded at least 30 points, with the former recording 33 points (12-26 FG) and the latter recording 30 points (12-23 FG), becoming the first pair of teammates to both record at least 30 points in their Western Conference Finals debut as teammates.



The Dallas Mavericks beat the Oklahoma City Thunder in six games to advance to their second Western Conference Finals in the past three years and the sixth Conference Finals in franchise history. The Mavericks even the postseason series record to 3-3 against the Oklahoma City Thunder franchise all-time after the Western Conference Semifinals victory.

R2, GAME ONE: IT'S A WASH

The **Dallas Mavericks** lost to the Oklahoma City Thunder in the opening game of the series, 117-95, to bring the Mavericks' Game 1 record under head coach Jason Kidd to 0-5.

Daniel Gafford recorded a 15-point double-double after a 16-11 performance in Game 1, alongside five blocks. He joins Roy Tarpley and Dirk Nowitzki as the only players in Mavericks playoff history to have at least 15 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks in a game, which has only been done four times in the playoffs in franchise history prior to Game 1 at OKC (5/7/24).

The Thunder shot 45.7-percent from deep in Game 1 (5/7/24), converting 16-of-35 from behind the arc and committed a game-low nine turnovers, compared to the Mavericks' 15 turnovers. The Thunder outrebounded the Mavericks 52-39, including 16 offensive rebounds, their most in a playoff game since 2019 at Portland (4/14/19), where the team had 18 offensive rebounds.

R2, GAME TWO: IT'S A WASH

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Oklahoma City Thunder in Game 2 on May 9, 2024 to move to 3-2 in Game 2s under Mavericks head coach Jason Kidd's tenure, the second Game 2 he has won this season.

The back-and-forth battle in Game 2 saw Luka Dončić rejuvenate his shot from downtown, hitting four first quarter 3-pointers and ending the game with five 3-pointers (5/8 3FG). He recorded 29 points, 10 rebounds, seven assists, three steals and one block against the Thunder after scoring just 19 points the game before.

P.J. Washington Jr. posted postseason career highs with 29 points (11-18 FG, 7-11 3FG), 11 rebounds, four assists, two steals and a block. His seven 3-pointers made tied his career-high threes behind the arc. He joins five other players in Mavericks playoff history to notch at least seven 3-pointers (9, Jason Terry; 8, Dorian Finney-Smith; 8, Maxi Kleber; 7, Vince Carter; 7, Luka Dončić).

Washington Jr. (29-11) and Dončić(29-10) are the only duo in NBA history to notch at least 25 points, 10 rebounds and five 3-pointers in a playoff game. Stephen Curry and Kevin Durant are the only other pair of teammates to have at least 25 points, 10 rebounds and three 3-pointers in a game. In franchise history, there has only been two instances of two-or-more Maverick teammates notching at least 25 points and 10 rebounds in a playoff game.

R2, GAME THREE: TRIPLE THREAT

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Oklahoma City Thunder 105-101 in Game 3 at the American Airlines Center to take a 2-1 series lead (5/11/24).

The 105-101 win marked the fifth time the Mavericks have held their opponent to 101-or-fewer points in the playoffs this season. After Game 3, the Mavericks are 15-0 through the regular season or postseason this year when holding their opponent to 101-or-fewer points. A large part of the win is contributed to the Mavericks' 15-6 offensive rebound differential, which led to a 16-9 score differential in second chance scoring. Game 2 marked the second time this postseason that the Mavericks have had 15-or-more offensive rebounds in a game. The last time Dallas had multiple games with 15-plus offensive rebounds in a single playoff run was 2008, when the team did so on three different occasions (15 offensive rebounds at NOH, 4/29/08; 16 vs. NOH, 4/27/08; 17 at NOH, 4/19/08).

With **P.J. Washington Jr.** (27), **Kyrie Irving** (22), and **Luka Dončić** (22), the Mavericks had three starters record at least 22 points in the same game since 2007 (4/25/07; Josh Howard, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry). The duo of Irving and Dončić have played in 60 games together, through the regular season and playoffs (5/11/24).

R2, GAME THREE: TRIPLE THREAT CONT.

... With Washington Jr.'s 27 points in Game 3 vs. OKC (5/11/24), it marked the first time in the 60 instances where both Dončić and Irving played that one of the two had not led the team in scoring.

Washington Jr. notched a team-high 27 points, six rebounds and two assists alongside five 3-pointers, becoming the sixth player in Mavericks playoff history to record back-to-back games with at least five 3-pointers (Luka Dončić, Spencer Dinwiddie, Tim Hardaway Jr., Michael Finley and Nick Van Exel). He also notched his second consecutive game with at least 27 points, the second time in his career he has recorded two straight games of 25-or-more points (regular season or postseason) (10/29/22-10/31/22).

R2, GAME FOUR: FREE THROW TROUBLES

The **Dallas Mavericks** lost to the Oklahoma City Thunder 100-96 in Game 5 at home to even the series, 2-2.

Despite leading the game by 14 points early, the Thunder rallied in the second half to beat the Mavericks, in large part due to the latter's struggles at the free throw line. The Mavericks were only able to convert 52.2-percent of their free throws, making only 12-of-23 at the charity stripe. The team's .522 FT% marked the franchise's second-worst free throw percentage of all time in playoff history, only behind the team's 2015 game against Houston (4/26/15) (9-21 FT).

In the loss, Luka Dončić notched an 18-point triple-double for his first of the series and the fifth of his career. P.J. Washington led the Mavericks in scoring with 21 points (7-19 FG, 5-11 3FG, 2-4 FT), which is the second time in the Mavericks' games where Dončić and Kyrie Irving played where neither of the two led the team in scoring (the first time in Game 4, 5/11/24).

R2, GAME FIVE: BOUNCE BACK

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Oklahoma City Thunder 104-92 in Game 5 on the road to take a 3-2 series lead (5/15/24).

The Mavericks held the Thunder to just 92 points in the 104-92 win, marking the fourth time this playoffs the Mavericks have held their opponent to under 100 points. The Mavericks are 13-0 this regular season or playoffs when holding their opponent to under 100 points. In a bounce-back effort from Game 4's loss, the Mavericks also have a 4-0 record after recording a loss this playoffs.

With **Luka Dončić** (31-10-11), **Dereck Lively II** (11-10), and **P.J. Washington Jr.** (10-10), the Mavericks had three players record double-doubles in the same game in the playoffs for the first time since Game 7 at LAC (6/6/21), when Dončić, Kristaps Porzingis, Dorian Finney-Smith and Boban Marjanović all record double-doubles. The Mavericks have had such instances done 13 times in playoff history.

Derrick Jones Jr. recorded a playoff-career-high 19 point, following his then-playoff-career-high 17 points that he notched in Game 4. He went 6-of-6 in the first half of Game 5 for 15 points. Lively II became the youngest Maverick player in franchise playoff history to record a double-double in the playoffs at 20 years and 93 days.

Luka Dončić recorded his 3rd triple-double this playoffs after a 31-point, 10-rebound and 11-assist performance against OKC tonight, the most triple-doubles by a player this postseason. Dončić has notched consecutive triple-doubles in playoffs for the second time in his career.

R2, GAME SIX: SERIES WINNER

The Dallas Mavericks clinched a series win against the Oklahoma City Thunder after a 117-116, Game 6 win. Qualifying for the Western Conference Finals for the second time in the last three years, the Mavericks move to the conference finals for the sixth time in franchise history.

After trailing by 16 at halftime, the Mavericks rallied back in the second half to complete a 17-point comeback win. For the first time in Mavericks playoff history, the team has comeback from a 16-or-more-point deficit at halftime to win a game. Mavericks coach Jason Kidd moves to 5-0 in closeout games in his head coaching career, winning his 26th career playoff game (26-28) tonight as a coach. The Mavericks notched 14 offensive rebounds tonight against the Thunder, outrebounding them on the offensive boards (14-7) for 27 second chance points (27-8). The Mavericks have had at least 14 offensive rebounds in a game four times this playoff (14 vs. OKC, 5/18/24; 15 vs. OKC, 5/11/24; 18 vs. LAC, 5/3/24; 14 vs. LAC, 4/28/24) for the first time since 2015.

Luka Dončić's 29-10-10 marked his third consecutive game with a triple-double. Only four players in NBA history have had three-or-more straight games with a triple-double in the playoffs (Nikola Jokić, Wilt Chamberlain, Draymond Green, Russell Westbrook). Derrick Jones Jr. notched his third consecutive playoff game with a new career-high after recording 22 points (8-13 FG, 4-6 3FG, 2-2 FT).



The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Los Angeles Clippers, 114-101, in six games to secure the series in and move onto the Western Conference Semifinals for the second time in the last three seasons. The win marked the franchise's first playoff series win against the Clippers after failing to do so twice previously (2020, 2021). In advancing, the Mavericks go to their 12th franchise second-round appearance.

Luka Dončić and Kyrie Irving combined for 338 points in the first round, the most by a duo in their first playoffs series together in NBA history.

R1, GAME ONE: SECOND QUARTER STRUGGLE

The **Dallas Mavericks** fell the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 1 of the first round, losing 109-97 after recording just eight points in the second quarter. The team's eight points in the second quarter tie for the fifth-fewest points scored in a quarter in the playoffs in franchise history (4 points at SAC, 5/11/02; 7 at MIA, 6/15/06; 7 at MIA, 6/18/06; 7 vs. LAL, 5/6/84). In every game the team recorded a quarter with eight or fewer points, Dallas lost those games. Of the six games that the team had quarters with eight-or-fewer points, four of them were on the road including recent Game 1 at LAC (4/21/24).

Luka Dončić and Kyrie Irving became the first duo in franchise history to record 30 points each in the same game in their debut as teammates in the playoffs. The Mavericks only have six other instances of a pair of teammates recording 30 points in the same game in the postseason, most recently Jalen Brunson and Dončić vs. GSW (5/20/22).

R1, GAME TWO: UNDER THE CENTURY MARK

For the first time this season, the Dallas Mavericks won a game while scoring less than 100 points after beating the Los Angeles Clippers, 96-93, in Game 2 (4/23/24). The Mavericks were 0-10 in games they scored 103-or-fewer points before beating the Clippers.

Among playoff games within the last six years, 96 points was the fewest scored in a win and the fifth fewest points recorded in a game by the Mavericks. Within the last 10 years, the Mavericks had only two other wins while scoring under 100 points in the playoffs (98 at UTA, 4/28/22; 85 at OKC, 4/18/16).

The Mavericks won despite scoring under 100 points due to a defensive performance that saw the team hold the Clippers to just 93 points, the fifth-fewest points allowed in a playoff game by the Mavericks in the last 10 seasons. Holding LAC to 8-of-30 shooting from behind the arc, .267 is the fifth-lowest shooting percentage by an opponent in the playoffs in the last 10 years for the Mavericks. The Clippers' 93 points is the third-fewest points they have scored in a playoff game in the past five years (80 vs. PHO, 6/26/21; 89 at DEN, 9/15/20). The .368 FG% is the fourth-lowest FG% by the Clippers in their playoff history.

Alongside his 32-6-9-1-1 performance in Game 2, Luka Dončić additionally held his own defensively, hold the Clippers players to 2-of-17 from the floor when he was their primary defender. Of the eight players he faced as a primary defender on their shot attempts, only James Harden (1-5 FG vs. Dončić) and Amir Coffey (1-1 FG vs. Dončić) scored a field goal against the Slovenian international, per ESPN.

R1, GAME THREE: DEFENSIVE LOCKDOWN

Putting on another defensive showing, the Mavericks held the Clippers to just 90 points in a 101-90 win in Game 3 (4/26/24). The Clippers' 90 points is the fewest points the Mavericks have allowed in a game this season. Prior to Game 3, the fewest points allowed by the Mavericks this season (regular or postseason) was 92 at MIA (4/10/24). The Mavericks have held their opponents to 93-or-fewer points in back-to-back games for the first time this season and for the eighth time in playoff history for Dallas. For the first time in playoff history, the Mavericks have won a game while shooting worse than .265 (9-34 3FG) from deep (min. 25 3FGA) after doing so vs. LAC. Prior to Game 3 (4/26/24), the team was 0-5 in the postseason in such instances. The team scored just 101 points, which is their second-fewest points scored in a win. Prior to Game 2 (4/23/24), the Mavericks were 0-10 this season when scoring fewer than 104 points. After Game 3's win, the team has now won back-to-back games while scoring fewer than 103 points.

Per ESPN, the Mavericks had 10 dunks in the first half of Game 3, the second-most dunks a team has had in a playoff half over the last 25 years.

Daniel Gafford recorded eight points, four rebounds, two steals and three blocks. He is the first Mavericks player since Al-Farouq Aminu (4/21/15) to record at least two steals and three blocks in a playoff game. Prior to Aminu, no Maverick had done so in 16 years.

R1, GAME FOUR: CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR

The **Dallas Mavericks** fell the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 4 (4/28/24) of the first round, 116-111, failing short of an NBA-record-tying 31-point comeback.

Paul George notched 16 points in the first quarter after shooting 6-of-9 from the field and 3-of-5 from deep. His 16 points in the first quarter tied for the most points in the opening frame he has ever scored in a playoff game and the fifth-most points recorded in a playoff quarter in his career. The Clippers tied a franchise-record for most 3-pointers in a playoff half with 14 3-pointers made in the first half, helping the team to a 31-point lead.

Kyrie Irving recorded a game-high 40 points (14-25 FG, 6-12 3FG, 6-6 FT), seven rebounds and five assists against the Clippers (4/28/24) for his first career 40-5-5 game in the playoffs. He has only one other instance of 40-5-5 as a Maverick in either the regular season or playoffs (42-7-7 vs. NOP, 1/15/24). Luka Dončić notched 29 points (10-24 FG, 1-9 3FG, 8-10 FT), 10 rebounds, 10 assists and one block vs. LAC. His 29-10-10 marked his fourth playoff triple-double. He is the only player in Mavericks history to record a triple-double in the postseason. Dončić's 29-10-10 marked his fourth playoff triple-double against the Clippers. Outside of Dončić, every other triple-double recorded against the Clippers in the playoffs combined is five (1, Russell Westbrook; 1, James Harden; 1, Draymond Green; 1, Devin Booker; 1, Nikola Jokić).

R1, GAME FIVE: 30 BALL

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 5 (5/1/24), 123-93, to take the series lead 3-2. Winning by 30 points, the Mavericks issued Los Angeles their largest playoff loss in Clippers history and the second-worst loss at home this season for LA (37-point loss vs. BOS, 12/23/23). Over the last 15 years, the Clippers have only suffered four losses at home, regular season or playoffs, where the team lost by 30-or-more points – two of which were against the Mavericks (30-point loss vs. DAL, 5/1/24; 37 vs. BOS, 12/23/23; 51 vs. DAL, 12/27/20; 32 vs. HOU, 4/3/19).

The 30-point win also tied for the fourth-largest playoff win by the Mavericks in franchise history and the second-largest playoff win on the road in franchise history (30-point win at LAC, 5/1/24; 33 at PHX, 5/15/22; 36 vs. LAL, 5/8/11; 40 vs. HOU, 5/7/05; 30 vs. UTA, 5/1/01). Within the last seven years, there have only been four instances of 30-or-more-point blowouts in the playoffs on the road in the NBA, two of which were caused by the Mavericks (30 at LAC, 5/1/24; 33 at PHX, 5/15/22).

Luka Dončić notched 35 points (14-26 FG, 2-8 3FG, 5-5 FT), seven rebounds, 10 assists and one steal in Game 5 (5/1/24), leading all players in points and rebounds that game. His 35 points is more than double the next highest scorer in the game, with no other player on either team having more than 15 points. His 35 points and 10 assists in Game 5 is his fourth of such games in the playoffs, tying him for fifth-most 35-point, 10-assist playoff games in NBA history (LeBron James, Jerry West, Michael Jordan, Oscar Robertson). All of Dončić's 35-point, 10-assist games have come against the Clippers, making him and Oscar Robertson the only two players in NBA history with at least four 35-point, 10-assist games against any one NBA franchise (Robertson vs. BOS). Since joining the league in 2018-19, only Trae Young and Dončić have at least four of such games in the postseason.

In Game 5, **Maxi Kleber** notched five 3-pointers, shooting 5-of-7 (.714) from deep against the Clippers. His five 3-pointers is his most 3-pointers in a game this season (prev. 4 vs. MIL, 2/3/24). Of games in which he recorded five-or-more 3-pointers, regular season or playoffs, Kleber only has one game with better 3-point shooting efficiency (8-11 3FG vs. UTA, 4/18/22).

Dereck Lively II notched his second-straight game with perfect shooting from the floor, going 5-5 from the field (alongside seven rebounds, one assist and one block) in Game 5. He became one of 26 rookies in NBA history to have a double-figure scoring game on perfect shooting and the first to do it since 2016-17 when Dāvis Bertāns notched 13 points on 4-of-4 shooting from the field at GSW (5/16/17). He also became the first player since Lavoy Allen to record at least five field goal makes on perfect shooting as a rookie in the playoffs.

R1, GAME SIX: CLIP THAT

The **Dallas Mavericks** beat the Clippers in a playoff series for the first time in franchise history, including their first Game 6 win against LA.

Kyrie Irving scored just two points in the first half but finished the game with 30 points for his 18th playoff game with at least 30 points after a 28-point outburst in the second half. His 28 points in the second half tied for his most-points in a playoff half in his career. Irving's 28-point second half tied for the fourth-most points scored in a half in the playoffs in franchise history (33, H2, Dirk Nowitzki vs. PHX, 6/1/06; 29, H1, Dončić at LAC, 6/6/21; 29, H2, Nowitzki vs. DEN, 5/11/09; 29, H1, Nowitzki at MIN, 4/28/02). Irving had the second-most point by a Maverick in a playoff half in the last 17 years.

Dereck Lively II is the only rookie in NBA playoff history to notch back-to-back double-figure scoring games on perfect shooting from the field after notching 10 points tonight (3-3 FG, 5/3/24; 12 points, 5-5 FG, 5/1/24). Going 3-of-3 tonight from the field, Lively II has made his last 12 field goal attempts over his last three playoff games. He is the only second player in NBA history to record three consecutive playoff games with perfect shooting (min. 3 FGA) (3-game streak, DeAndre Jordan, 5/1/14-5/5/14).

DEADLINE DEALER

On June 28, 2021, General Manager **Nico Harrison** joined the Mavericks. Harrison joined the Mavericks after spending 19 years at Nike, where he most recently held the title of Vice President of North America Basketball Operations.

Harrison re-tooled the roster in his first season, as the Mavericks entered the season with eight players (out of 17, including two-way's) on the roster who were not with the team at the end of last year's playoff run. Harrison made a deadline deal to acquire Spencer Dinwiddie and Dāvis Bertāns in exchange for Kristaps Porzingis in the most notable move of his tenure. He also signed Reggie Bullock, Sterling Brown and Frank Ntilikina in the offseason, an added Marquese Chriss, Theo Pinson and Moses Wright to the roster by the end of the year after navigating through a season where 27 different players played minutes for the Mavericks.

Last season, at the deadline, Harrison traded for Kyrie Irving and Markieff Morris in exchange for Dorian Finney-Smith, Spencer Dinwiddie, a 2029 first-round pick and two second-round picks. Before the season started, Harrison drafted Jaden Hardy in the 2022 NBA Draft, the sole draft pick by the team that draft. He signed Kemba Walker, JaVale McGee and Justin Holiday to contracts through preseason and in the regular season, making moves to bolster the roster.



WASHINGTON AND GAFFORD

P.J. Washington Jr. was acquired by the Dallas Mavericks from the Charlotte Hornets on February 8, 2024 at the NBA trade deadline alongside two second-round picks for Grant Williams, Seth Curry and a 2028 top-2 protected first-round pick.

Washington Jr., who played high school basketball at Lone Star High School in Frisco, Texas, returns to Dallas after averaging 13.6 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.2 assists through 44 games with the Hornets this season. He leaves Charlotte with the franchise's fifth-most 3-pointers (536) and fifth-most blocks in Hornets history (295).

Daniel Gafford was acquired by the Dallas Mavericks from the Washington Wizards on February 8, 2023 at the NBA trade deadline in exchange for Richaun Holmes and a 2024 first-round pick via the Oklahoma City Thunder.

Gafford comes to the Mavericks after averaging 10.9 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.0 steals and 2.2 blocks with the Wizards through 45 games (45 starts) this season. At the time of the trade, Gafford is one of three players in the NBA this season to average at least one steal and two blocks per game (Victor Wembanyama, Anthony Davis). He had the seventh-highest blocks per game average (2.2) in the NBA this season.

The **Dallas Mavericks** averaged 117.2 points after the trade deadline on Feb. 8 that saw the Mavericks acquire P.J. Washington Jr. and Daniel Gafford, which ranked for the fifth-best offense after the NBA trade deadline.

The team played 31 games (including Feb. 8 at NYK) after the trade deadline concluded at 3 p.m. ET on Feb. 8, going 22-9 over the final stretch of the season. Since Gafford was inserted into the starting lineup, the Mavericks went 21-3 to close out the season.

During the final stretch of games prior to the last two games, the Mavericks have only allowed 105.9 points per game, which is ranked seventh-fewest points allowed in the NBA since March 7. On the flip side, the Mavericks have notched 118.2 points a game in this recent stretch of games, which is the fifth-highest points per game of any team in the league during this time. The Mavericks, Celtics and Nuggets are the only team that are top 10 in fewest points allowed and most points scored since March 7.

Prior to the trade deadline, the Mavericks only won two games in which the team made 12-or-fewer 3-pointers in a game. After the deadline, the Mavericks won eight of such games, going 8-4 in such instances.



AT THE BUZZER

Kyrie Irving hit a left-handed driving hook shot from 21 feet away from the basket to beat the Denver Nuggets, 107-105 (3/17/24). The shot came moments after Luka Dončić tied the game with a 30-foot 3-point make with 25 seconds left in the game.

Irving's shot was just his second career game-winning buzzer beater, the first being against Toronto (12/16/22). The shot came exactly a year from the day Maxi Kleber converted a 3-pointer to beat the Los Angeles Lakers, 111-110 (3/17/23), in a shot that was assisted by Irving. Within the last six years, there have only been three other game-winning buzzer beater in franchise history, including Kleber's 3-pointer over the Lakers. The other two are Dončić's 3-pointer against Boston to beat the Celtics 107-104 (11/6/21), and against the Grizzlies (4/14/21) after Grayson Allen missed two free throws to keep the scoreline within two points, and Dončić converted a 3-point floater to win the game.

Within the last 10 years, there have only been two other game-winning buzzer beaters against a defending champion, Saddiq Bey's shot against the Warriors (1/4/23) and Dwyane Wade's make against the Warriors (2/27/19). Irving's game-winning buzzer beater is the only game-winning buzzer beater over a defending champion in franchise history as far back as data can track (1997-98).

X MARKS THE SPOT



With the Mavericks' game against the Sacramento Kings (3/29/24) tied 103-103 with 28.1 seconds left in the game, **Danté Exum** hit the game hit a critical go-ahead 3-pointer to take the lead against the Kings, 106-103.

Dallas would go on to win the game 107-103 after Luka Dončić missed the first of this two free throws but nailed his second to make it a two-possession game with less than four seconds in the game.

With his go-ahead 3-pointer against the Kings, Exum recorded the first go-ahead or game-tying field goal of his career. Later in the season, he notched his second of such shot after tying the game with a buzzer-beating 3-pointer vs. HOU (3/31/24), 129-129. The Mavericks went on to win the game 147-136, the team's seventh game this season with at least 140 points.



CLUTCH-TIME MAVERICKS

The Dallas Mavericks ended the regular season having been in 32 clutch situations this season. A "clutch" game in the NBA is defined by a game that is within a score margin of five points within the last five minutes. Within such instances, the Mavericks have a 23-9 record in clutch games, the second-best record in such situations in the league behind just the Los Angeles Lakers (24-9). The team has the fifth-best shooting percentage in clutch moments (47.5 FG%), the fourth-best 3-point shooting percentage in clutch moments (36.8 3FG%) and the third-best free throw shooting percentage in the clutch (85.5).

DALLAS KAI-LIGHTS



On February 6, 2023, G **Kyrie Irving** was traded to the Mavericks from the Brooklyn Nets in exchange for Dorian Finney-Smith, Spencer Dinwiddie, a 2029 first-round pick and a 2027 second-round pick and a 2029 second round pick.

The addition of Irving added a different facet to the Mavericks. Last season, Irving led the league in fourth quarter scoring, totaling 551 fourth-quarter points and averaged 9.3 points in the final frame. This season in 2023-24, Irving is seventh in the league with a 7.3 average in the fourth quarter.

Against Houston (4/7/24), Irving recorded a Mavericks-high 48 points (15-25 FG, 3-8 3FG, 15-17 FT), seven rebounds and two assists. Of his 48 points, he notched a season-high 19 points in the fourth quarter, the most points scored in the fourth quarter by a Mavericks player this season, while spearheading the way for the Mavericks to record their tied-seventh-largest comeback in franchise history.

In January, Irving recorded 44 points (15-26 FG, 6-10 3FG, 8-9 FT), four rebounds, 10 assists and two steals against the New York Knicks (1/11/24) in a game where Dončić was absent.

His 44-point outing against the Knicks marked his second-most points recorded in a game as a Mavericks player. His previous high was 41 points at ATL (4/2/23), a number he has since surpassed three times with his 44 vs. NYC (1/11/24), 42 points vs. NOP (1/15/24) and 48 vs. HOU (4/7/24). His 44 and 42 points marked the first time he has recorded 40 points twice in a span of three games as a Maverick.

Irving's 44-point, 10-assist efforts against the Knicks (1/11/24) made him the second player in Mavericks history to record at least 40 points and 10 assists in a game (Luka Dončić). Although Dončić has done so many times, Irving is the only other player to do so with points and assists, and the ninth player in franchise history to record a 40-point double-double overall.

ONE OF A KAI-ND

After recording 42 points vs. NOP (1/15/24), **Kyrie Irving** notched a five-game streak of recording 30-or-more points, tied for the second-longest streak of 30-plus-point games in his career (6-game streak, 1/19/23-1/28/23; 5-game streak, 3/14/19-3/23/19). He is one of seven players this season to record at least a five-game streak of 30-plus points (Joel Embiid, Luka Dončić, Trae Young, Kevin Durant, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Giannis Antetokounmpo). Including Irving, only three players in Mavericks history has had at least five consecutive games with 30-or-more points, one of which was Luka Dončić who extended a franchise-record with 11 consecutive games of 30-plus points (Mark Aguirre).

In the three-game span from Jan. 11, 2024 to Jan. 15, 2024, Irving totaled 119 points, tying his third-most points across any three-game span in his career (119, 1/25/20-1/31/20; 125, 3/10/22-3/23/22; 132, 3/8/23-3/15/22). At the start of the new year, Irving recorded nine rebounds at UTA (1/1/24), nine vs. POR (1/3/24) and nine vs. POR (1/5/24), marking the first time in his career he has recorded at least three consecutive games with nine-or-more rebounds. In addition to the eight rebounds he recorded vs. MIN (1/7/24) and eight vs. MEM (1/9/24), Irving recorded eight-plus rebounds in at least five consecutive games for the first time in his career.

Since joining the Mavericks in Feb. 2023 last season, Irving averaged 26.0 points through 78 games played, adding 5.0 rebounds and 5.4 assists. In games he has appeared in, the Mavericks are 47-31. However, for stretches in January this season and four games last season, Irving was without Dončić for 11 games. In games without Dončić, Irving averaged 30.0 points, 5.4 rebounds and 6.6 assist, and the Mavericks went 7-4 in such games.

After playing against the reigning champions Denver Nuggets on March 17, Irving appeared in his 18th consecutive game, the longest streak of games he has appeared in since 2016. He ended his streak of games played at 31 after missing the penultimate game of the season vs. DET (4/12/24). Irving ended the season .003 field goal percentage away from his second career 50-40-90 season after he shot .497 FG%, .411 3FG, .905 FT%.



WORLD'S FINEST

Luka Dončić and **Kyrie Irving** became just the third duo in NBA history to end the season recording at least 25 points, five rebounds and five assists each. Dončić finished the season winning the first scoring title in Mavericks history with 33.9 points per game, while adding 9.2 rebounds and 9.8 assists per game. Irving averaged 25.6 points, 5.0 rebounds and 5.2 assists. The only other duos who have done so in the same season are Stephen Curry and Kevin Durant (2018, 2019) and James Harden and Russell Westbrook (2020).

The duo is the only pair in franchise history to record at least 25 points per game in the same season, having done so twice (2022-23; 2023-24). The only pairs of teammates to average at least 20 points in the season are (Mark Aguirre, Rolando Blackman; Mark Aguirre, Adrian Dantley; Jim Jackson, Jamal Mashburn; Michael Finley, Dirk Nowitzki; Luka Dončić and Kristaps Porziņģis).

At MIL (11/18/23), Irving and Dončić had 16 and 15 field goal makes, respectively, marking the second time in team history that two players have had 15-or-more field goal makes in the same game for the Mavericks (Mark Aguirre, Rolando Blackman, 1983-84). In the last five years, only five pairs of teammates in the NBA have had at least 15 field goals in the same game.

With Irving's highest-scoring game as a Maverick vs. HOU (4/7/24) (48 points) and Dončić's near 35-point triple-double that game (37-9-12), the duo combined for at least 35 points in the same for the fourth time as Mavericks, surpassing the duo of Mark Aguirre and Rolando Blackman for the most-35-points-in-the-same-game instances.

Last season, the pair recorded 40 points vs. PHI (3/2/23), marking the first time in franchise history that Dallas had two 40-point scorers in the same game. It marked just the third time in NBA history that two teammates have recorded at least 40 points and five assists in the same game in a non-overtime game in either the regular season or playoffs. Irving in 2016 had such an instance with LeBron James after the pair both had 41 points and six and seven assists, respectively (vs. GSW, 6/13/16).

THREAT FROM DEEP

The **Dallas Mavericks** finished third in the league this season in 3-pointers made with 1,197, shooting 1,197-for-3,242 for a .369 clip from behind the arc. The team's 1,197 3-pointers total for the season ranked for the second-most 3-pointers in a single season in franchise history (1,246, 2022-23).

The Mavericks are the second team in NBA history to record 15-or-more threes in a game for the first five games of the season, tied with the 2019-20 New Orleans Pelicans who also did so for the first five games of the season. After failing to make 15 3-pointers against the Charlotte Hornets (14, 11/5/23), the Mavericks have recorded 15-or-more threes in their following four games to make them the first team in NBA history to record 15-or-more 3-pointers in nine of a team's first 10 games.

The Mavericks had two players shoot over 40.0% from behind the arc (min. 100 3FGA): Dante Exum and Kyrie Irving. Exum ranked second in the league in 3FG% after shooting .491 from deep (min. 100 3FGA), only behind OKC's Aaron Wiggins (.492 3FG%). Of players who attempted more than 400 3-pointers this season, Irving ranked 10th overall with a .411 3-point percentage (.461, Grayson Allen; .442, Mike Conley; .429, CJ McCollum; .424, Sam Hauser; .415, D'Angelo Russell; .414, Naz Reid; .413, Malik Beasley; .413, Paul George; .413, Kevin Durant).

With Dončić (284), Hardaway Jr. (211) and Irving (173), the Mavericks saw three players record at least 170 3-pointers in the same season for the first time in franchise history, and the second time in franchise history that the team had three players record at least 150 3-pointers in the same season (2022-23, Dončić, Hardaway Jr., Reggie Bullock). They are one of three teams this season to have at least three players with at least 170 3-pointers this season (Atlanta; Boston).

GAFF DOES NOT MISS

Daniel Gafford led the league in field goal percentage this season after making 348-of-480 from the field for a .725 field goal percentage and recorded the second-highest field goal percentage in franchise history (min. 400 FGA) (.726 FG%, Wilt Chamberlain, 1972-73).

With the Mavericks, Gafford went 145-of-186 from the field for a .780 shooting percentage post-trade deadline. He and Dereck Lively II became the first pair of teammates to record a .725 field goal percentage in the same season in NBA history (min. 200 FGA), and Gafford becomes the second player in NBA history to record at least a .725 FG% (min. 200 FGA) in multiple seasons (.732, 2022-23) (Mitchel Robinson).

Gafford and Rudy Gobert are the only players to have at least .693 field goal percentage through a season (min. 400 FGA) multiple times. Since joining the league in 2019-20, only Robert Williams (.731) has a higher field goal percentage than Gafford (.731), although the former has attempted 735 less shots.

Since 2020-21, only Gafford, Gobert, Jakob Poeltl, Clint Capela, Jarrett Allen and Myles Turner have had four seasons with at least 75 blocks. This season, Gafford has 153 blocks, the most blocks in a season in his career (prev. 99 blocks, 2022-23, 2021-22). He has the seventh-most blocks in the league this season and becomes just the second Maverick to have 150-or-more blocks in a season (Shawn Bradley).

Gafford set a new record in the play-by-play era (1996-97) for most consecutive field goal makes in a row without a miss after hitting 33 straight field goals, two away from tying Wilt Chamberlain's record (35) for most consecutive field goal makes. His 33 straight field goal makes is the second-longest in NBA history. Going 9-of-9 from the field vs. CHI, his former team, Gafford recorded the most consecutive field goal makes in a game since the play-by-play era (since 1996-97), surpassing Derrick Favors' 22 straight makes in 2019-20 by finishing the game with 28 straight makes (7-7 FG vs. IND, 3/5/24; 5-5 vs. MIA, 3/7/24; 7-7 at DET, 3/9/24; 9-9 at CHI, 3/11/24) before later extending the total to 33.

Later in the season, Gafford set the second-longest consecutive field goal make streak in the play-by-play era (1996-97) after going 12-of-12 from the field at CHA (4/9/24), which marked a franchise record for most field goals made in a game without a miss in franchise history (previous: Brandan Wright, 10-10, at LAL 4/4/14). He had a 23 consecutive field goal make streak that ended with his second shot against DET (4/12/24) missing, becoming the second-longest in the play-by-play era (His 33 streak). He is the only player in the play-by-play era to have multiple streaks of at least 20 FGM.

He is one of six players in NBA history to record back-to-back games with at least 15 points on 100-percent shooting (DeAndre Jordan; Boris Diaw; Tyrone Hill; Fouts Walker; Wilt Chamberlain), and the first player to do it since DeAndre Jordan in 2016 after going 9-of-9 at CHI (3/11/24) and 7-of-7 at DET (3/9/24).

In his first game as a Maverick (vs. OKC, 2/10/24), Gafford recorded 19 points and nine rebounds, the second-most points coming off the bench in a Mavericks debut (25, Christian Wood, 10/19/22). In his second game with Dallas (vs. WAS, 2/12/24), Gafford recorded 16 points, 17 rebounds, two assists, two steals and five blocks for his third career 15-15 game. His five blocks and two steals made him the first Maverick in the last five years to have at least five blocks and two steals. His 14 rebounds in the first half is a career-high and is the most by a Maverick in a half since 2018 (14 vs. LAC, 12/2/18, DeAndre Jordan).



LOOKING LIVELY, ROOK

Dereck Lively II led all rookies in field goal percentage (min. 200 FGA), and third amongst all rookies in rebounds per game and blocks per game. His 77 blocks on the season is the third-most in franchise history by a rookie (81, Sean Rooks; 79, Roy Tarpley), and he recorded 77 blocks with 20 less games played than Roy Tarpley and 17 games less than Sean Rooks.

Lively ended the season with the highest field goal percentage by any rookie in NBA history (min. 40 games played) after shooting .747 from the field in his first year. He had a streak of nine games with a block to start his NBA career (10/25-11/12/23), becoming the only Mavericks rookie to accomplish that feat. He is one of 20 players in NBA history to have a block in the first nine games of their career since 1970-71.

With two instances of 20-plus points on .910 field goal percentage in the same season, Lively became just the fifth rookie in NBA history to have multiple of such occasions in a season. He also recorded 20 points (9-9 FG) and a career-high 16 rebounds and seven blocks vs. OKC (12/2/23), becoming the first rookie in NBA history within the shot-clock era to record a 10-15 game on perfect shooting from the field.



RECORD-BREAKING SEASON

- Became the **first player in NBA history** to average at least 33.0 points (33.9), 9.0 rebounds (9.2) and 9.0 assists (9.8) in a season.

- Produced the **first 25-point triple-double in a half in NBA history** when he recorded 29 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in the opening half vs. Utah on Dec. 6.
- Notched his 75th career triple-double, becoming the ninth player in NBA history to reach the milestone and moving one triple-double shy of tying James Harden (76) for the eighth-most triple-doubles in NBA history.
- Led the league in 35-point games (32) and 40-point efforts (13).
- Also led the league in 35-point triple-doubles (11) and 40-point triple-doubles (2).
- Recorded **Mavs franchise-record 21 triple-doubles** in 2023-24 after recording his 77th career triple-double with a 39-point, 12-rebound, 10-assist showing at CHA (4/9/24), beating his previously set record of 17 in 2019-20.
- **Most 3-pointers made in a single season in franchise history** with 284 as of 4/10 at Miami, second only to Steph Curry in 2023-24.
- Recorded ninth consecutive 30-point, 5-rebound, 5-assist game, tying Oscar Robertson for the longest streak in NBA history (12/18/23).
- Recorded **10 consecutive games with at least 30 points** (12/18/23), the longest streak of his career and a franchise-high.
- Surpassed Dirk Nowitzki for most 35 point games in franchise history (79) after 40 at POR (12/16/23).
- Recorded the most 15-5-5 quarters in the play-by-play era with five.

THERE'S MAGIC IN THE AIR

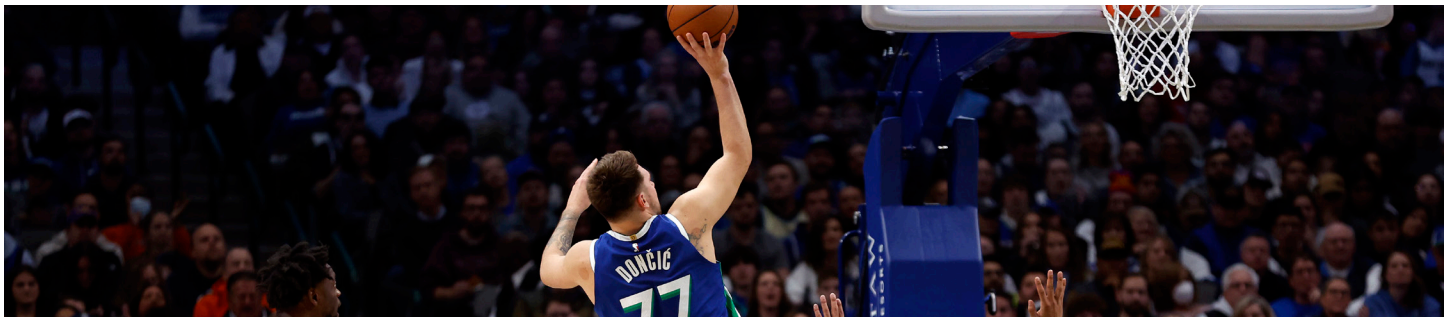
Luka Dončić garnered a career-high and franchise-most 73 points in a 148-143 win over the Atlanta Hawks at State Farm Arena on January 26, 2024. In a record-setting night, Dončić tied for the fourth-most points scored in a game in NBA history, with only three other players recording 73-or-more points (Wilt Chamberlain, Kobe Bryant and David Thompson). His 73 points was the most points recorded in a game this season and the most recorded in a game since Kobe Bryant's 81 in 2006.

Dončić's 73 points was one of 15 games with a player scoring 70-or-more points in NBA history and one of 11 games with the player doing so with a 70-point double-double. Only Dončić and Wilt Chamberlain have had at least one 73-plus point double-double in NBA history. With 73 points (25-33 FG, 8-13 3FG, 15-16 FT), 10 rebounds, seven assists and a steal, Dončić became the second player in NBA history to have multiple games with 60-plus points, 10-plus rebounds and five-plus assists and the first in over 50 years (Elgin Baylor, 63-31-7 vs. PHW on 12/8/61; 64-17-8 vs. BOS, 11/8/59). His seven assists marked the most assists in a 70-point effort in a non-overtime game (Donovan Mitchell, 71 points & 11 assists vs. CHI in overtime).

Missing just eight shots the entire night and going 25-for-33, Dončić recorded the most efficient 70-point game in NBA history with a .758 field goal percentage. Only Wilt Chamberlain's 66 points on 29-for-35 shooting (.829) and Karl Malone's 61 points on 21-for-26 shooting (.808) are the 60-plus-point efforts on higher efficiency than Dončić's 73 points on 25-for-33 shooting (.758). There were only two efforts with at least 50 points in NBA history with better efficiency where the player recorded at least 50 points and eight 3-pointers (50 points with 9 3-pointers, Kyrie Irving at CHA on 3/8/22; 50 points with 8 3-pointers, Jamal Murray at CLE on 2/19/21). With 33 field goal attempts, Dončić was the only player in NBA history to record at least 70 points with 33-or-fewer field goal attempts. Dončić's 25 field goals made marked a new franchise-record, breaking Mark Aguirre's record 21 field goals made (at DEN, 3/24/84) that Dončić once tied in his 60-21-10 effort vs. NYK (21 FGM, 12/27/22).

At halftime, Dončić had 41 points (16-21 FG) against the Hawks, setting a new franchise record for points in a single half (previous: 34, Dirk Nowitzki, 2nd half, vs UTA 11/3/09). His 41-point half is the 15th 40-point half in the past 20-plus years in NBA history. His 16 field goals made is the third-most in a half in NBA history (18, Kobe Bryant vs. TOR, 1/22/0; 17, Brandon Jennings vs. GS, 11/14/09), doing so with the third-highest efficiency (min. 15 FGM) behind Kenneth Lofton Jr.'s 15-for-18 (.833) shooting at OKC (4/9/23) and Brandon Jennings' 17-for-21 (.810) shooting vs. GS (11/14/09).

Dončić (73) and **Josh Green** (21) combined for 94 points between the two, tying Kobe Bryant (81) and Smush Parker (13) for the most combined points by any two teammates in the last 40 years (94 points). They are tied for the third-most combined points by any two teammates in the last 60 years (98 points, 51, Kiki Vandeweghe & 47, Alex English vs. DET, 12/13/83; 95, 45, Mike Mitchell & 50, George Gervin vs. MIL, 3/6/82).



TRIPLE-DONČIĆ

Luka Dončić has a franchise-best 77 triple-doubles, which are already more than every other current and former Maverick combined (40). Dončić recorded a league-high 17 triple-doubles in 2019-20, becoming the youngest player in NBA history (21 years, 168 days) to lead the league outright in the category, becoming the franchise's all-time leader. He set a single-season franchise record for most triple-doubles in a season with 21 in 2023-24. He has missed a triple-double by 1 rebound or 1 assist on 32 occasions in his career through the regular season or postseason (10 time this season).

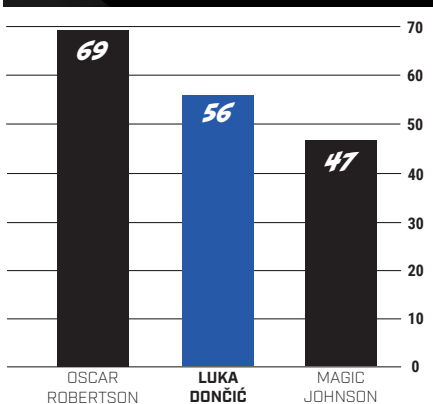

Dončić also broke the record for most triple-doubles before turning 23 years old with his game vs. CHI (1/9/2022) and holds the all-time record with 45 (Oscar Robertson, 38).

Dončić became the first player in NBA history to record a 25-point triple-double through a single half after facing the Utah Jazz (12/6/23). He ended the night with a 40-point triple-double (40-10-11), sitting the entirety of the fourth in a blowout win, 147-97. The 50-point win was the franchise's sixth 50-point win and tied for the third-largest win in franchise history.

After his 73-point performance at ATL (1/26/24) in which he recorded 10 rebounds and seven assists as well as 73 points and his preceding performance against the Sacramento Kings (1/27/24), he became the first player to average a 50-point triple-double over the span of two games. He recorded 28 points, 10 rebounds and 17 assists at SAC.

Jason Kidd was named the 10th head coach in Mavericks history on June 28, 2021.

Kidd, who was inducted to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2018, is in his third stint in Dallas after spending eight of his 19 seasons as a player with the team and helping the Mavericks to the 2011 NBA title.

Kidd joins the Mavericks after most recently serving two seasons as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Lakers, where he was part of the franchise's 2020 NBA championship season.

Kidd's coaching career began in 2013 when he helmed the Brooklyn Nets for one season. He is the third person since the NBA-ABA merger (1976) to become a head coach in the season after he retired as a player. As a rookie head coach, Kidd earned a pair of Eastern Conference Coach of the Month awards (January and March), leading the Nets to 44-38 record and an appearance in the Eastern Conference Semifinals.

On July 1, 2014, Kidd became the head coach of the Milwaukee Bucks in a transaction that sent two second round draft picks to Brooklyn (2015, 2019). He became the first coach in NBA history to lead two teams to the postseason in his first two seasons after helping the Bucks to a 41-41 record and improving on their 15-win season from a year earlier. Kidd finished third in NBA Coach of the Year voting following the 2014-15 season.

In three-plus seasons with Milwaukee, Kidd amassed a 139-152 record and appeared in the playoffs twice before parting ways with the franchise midway through the 2017-18 season.

Kidd was drafted second overall by the Mavericks in 1994 NBA Draft and spent two-and-a-half seasons in Dallas before being traded to Phoenix during the 1996-97 campaign. He shared Rookie of the Year honors with Grant Hill after averaging 11.7 points, 5.4 rebounds and 7.7 assists in his first season.

Kidd returned to Dallas from New Jersey in an eight-player trade in February 2008. Following the trade, Kidd teamed up with former Mavericks superstar Dirk Nowitzki and together they led the Mavericks to the 2011 NBA title, defeating Miami 4-2 to bring the Larry O'Brien Trophy to DFW.

He averaged 12.6 points, 6.3 rebounds, 8.7 assists and 1.9 steals in 1,391 games (1,350 starts) with Dallas, Phoenix, New Jersey and New York. In 500 games with Dallas (all starts), he averaged 10.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 8.4 assists 1.9 steals and 34.6 minutes.

Kidd's 12,091 career assists and 2,684 career steals are the second-most in NBA history behind John Stockton. His 107 career triple-doubles represent the fourth-most in NBA history. Kidd was a 10-time NBA All-Star, five-time All-NBA First Team selection and four-time All-Defensive First Team pick.

Kidd played two seasons at the University of California. The Oakland, California, native led the Golden Bears to consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament and, as a sophomore, was an All-American and the Pac-10 Player of the Year. He also won two Olympic gold medals as a member of Team USA (2000, 2008).
