

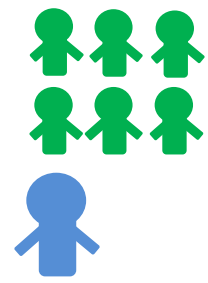

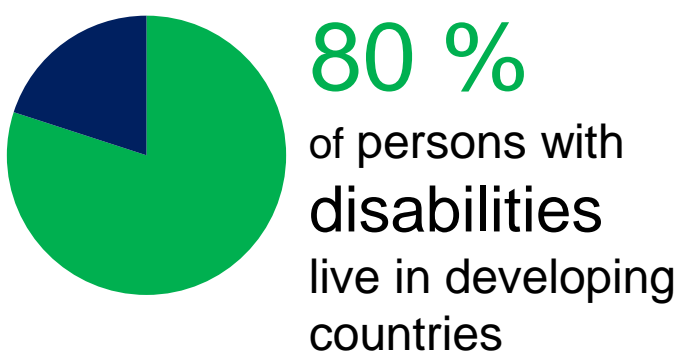

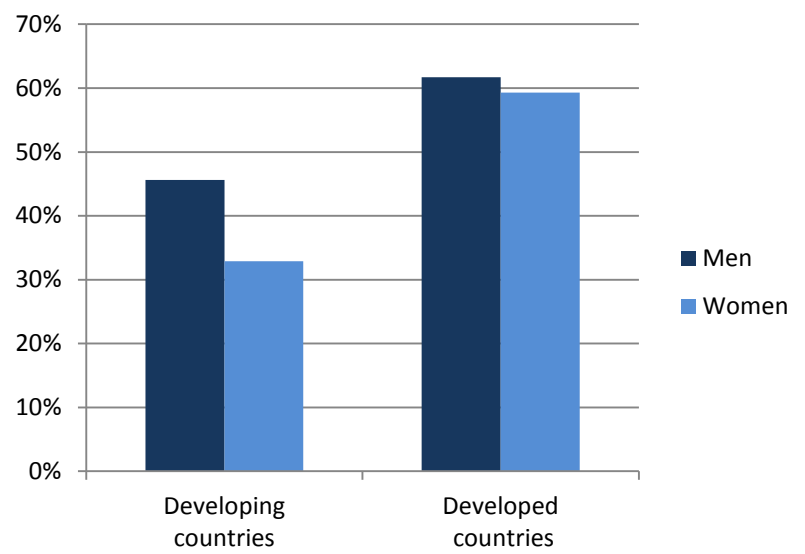
**150** million children (under the age of 18) have a disability

Having **disability** increases the cost of living by about a **third** of average income

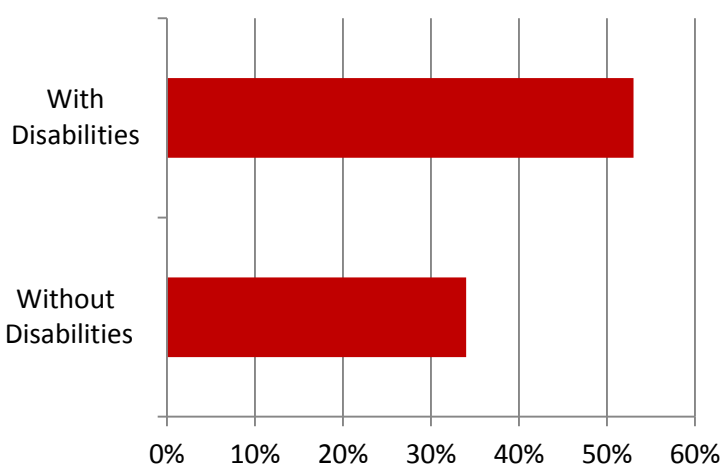

Primary school completion among persons with disabilities, 2002, 51 countries



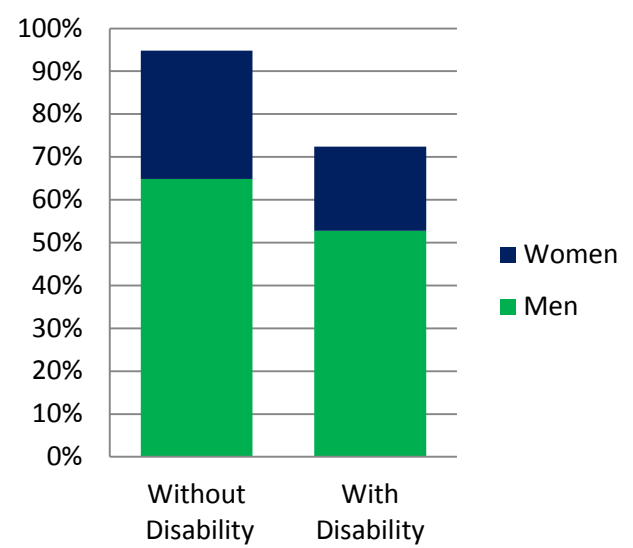

Persons with and without disability who cannot afford health care, 2002/3, 51 countries



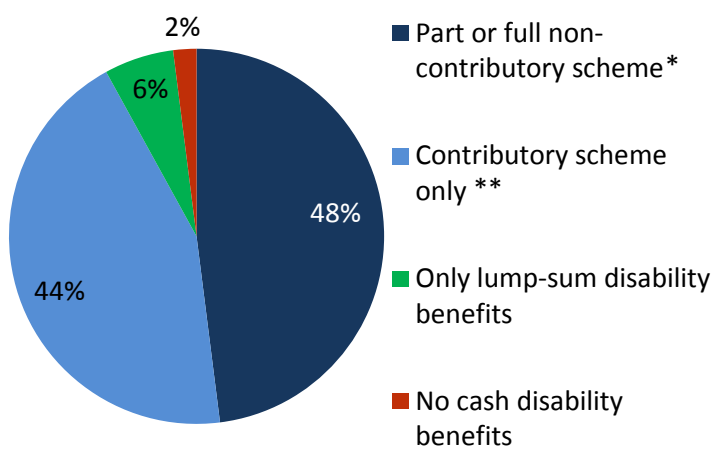

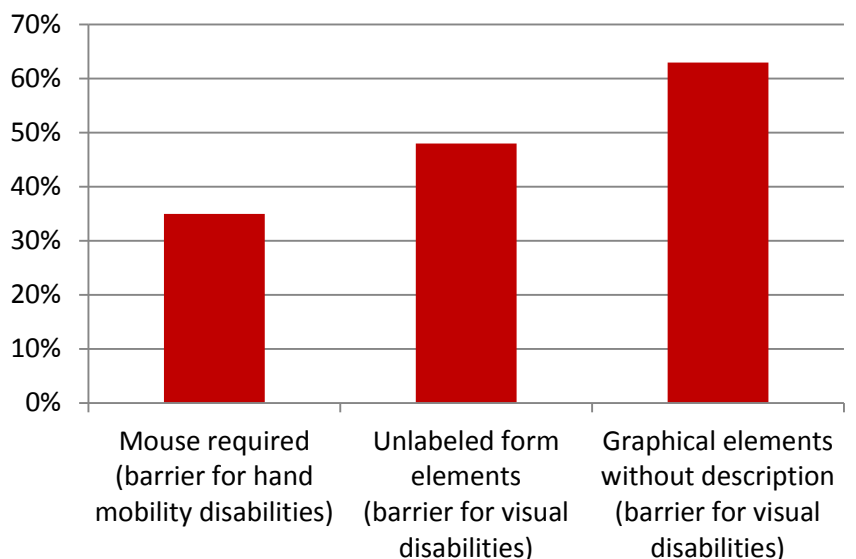
Social protection for persons with disabilities by type of programme and benefit, 2012/13, in 183 countries
