California Capitol Report

Game-changer landscape ordinance to drive pool design

The challenges to the swimming pool and spa industry just keep coming. As a result of legislation passed in 2006, each public entity was required to adopt a Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance by January 1, 2010 that was at least as stringent as the Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO) established by the Department of Water Resources. For residential construction, the MWELO applies to developer-installed landscaping that is 2,500 square feet or more, and to owner-installed or contracted landscaping that is 5,000 square feet or more. However, these standards were never adopted into the building code and therefore were not enforced, which means that many pool builders and contractors were not familiar with the law.

The MWELO measures water use by backyards in terms of "low water users" and "high water users", balancing out the two to



create an efficient landscape. An area of high water use must be counterbalanced with a larger area of low water use such as drought resistant landscaping, leading to complex calculations for water use totals and allowable square footage. The problem is that when it comes to making these calculations, the MWELO classifies pools and spas in the same category as decorative ponds, classifying them as a high water user. Since only the waterusing part of the yard is taken into account, all of the hardscape surrounding the pool that takes no water at all and often replaces water-intensive lawns is left out of the calculation.

While the MWELO has existed for years but has not been enforced, this will all change thanks to the Emergency Building Regulations that went into effect on June 1, 2015. The California

Ask Sue

A few months ago, I wrote about Pentair's new TechSmart Troubleshooter app - a logic-

based tool for mobile phones and tablets that the training team has spent a lot of time lately working on and refining. It guides a technician in the field through standard troubleshooting steps for Max-E-Therm and MasterTemp heaters.

TechSmart is easier to use than

paper troubleshooting guides because it adjusts next steps based on what the technician finds at each stage in the troubleshooting process. For example, if you tell TechSmart that there is no voltage at the secondary side of the transformer, it will next ask you if you have voltage on the primary side.

Just last month, TechSmart got even easier to use, as we added and refined troubleshooting tips for faster repairs. For example, the upgrade has more details on troubleshooting the blower connector and the hot surface ignitor.

Also, in the Charts and Tables section, you can now find heater schematics for the water, electrical and burner components. Simply select which heater model you are working on, along with schematic you wish to research (water, electrical or burner components). Then tap on the part and TechSmart will display the part number and description. This will simplify ordering parts or retrieving them from your truck or inventory. Each

schematic includes kit numbers and displays what parts are included in each kit.

Another addition to the Charts and Tables section is a Heater Tools tab, which lists the tools needed for troubleshooting - a handy reminder of the required wrench and nut driver sizes and to bring a manometer and multi meter.

Early versions of the tool were demonstrated at trade shows in 2013 and early 2014, and the feedback from both the shows and field tests has been very positive. Some of the feedback led to great suggestions that have already been incorporated – like providing the part number for the identified defective part. We even added pictures of the parts!

Even though it works on an Apple or Android phone or tablet, TechSmart, once downloaded, does not require Internet access, so you can use it any time and it does not consume data on your mobile plan. You just click the TechSmart


icon and the program launches. It provides immediate, portable access to how-to videos, clear step-by-step directions on how to troubleshoot symptoms for each specific heater, and reference materials. The how-to section provides videos that take the technician through each step of testing gas pressure, continuity, voltage and resistance. Commonly used charts and tables are loaded into the tool, so you can easily find gas line sizing, water flow requirements, gas and air orifice reference charts, and more. Techs can consult the tool en route to a jobsite, or during an actual service call — whenever the need arises.

TechSmart has been designed to be very user-friendly, but in case a user needs help in the field, Continued on page 5



Hey Ray!

This month's question comes from a member in San Diego:

Question

I need your help. I drained a customer's pool 9 months ago because the TDS levels were very high. The plaster is 14 years old and there are now a couple of areas where the plaster has delaminated. She is suggesting that I've done something wrong, even though another pool technician has told her that my chemistry is spot-on. Additionally, she is insisting that I stop using chlorine because of her skin allergies and wants me to find a chemical-free, natural way to keep the water sanitized. I don't know what to do. Any suggestions?

Answer

I hear similar stories frequently; demanding customers insisting on unrealistic solutions and looking for every opportunity to blame the swimming pool technician for even a bit of bird poop around the pool deck. Maybe it is the stressful times in which we live. Personally, I think everyone should eat more avocados, which are said to be rich in stress-relieving B vitamins*. Attempt to explain to your customer that the average life of pool plaster is about 10 years and any damage resulting from the draining of her pool would have been apparent long before now. She may not accept that answer and

you may be speaking with me again about an insurance claim.

But you are also dealing with a customer that is objecting to your use of commonly accepted sanitizers that are proven to eliminate harmful bacteria from pool water. A pool technician has a duty to maintain a swimming pool in a manner that is safe for its users and you are doing that. The customer can't dictate those measures. I'd look for an opportunity to "consolidate" your route and this may be the first candidate toward you meeting that goal.

The science behind pool cleaning: Aquatic Facility Maintenance

Best practices for using robotic pool cleaners in commercial pools

By Richard K. Cacioppo, Sr, J.D.

Editor's note: In November 2011, this author started working with North American and international aquatic health organizations in anticipation of the United States' Centers for Disease Control's (CDC's) recently published initial version of its Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC). His passion

and main focus was the need to improve methodology and equipment to properly clean public swimming pools. His first step was to found the Center for Public and Lodging Pool Study (CPLPS), headquartered in Princeton, NJ. The Center is currently working with several major manufacturers of robotic cleaners and handheld.

extended-reach pool and spa vacuums to conduct a survey in the U.S. and Canada (visiting many of the former Canadian Pacific and Grand Trunk Railway hotels and resorts) on the current methods and equipment being used to clean the pools of the most elite hotels and resorts in both countries. As part of this effort, these facilities are being supplied with product at no cost for use and evaluation. He is also collaborating with the National Sanitation Foundation International to establish standards and protocol for testing and certification of pool cleaners and vacuums.

Pool cleaning, namely brushing and vacuuming, is a science

not an art. A pool (i.e. the water) is a living thing as it constantly changes. Beyond the water and the supporting structure, every pool is composed of millions of living and non-living organisms. Some are innocuous, while others are deadly. Pool water is exposed to every change in the surrounding environment—from temperature and humidity to wind and precipitation, but most of all, bather loads. Indoor pools are less affected by weather and the surrounding environment, but are still affected by their own surroundings as they are restricted to a confined space. It is almost like a reverse process. What is in the pool water evaporates into the air in the indoor space and is inhaled by bathers and pool personnel.

Pool operators have a responsibility to their employers and, most importantly, bathers who use the pool (and spa) facility. An improperly cleaned pool is a breach of responsibility. This can result in financial losses to the organization, and possibly even criminal prosecution.


Failure to properly clean a pool allows dangerous contaminants to remain in the water or even evaporate into the air after it passes through the pool's circulation system. In fact, there is a misconception that most filtration systems will sufficiently remove all contaminants from the pool. However, this is not the case and there are several problems with relying solely on the main pump and filter:

- Filter systems do not clean the entire pool. They primarily draw water from the surface and pool floor. Debris and contaminants that adhere to the walls, floors, corners, and other parts of the pool's vertical structure are filtered only when they initially enter the water.
- Filter systems do not brush and/or vacuum the pool. The walls, steps, floor, and hard-to-reach areas of the pool must be continuously brushed to release contaminants into the water, where dirt, leaves, and even microscopic debris are then sucked into the skimmers or into the floor drains after settling to the bottom of the pool, almost always in the deep end.

Most pools, when they are being used during the day, are not properly maintained—other than those with state-of-the-art automatic controllers that help pool operators monitor and correct water imbalance, sanitation, lights, pumps, heaters, modes (between spas and pools) and valve actuators. Even the most responsible pool operators monitor proper sanitation not more than a few times per day, some at far greater intervals. In the summer, when bather loads hit peak levels, most pools operate at least 12 hours per day. It is during this time that they are rarely cleaned. Between regular sanitation checks and any corrective measures, bathers can be exposed to whatever is floating in the water or attached to the pool's walls, steps, and floors as well as any cracks, crevices, and corners.

Manual brushing is inadequate
It is virtually; if not literally





impossible to manually brush the entire surface of a pool (i.e. walls, floor, and other areas) on a regular basis as there is simply too much area to cover. Further, even if it were possible, workers are limited to what they can see and, in most cases, if any area of the pool appears to be dirt-free, it will not likely be cleaned. Pool cleaning is one of the three main disciplines

of proper water hygiene, the other two being sanitation and filtration. Robotic pool cleaners: Past,

present, and future

As noted in this author's 2011 short book, A Brief History of Pool Cleaners, the first pool cleaner was patented in the United States and the first major investigation into pool hygiene was addressed by the American Public

Health Association (APHA)., the same year, 1912. Thereafter, the organization started creating reports and proposals to develop laws and guidelines for proper pool hygiene and safety. And, in In September 2014, the CDC released the long awaited MAHC (this author is a member of the Constitutional Committee of the Conference on the MAHC to modify and implement it).

Commencing in the APHA's

first official report in 1921, which was issued in narrative form by its Joint Committee of Safety Engineers, and continuing through 1984, nine additional reports were issued. In almost each case, it was highly recommended that all commercial pools should use pool vacuums on a regular basis.

A current study being conducted in Canada and the U.S. by the Center for Public and Lodging Pool Study (CPLPS) has revealed many pools at the most elite hotels and resorts are way behind the

time as it comes to pool maintenance. According to this author, the study estimates only one per cent of all of these facilities currently use robotic pool cleaners, while the remaining opt to clean their pools manually.

Fairmont Hotels & Resorts, a Toronto-based operator of luxury hotels and resorts has been invited to participate in the CPLPS study and being offered a complimentary high-end robotic pool cleaner as well as a handheld pool and spa commercial vacuum, which are ideal for commercial pool operators and service professionals who manage both public and private pools.2

As a result, several other facilities have proactively started to incorporate robotic pool cleaners into their pool maintenance routines.

Routine robotics

Robotic pool cleaners can be easily incorporated into the protocol of any medium-to-large aquatic facility. Their operation is simple: plug it in, program the unit for coverage and length of operating time, and drop it in the water. For example, a typical YMCA pool might be 23-m (75-ft) long, have more than 329,330 L (87,000 gal) of water, and see heavy usage in terms of swimming lessons, water aerobics, swim meets etc. At the end of the day, after all swimmers have left, the facility manager/ operator starts the daily pool cleaning regimen—in compliance with provincial health codesbefore the pool can be reopened the next day.

The daily closing routine typically involves testing and treating the water. However, one of the latest best management practices (BMPs) used by facility managers is to start the pool cleaning routine by placing a robotic cleaner into the pool first, before performing any other maintenance.

Alex Sutherland, a certified pool operator (CPO) and director of facility services for Family YMCA in St. Thomas, Ont., now has his staff begin their normal pool closing routine by plugging in a robotic cleaner and placing it in the centre of the pool first.In one of the United States' grand hotels, The Homestead in Warm Springs, Virginia, managed by nother property management company like Fairmont which specializes in ultra luxury hotels and resorts that has numerous pools and even a lazy river, an hour after they are closed, the manager directs a staff of many employees to spend hours manually cleaning them. This is the rule, not the exception in most lodging facility pools.

"We started using robotic cleaners three years ago when regulations changed and we could no longer use our suction-side cleaning system due to the potential risk of entrapment," (Author's note: Suction and Pressure side socalled "automatic swimming pool cleaners" are designed and almost universally used for residential pools) says Sutherland, whose facility is open 16 hours a day, 364 days a year. "Before we started using robotic cleaners, the 25 m pool was manually vacuumed three times per week, taking approximately two hours each time, and we didn't necessarily get every square inch of the pool either."By using a robotic pool cleaner, Sutherland feels like he has hired a worker who continually cleans the pool seven-to-eight hours every night without taking breaks. That said, robotic cleaners are programmable to run any length of time and most aquatic facility operators leave the unit in the pool to operate overnight. Once it has completed its cleaning cycle, the unit should be removed from the pool, drained, and stored for the next day's use.

According to Richard Deakin, commercial project manager at

Hollandia Pools in Toronto, most of his customers have started to incorporate the use of robotic cleaners into their regular maintenance as well. "Our customers tend to be those who are proactively working to ensure the highest water and air quality at their facilities—above and beyond what is dictated by the board of health,

says Deakin. "Robotic cleaners are just another tool to ensure the cleanest pool possible using today's technology, in addition to ultraviolet (UV) light, chemical controllers, etc."

Another benefit of robotic cleaners is that at times, commercial pools can become so dirty that they require more than one full cleaning; therefore, a nice feature to look for in a robotic cleaner is a 'time delay' option which allows the user to set the cleaner to start again, three to five hours after completing the first cleaning. This allows any dirt that has been lifted to settle back down to the pool floor to be picked up on the second pass.

"The robotic cleaner has become central to our entire system of cleaning," says Sutherland who owns two units just in case one fails for any particular reason. "A robotic cleaner is a piece of equipment just like any other which needs belts, cords, and other parts that may need to be changed and/or repaired. We can no longer survive a day without our robotic cleaner, so having a backup unit allows us to always be prepared."

On another note, by eliminating the time-consuming task of manually cleaning the pool, a robotic pool cleaner can provide a service professional with additional time to work on other aspects involved in maintaining an aquatic facility. "We have gained six-plus hours for pool maintenance which I have redirected to have our staff clean the change rooms at our facility," says Sutherland. "We understand that first impressions are important and we want to be sure our customers always come into a clean change room every morning. "Further, staff can now also focus on water chemistry, pool safety checks, and general interaction with customers. Plus, the cleaner the pool is keeps customers happier and healthier."

Avoiding Dead Zones by selecting the right pump

Proper pump selection and optimal flow rates are extremely important to ensure proper flow, avoiding "dead spots" in pools, especially in today's pools that often have multiple curves, inlets, grottos and vanishing edges. Pool professionals can also increase the

energy savings for their customers with properly sized pumps for the pool. This article focuses on how to choose the right size and speed pump for different pools. With a few tips and rules of thumb, proper pump select will result in better water flow while minimizing energy consumption.

Sizing

Affinity laws indicate the pow-

er demanded by a pump is proportional to the cube of the flow rate. For example, if the pump's flow rate is doubled, then its power demand is increased by a factor of eight. Therefore, it is important to utilize the smallest pump that is capable of completely turning over the pool water in an acceptable amount of time.

Furthermore, during the pump

selection phase, the facility's auxiliary features (e.g. spray pads, fountains and waterfalls) should also be considered, as it is common for them to use the pool's main pump. Some building codes, however, require the use of a multi-speed pump, or in some cases, a separate pump for each auxiliary pool load. Pumps on many pools are oversized by

design, sometimes more than 20 to 40 percent bigger than they need to be; this happens because many architects and engineers look at what is required, then pick the next size up to be sure the pump can handle the job.

Pump selection tips:

- 1. Determine flow rate in gallons per minute.
- 2. Calculate total dynamic head (TDH–the pressure head difference between the inlet and outlet of the pump) to account for friction loss. Adding 20 feet of head for a dirty filter is optional.
- 3. Refer to the pump's performance curve to select the preferred unit.
- 4. Locate the required horsepower of the pump by plotting GPM vs. TDH (if plotted point falls between two pump sizes, select the next larger pump size in terms of horsepower).
- 5. Do not oversize the pump. Choose the best pump available for the facility's flow rate requirements (i.e. do not install a 20-hp pump where a 10-hp pump will suffice just because that is all that is available). If the preferred pump does not provide a proper fit, consider a different pump model.
- 6. Verify the selected filter can handle the system's flow rate and be sure the minimum backwash flow rates can be achieved.

Avoiding dead zones

There are two solid ways to make sure a swimming pool is designed and circulated to eliminate 'dead zones' of circulation in today's swimming pools, which are often designed with multiple

Building Standards Commission will be developing permanent regulations over the next 180 days, and the CPSA will be working to ensure that swimming pools and standalone spas are not included in the definition of "water feature" that includes decorative ponds and fountains. As it currently stands, to put in a new pool in a backyard would require an enormous amount of drought friendly landscaping to counterbalance it, even if the pool is surrounded by a large amount of hardscape. Putting in a family friendly backyard with a small patch of lawn would be impossible.

The CPSA put through legislation in 2010 when the MWELO was being developed to ensure that pools and spas were not included in the definition of water feature. However since the MWELO was not being enforced at the time nothing happened with it and it was not changed to reflect the true water usage of pools and spas. Hopefully that legislation can provide the basis for requiring that the MWELO account for hardscapes and pool covers, but that is far from certain. The CPSA will be working with the Department of Water Resources and the Building Standard Commission over the next 180 as the permanent regulations are developed, with more information to follow as the process moves along.

insets, curves, grottos, water fountains and slides.

Properly balanced plumbing: One of the most important parts of a well-balanced circulated pool is having a hydraulically sound plumbing layout throughout the both the suction and return sides of the system. Taking larger pipe sizes to the pool and then breaking them down to smaller sizes in balanced way around the pool will ensure that you have proper circulation throughout the entire body of water and don't leave any dead spots in the pool.

Proper placement and directions of return lines: When bringing water back to the pool after it passes through the filtration system, the whole key is to make sure it goes back to the pool completely and as evenly distributed as possible. Once again, the importance of balancing your piping around the pool and location of the returns will help to make sure that all areas of the pool are circulating water. Many contractors today will align the return lines throughout the pool so the water is returned in a circular motion around the pool and designed in a way that as the circulation around the pool is complete the water is also passed by skimmers in a strategic fashion to aide in cleaning the surface, as well as distributing the water. One suggestion is to cap the end of the return line plumbing to increase the performance of those returns that are furthest away in your plumbing layout. This will ensure that all areas are getting proper circulation around all spots of the pool.

In larger pools, it often makes sense to divide the plumbing and pumps into three sections, each with their own pump system. In this way, each section of the pool is its own "zone" and the equipment and plumbing is set up for each zone. For example, in a 20x40 pool with a grotto with cascading water fall and a slide with its own water system in the deep end and a sundeck with fountain and cuddle cove/play area/reverse radius section in the shallow end, you would divide the shallow end area of the first 10 feet into one zone, the mid-section of 15+ feet into a second zone, and the deep end area, or last 15 feet, into a third zone with pumps and plumbing sized accordingly.

Speed

Historically, pool pumps with induction motors, which operate at only one or two speeds, have drawn more energy than is required to circulate pool water. These units must constantly operate at high speed to perform their most demanding jobs, such as running a waterfall or pool cleaner. However, it takes far less power to simply keep the pool water filtered—a difference single-speed pumps cannot address.

Variable speed pumps, on the other hand, are able be programmed to operate at set speeds to deliver the correct flow rate for each task they perform. This allows the pool's pump to reduce energy consumption and ultimately reduce operating costs. Variable speed pumps can also be programmed to achieve turnover times of exactly six hours, even if the filter is dirty. This allows motor speed, power and energy to be reduced during times when the filters are clean, instead of sizing the pump to assume worst-case

operating conditions.

Some VSPs have built-in constant-flow software, which maximizes the advantages these pumps have, as it will automatically adjust its speed to deliver the required flow rate for each programmed task. For instance, if an arcing laminar water feature requires 40 gpm to produce a smooth 6-foot arc of water, the pump will automatically ramp up its speed when it senses resistance in the circulation system (e.g. as the filter accumulates dirt) to continually provide the proper flow rate. With other pump types, the water feature will gradually throw a shorter arc of water as the filter gets dirtier.

No matter what type of pump is being used, however, slower pump speeds save energy. Slower speeds also dramatically reduce noise levels and wear and tear on the other pool equipment the water flows through.


