California Capitol Report

Water savings and outlook

The last few days and weeks have brought California a lot of news about the state of our water this year, and on the face of things a lot of it doesn't seem to add up. Following a very wet December in which the state received 6 inches of rain, a drastic change from the .5 inches that we got in December of 2013, it seemed that we were finally on the right path towards coming out of the drought. That hope was derailed however by a January with record-setting dryness, with rainfall numbers so bad that many parts of the state received no rain whatsoever for the entire month. These numbers, along with the fact that the Sierra snowpack that normally provides around 30% of California's water is at less than 30% of normal for this time of the year, virtually guarantee that the state will have to suffer through a fourth year of drought.

However, it's not all bad news. A report from the State Water Resources Control Board has announced that in December Californians not only met but exceeded the call from Governor Jerry Brown to cut their water usage by 20%. The SWRCB stated that urban water conservation statewide was at 22% for the month of December, and while it is generally agreed that this success was aided by the high rainfall totals during that month it is still a positive sign that conservation measures put in place throughout the state are working. Felicia Marcus, the chair of the board, stated that she was "going to take it all as good news," and went on to state that these numbers show the ongoing importance of prudent water conserva-



tion even when rain makes it feel like there is no longer a pressing need to cut back.

The most drastic improvement in conservation came from Southern California, where the savings jumped from only 3% in November to 23% in December. Large savings also came from big cities and areas that generally use a greater volume of water, while communities that were already more water efficient per person saw smaller savings. In terms of per-capita water usage, consumption is down by half to 67 gallons per day, a huge drop from the 140 gallons per day that Californians were using in June. While water use is traditionally lower in the winter, the remarkable savings this December were a break from the norm and were quite an accomplishment for the state. These big savings in areas that traditionally consume large amounts of water illustrate just how important outdoor water conservation really is, as the rains in December removed the need for irrigation.

All of this data plays a major role in the crucial decisions that are to be made by the SWRCB regarding the emergency mandatory limits on water usage that were put into place last year which are set to expire this April. The board hosted a meeting and public workshop discussing these restrictions on February 18th and 19th, a meeting that saw hundreds of members of the public putting in their comments and opinions on the effects of water restrictions in the state. The board is set to vote on whether or not to extend the restrictions on March 3rd.


Mark Cyr awarded 2015 Terry Cowles Memorial Award






After a brief rehab from college schooling, he moved from Boston, MA to San Jose, CA and was employed at Siemens before accepting a job in the public sector.

His wife Tina and daughter Isabelle (15) come to all of the BORD meetings and "take on fun adventures while I'm in the meetings"



association management software and a new website to be launched in 2015



Answers to recent questions asked to IPSSA's insurance broker

This month's question was submitted by a member in Orange County, California

Question:

I was involved in a serious truck accident last month and there are three witnesses that claim I went through a red light and hit a car. That car in turn was pushed into a semi-truck. I wasn't seriously hurt, but passengers in the car were taken to the hospital. The car and semi-truck both have extensive damage. I currently buy auto liability limits of \$25,000/\$50,000/\$10,000 and I'm concerned that this isn't enough coverage to pay the damages if I am determined to be at fault. Is there any available cover-

age I can now buy that will cover me if I'm sued over this accident?

Answer:

The insurance coverage limits you mention provide for a payment of up to \$25,000 for injury to any one person with a maximum payout of \$50,000 to all people for bodily injury. Your policy also covers up to \$10,000 for damage to cars or trucks owned by others. These limits are quite low considering possible medical/hospital expenses as well as any loss of wage claims that could be made by persons you injure. Your property damage limit of only \$10,000 is also very low. Just look around at the number of cars whose value exceed this limit and we recommend that our clients carry much higher liability limits than you presently have. Many of our pool service clients, in fact, have a limit of \$1,000,000 or more for bodily injury and property damage claims.

You won't find any policy that will cover you retroactively for an accident that occurred last month and I'd consult with a lawyer regarding your options given the likelihood that the damages exceed your insurance limits. Going forward, I recommend increasing the liability limits on your truck and automobile insurance policies. While it won't provide any assistance for any previous accidents, you will be far better protected in the event of another incident.





Urban water conservation drops from 22 percent to near 9 percent in January

Additional mandatory conservation measures to be considered March 17

As California enters a fourth year of drought, the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) announced a steep decline in water conservation during the month of January, considered the driest January since meteorological records have been kept. Additionally, per capita water use inched up in January as compared to December 2014.

In the most recent statewide survey of nearly 400 urban water retailers, the amount of water conserved by the state's large water agency customers declined from 22 percent in December 2014 to approximately 8.8 percent in January in year-over-year water use comparisons. January followed a very wet December 2014, which reduced the need for outdoor water use and likely contributed to the high conservation rate in December.

"Today's announcement is a disappointment, but not a surprise considering how dry January was," said State Water Board Chair Felicia Marcus. "Clearly state residents used their outdoor irrigation in January, which appears to account for the decline in water conservation. At a time when communities are running out of water, fields continue to remain fallowed for a second year, and fish and wildlife are suffering, the prospect that this year will be worse than last year is very real. Urban water users must cut back more - to extend their own supplies and to allow for flexibility in the system. Whether in self-interest or community spirit, conservation is by far the smartest and most cost effective way to deal with this difficult drought."

On March 17, the State Water Board will discuss renewing an emergency regulation supporting water conservation originally adopted in July 2014, which restricts outdoor water use and authorizes penalties for water waste. The emergency regulation must be renewed before April 25. Water board members today directed staff to offer additional measures intended to increase conservation statewide.

On Tuesday, board members discussed the importance of the State Water Board having measures in place for 2015 to assist water districts, and their customers, in making sure water conservation remains a priority statewide.

"We are in an extremely serious situation. We can and must do better conserving our water during 2015 because there's just no guarantee this horrendous drought will end anytime soon," Marcus said. "If 2015, and then 2016 continue to be dry, we will look back on today, and this month, let alone the last year, wishing we'd saved more water now. This board is prepared to make some tough decisions in the coming months, including adopting permanent, rather than emergency water conservation measures, going forward. It is that serious.'

Water conservation efforts decline

Year-over-year monthly residential water savings declined statewide to 8.8 percent in January, down more than 60 percent from December 2014. Broken down by hydrologic region, the results show that some parts of the state saved much less water in January than in any month since reporting requirements began. A few hydrologic regions sustained significant water conservation rates in January.



FPSIE News

With energy-efficiency legislation looming in all fifty United States and the thirteen Canadian Provinces, FPSIE is preparing for the monumental task of educating the pool-and-spa industry workforce how to sell, install, program, and service the energy-efficient products required by that legislation. With over 20 million swimming pools that will be targeted for energy-efficient upgrades because of the coming legislation, FPSIE envisions a huge demand arising for trained personnel in all facets of our industry (service, retail, distribution, manufacturing, and more) to service that demand. FPSIE is preparing to meet that demand by upgrading its information technology (IT) capability to the capacity necessary to accommodate streaming video, where presentations at the FPSIE Education Center in Sacramento can be streamed out to




remote classrooms throughout the U.S. and Canada. FPSIE's board of directors has developed a \$100,000 budget for this IT infrastructure upgrade project, which is expected to be accomplished in 2015.

Following development of the Certified Aquatic Equipment Installer (CAEI) training course by the Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) in 2013 and its contracting with FPSIE to present that course to contractors throughout its service territory, to date over 1,000 contractors have been certified, and PG&E has paid rebates to contractors for more than 5,000 variable speed pump (VSP) installations. Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), PG&E, Southern California Edison (SCE) and Los Angeles Department of Water & Power (LADWP) are all now requiring the CAEI training to be completed by contractors participating in their rebate programs. The successes FPSIE has achieved in its work with California's electric utilities has generated enormous increases in sales of energy-efficient products, especially VSPs (because of utility company VSP rebate programs) in California. Because of these sales increases, more and more of the industry's "movers-and-shakers" (Hayward, Pentair, Speck Pumps, Zodiac and others) now support FPSIE's efforts. With additional states adopting California-like, energy-efficiency regulations, with support from the industry, FPSIE can replicate its California successes in other states and Canada. To accomplish this, a "train-the-trainer" school needs to be developed to train sufficient contractors in those areas. IT capacity also needs to be upgraded. FPSIE personnel have begun this mission by establishing a \$100,000 budget and are now on a mission to raise those funds. Chem Quip, Inc., a Northern California four-branch distributor, has graciously become the first industry donor to contribute towards this cause. Chem Quip President, Greg Durkee, said when presenting the donation to FPSIE: "Customer Service at Chem Quip is a huge lineitem expense, training customer service personnel to enable them to adequately service our customers is a significant portion of that expense. We have found that our more industry-savvy customers require much less time of our customer service representatives. So, we have come to depend on FPSIE to do that training; our customer service personnel regularly attend FPSIE classes and refer customers to FPSIE for training. So when FPSIE approached us about its need for additional training capabilities, we decided to reward it for its ten years of service to us and the pool/spa industry, with our contribution to provide seed money towards funding for that need. We encourage everyone in the pool/spa industry to join us in supporting FPSIE in this effort. They have proved to be good stewards of their sponsors' money; they accomplish much - on a tiny budget."

However, from June to January 2014, more than 146 billion gallons of water have been saved compared with the same period in 2013 – enough to supply 1.96 million California residents for a year.

The decline in water conservation by two of the most populated regions in the state did impact the statewide average for January. The South Coast hydrologic region decline, with 9.2 percent savings for January compared to 23.3 percent for December, had an impact on the state average because 56 percent of all the residential water customers statewide are in the South Coast hydrologic region. Representing approximately 20 percent of all residential water customers statewide, the San Francisco Bay Area hydrologic region decline — 3.7 percent savings for January compared to 21.6 percent for December — definitely impacted the statewide aver-

The report also found that in January, 95 percent of water agencies reporting had instituted outdoor water use restrictions. Outdoor water use restrictions are a key requirement for urban water suppliers under the Emergency Water Conservation Regulation, because outdoor watering accounts for as much as 80 percent of urban water use in some areas.

Per capita daily water use rises slightly

In addition to the January conservation data, the State Water Board also reported residential gallons per-capita per day (R-GPCD) for January. The report estimates daily water use by residential customers for nearly 400 urban water agencies statewide.

The statewide R-GPCD average for January was 72.6 gallons per person, a slight increase from December 2014 when the statewide average was 67.2 gallons per person, per day. State Water Board staff continues to study this trend in an effort to understand what is driving the reduction in water use in some hydrologic regions, but not in others

The water use reports are a requirement of the Emergency Water Conservation Regulation adopted by the State Water Board in July 2014 and are provided to the Board monthly by urban water suppliers, along with total water conservation for each month.

According to the R-GPCD data, water use varies widely by hydrologic region and showed consistent declines in water use during this fourth month of reporting. At the low end, the San Francisco Bay hydrologic region averaged 56.3 gallons per person, per day. On the high end, the Colorado River hy-

Background

In his Jan. 17, 2014, Emergency Drought Proclamation, Gov. Jerry Brown called for Californians to voluntarily reduce their water use by 20 percent. The trend of increasing reductions and specific local data shows that many California communities have met and even exceeded the call to conserve. However, more can and must be done to protect water supplies should the drought persist. Current forecasts indicate that Californians cannot count upon a wet winter to end the drought.

The Emergency Water Conservation Regulation will be in effect until April 25, 2015, and will likely be extended if drought conditions persist. The State Water Board will closely monitor the implementation of the regulations and the weather over the coming months to determine if further restrictions are need-

During 2014, the State Water Board took action to increase access to recycled water in an effort to augment scarce water supplies. Water recycling is the use of treated municipal wastewater for beneficial purposes, such as agricultural and landscape irrigation, industrial processes and replenishing groundwater basins. In March 2014, the


Board approved new low-interest financing terms for water recycling projects to help California produce an additional 150,000 acre-feet of recycled water annually. The effort makes \$800 million available for projects such as recycled water treatment and distribution and storage facilities that can be completed by 2017. In June 2014, the Board adopted a general order that makes it easier for communities to use non-potable recycled water for agriculture, landscape and golf course irrigation and other uses. During the year, various regional boards took action to approve the use of recycled water for local projects under their jurisdiction.

As part of its efforts to build on conservation gains statewide, on Feb. 17 State Water Board members heard presentations by staff on ideas presented at a Dec. 17, 2014 water conservation workshop in Los Angeles. Multiple topics were addressed and actions were identified that could be implemented by the State Water Board to sustain and possibly improve water conservation efforts during 2015. The staff has been asked to bring the ideas to the March 17 Board meeting when the State Water Board is expected to decide to renew the emergency water conservation regulation, and discuss strengthening water conservation measures.

Bleach is used to create a chlorine solution which kills Ebola germs and is used extensively in Ebola treatment from hand washing, to cleaning medical instruments, cleaning health facilities, and hazmat suits for doctors and nurses treating patients. Washing hands and arms in a chlorine solution is required for entering any public building or office in Liberia, and used in every step of treating an Ebola patient.

"The Hasa team is proud to contribute to PCI's fight against Ebola," said Rory Manley, President of Hasa Inc. "This human tragedy that threatens Liberia and other African countries also has global implications and is a battle that cannot be lost. Here in the U.S. we take for granted the simplest things like bleach which affords us clean drinking water and prevents the spread of disease

in so many ways. We gladly share this basic resource and hope that it will improve sanitary conditions in Liberia."

Maersk is generously donating the shipment of the bleach to Liberia through its port in Houston. The bleach is expected to arrive in Liberia later this month.

Since the beginning of the Ebola outbreak, PCI has reached more than 140,000 Liberians through community mobilization and awareness-raising efforts as part of its Food for Peace program funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). PCI is also constructing ten Community Care Centers in two counties, training Liberian health workers on preventing and treating Ebola, and providing medical and personal protective equipment to health care workers.


