California Capitol Report

Pool industry cannot back down

54 new swimming pools and family backyards were saved last week when the Laguna Beach City Council voted unanimously to overturn the moratorium on issuing new permits for swimming pools, spas and hot tubs as initially passed at the July 14th Council meeting. Also saved were the jobs of numerous contractors and sub-contractors, permit fees and new property taxes that go along with such home improvements!

This was a big deal. CPSA had been working with city staff since the day after the City Council voted without any public notice or industry involvement to impose such a moratorium. Clearly this was, at best for the city, an opportunity to research this topic and make an informed decision. At worst, it was a kneejerk reaction that we have observed from numerous cities and water districts. However, once the facts are highlighted, bans on new permits for pools, spas and hot tubs and prohibitions on using public water to fill new pools are



very hard to justify.

The problem is that getting the facts before policy makers and the public is hard work and expensive, especially given media costs in California and the current environment where drought-shaming seems to be prevalent. That is what makes this success all the sweeter. Over the past 20 months CPSA has been working with state leaders, water districts and cities throughout California as well as the media to share the facts about water use by swimming pools, spas and hot tubs. Compared to turf farmers and almond growers, we have been wildly successful. CPSA has had over 70 newspaper articles posted and have participated in an untold number of radio and television stories relative to various proposed water use restrictions. We have had editorials posted in the Orange County Register, Los Angeles Times and have even been highlighted in National Geographic just to mention a few.



Cal Poly/NPIRC research claims proved false


The conclusions from research performed at California Polytechnic State University at San Luis Obispo ("Cal Poly"), that are relied upon by the NPC to claim that "aggressive water conditions" cause the plaster

defect called "spot etching" ("etching deterioration", "spot alteration") are false. Starting in September, 2004 the NPC and its Cal Poly researcher, Dr. Damien Kachlakev, (incorrectly) claimed that Phase One and Phase Two of the Cal Poly research conclusively proved that water chemistry, and not plaster workmanship, caused the surface defect.

Marcelle Dibrell, a pHD chemist and owner of the Service Industry News, recently reviewed the NPC's Cal Poly/NPIRC Phase Two research and determined that its published conclusions were false. Dr. Dibrell recalculated all research readings and was able to easily determine that the data generated in the research did not prove that aggressive water chemistry caused the spotting problem as the NPC and Cal Poly have claimed. In fact, the actual data served to exonerate "aggressive water chemistry" as the problem occurred in balanced and scaling water conditions as well. Dr. Dibrell was surprised and underwhelmed by the overall quality of the research performed at Cal Poly. Dr. Dibrell published her findings in the July 31, 2015 edition of the Service Industry News.

Similar Phase One conclusions were actually invalidated by the Cal Poly professor himself, six months after he claimed to the swimming pool industry that Phase One proved water chemistry was the primary cause of "spot

This month's question comes from a member in Nevada.

Question:

I've been contacted by prospective service customer in a high-end golf course community. The property is adjacent to an open desert and the rear of the property has an iron railing. When I met with the property manager he advised me that wild bobcats frequently use the property as their private oasis. He then showed me a recent photo of 7 bobcats lounging on the artificial turf next to a reflecting pool. Am I assuming any extra liability if I accept this account with this knowledge the bobcats?

Answers to recent questions asked to IPSSA's insurance broker

Answer:

In over thirty years I thought I had heard all the possible pool service related questions, but this is a first. I don't see any additional liability exposure related to the wild animals, with the possible exception of animal waste that may be contaminating the water. Given your knowledge of that possibility, you probably want to periodically test for coliform bacteria and check for the presence of e-Coli. My bigger concern, however, is for your safety. The fact that IPSSA members participating in the group insurance program have \$5,000 coverage for medical expenses incurred by accidents on the customer's job site wouldn't be a factor in my decision to take or reject this job.

etching". In April of 2005, Dr. Kachlakev presented a report on the Phase One research to the International Cement Microscopy Association, (ICMA) at their annual conference in Victoria, British Columbia. In this report, Dr. Kachlakev issued the following conclusion: "While the observations from this study are useful in showing different stages and mechanisms of SA (spot alteration) in pools, they do not link (spot etching) to a specific set of construction practices or water chemistry conditions." This conclusion made to cement scientists completely contradicted the conclusions Dr. Kachlakev gave the swimming pool industry. However, neither Dr. Kachlakev or the NPC ever advised the swimming pool industry of this consequential change of conclusion. In fact, both continued to claim to the swimming pool industry that Phase One HAD proved aggressive water caused spotting!

Many IPSSAN readers are aware of the "plaster controversy" which pits the NPC's aggressive water attack claim (and the Cal Poly research) against the onBalance claim that plaster workmanship issues actually cause the spotting problem. onBalance's position is supported by many independent cement laboratories analyses of spotted plaster that have consistently concluded the problem is caused by the use and abuse of calcium chloride admixtures, excessive hard troweling of the surface, and applying water to the surface or troweling tools during plaster installation.

The IPSSA organization donated funds to the NPC and the Cal Poly research. The San Fernando Valley Chapter of IPSSA, and Region 7, have donated funds to the onBalance research efforts. Four prominent cement laboratories, the RJ Lee Group, Construction Technologies Laboratory (CTL), Wiss, Janney and Associates, and RiverBend Petrography have all concluded that spotting is caused by plaster error, and not water chemical conditions. The NPC has never attempted to address or refute the conclusions of the laboratories or their scientists. The NPC relied solely upon its Cal Poly conclusions to shift blame from workmanship to water chemistrv.

Customers want to feel important. Each client wants to feel he or she is the center of your universe – even if it's only for a few moments and only because the client is paying for your skills, expertise, and/or time. In dealing with homeowners, that's an especially important message to convey because – other than plumbing or electrical work – most home services are truly optional. We're invited to provide pool services

every week and there are countless opportunities to shine in our customer's eyes. Here are six of the best ways I've found in my pool route servicing days to keep happy – returning – customers:

1) Respond to customer outreach within 24-48 hours. The biggest way to lose a prospect or existing client is to fail to return phone call or emails in a timely








Understanding ORP, sanitization and how controllers work

Correct water balance in commercial pools and spas is the difference in having a safe and attractive pool and a disaster. Advances in chemical automation, development of new methods of disinfection and better education on the problems associated with water chemistry have made the aquatics facility manager's job easier while providing safer water to the

Swimming PoolORP/pH controllers have been around since the mid 1970's but were very large and expensive so typically were found only in municipalities. The greatest innovations came in the early 90's when controllers became powered by microprocessors instead of analog technology. The introduction of the two-pool controller with modem communications became an extremely powerful tool which allowed an operator to monitor and control pool water remotely as well as send information to a pager.

Remote communications has made it possible to become proactive in swimming pool and spa management. Whenever water chemistry falls below the threshold established, a message is sent to a pager or cell phone so pool

operators can login to the controller to diagnose and correct the problem before the problem becomes a health issue. Chemical automation using direct connections from microprocessor based programmable controllers to a wireless internet database management system provides the aquatic facility manager "real time" information regarding his water chemistry. Programmable controllers have now become the reporting media transferring information from the aquatic facility to a "readily accessible" record of the pools current and past status. This offers the aquatics facility manager better monitoring and control of the chemical balance in the aquatic facility with more accuracy than at any time in the past. A new age of management and control of commercial pools is at hand.

In 1996, hospitality service provider Ecolab began to roll out their Aqua Balance program on a nationwide basis providing a large number of hotels, resorts, schools, health clubs and cruise ships with chemical controllers as part of a chemical service program and brought the use of chemical controllers into the mainstream.

However despite the fact that controllers are now commonplace on commercial swimming pools,

users do not often fully understand how ORP works. ORP is a qualitative measurement, not a quantitative measurement and is affected by many factors including the biggest variables in swimming pool water chemistry, pH, cyanuric acid and now salt.

Health departments require a specific range of chemical residuals which leads people to look at ORP and PPM charts to establish a chlorine residual that is acceptable to their local health authority. This situation confuses pool operators. Oftentimes, pool water is in compliance with PPM, pH and cyanuric acid yet have unacceptably low ORP in the water to effectively oxidize and sanitize the water. Conversely, there are often pools and spas that are well below the required PPM levels but have exceptional water quality.

ORP & PPM

(Oxidation-Reduction Potential & Parts Per Million)

The misunderstanding between ORP & PPM has been going on since ORP controllers have been used on swimming pools and spas. If properly understood, pools can be run very efficiently with an ORP controller. For many operators, water chemistry is a small part of their job and the health department wants water with a specific PPM range. Controller manufacturing companies have ventured into utilizing sensors that measure PPM or quantity of chlorine to help solve the problem.

Most controllers will measure the levels of sanitizer and pH in a body of water. The three MOST POPULAR measures of sanitizer available through chemical automation are ORP, Amperometric PPM, and Colormetric PPM. Understanding the basis of each measure can assist pool operators



in managing their pools.

ORP—Oxidation-Reduction Potential. ORP is a measure of the oxidizing properties of any sanitizer present in the body of water. Most controllers will use a bypass system, taking a small sample of water out of the plumbing, and directing it to a small container

that houses the sensors. An ORP sensor contains two electrodes, generally a platinum electrode in contact with the water and a reference electrode inside an electrolyte chamber. The electrodes are separated from the electrolyte solution by a membrane. This membrane prevents the loss of the electrolyte

solution, and prevents contaminants from entering the sensor. The sensor acts like a small battery. The output from the sensor is a voltage, typically expressed as milli-volts. ORP measures the waters' ability to oxidize and is therefore dependent on pH when the primary sanitizer is Chlorine. Cyanuric acid levels can affect the readings taken by an ORP sensor. Salt systems can also affect ORP Sensors; often-special metals must be used for the electrodes in order to prevent build up on the sensor. ORP is probably the most common method used by chemical controllers to measure sanitizer level, and the most inexpensive type of system to buy. However, under-

standing that the measurement is the waters ability to oxidize rather than the actual amount of sanitizer can be misleading for the novice. Some controllers calculate the actual Chlorine concentration based on the ORP, pH, and temperature measurements. The important thing to remember is that the ORP sensor doesn't measure anything specific; it will not differentiate between ozone and bromine.


Amperometric PPM—PPM measures the total amount of sanitizer in the system. Like ORP an Amperometric PPM measurement is taken by a sensor: consisting of copper and a platinum or gold element. These sensors are housed in a small chamber, usually located on a bypass from the main plumbing of the equipment set. A liquid

sample is delivered to the annular space between the two fixed electrodes in the sensing cell. A small amount of potential is applied to the working electrode, made of gold wire and the counter electrode, made of silver. An electrical current is generated by the reduction of HOCL and/ or OCL- at the gold electrode. Using a gold and silver electrode, the process consumes the electrons from the oxidation of the silver electrode, creating a small amount of electrical current. This charge is in direct linear proportion to the amount of residual chlorine present in the sample. This charge is sent from the sensors to the controller. The electrical voltage is measured, and converted to parts per million. The



Avoid draining the pool water, whenever possible.

With the help of chlorine and by shocking the pool, we can usually sanitize the existing water, no matter how dirty it is. Service pros will test the water again after shocking it to ensure it is clean and safe.

Use a cartridge filter.

Cartridge filters use less than 25% of the water needed to backwash a sand or DE pool filter.

Fix leaks.

Sometimes leaks can occur in the skimmers, pool liner or around the filter pump. Service technicians can check all of these locations to ensure no leakage, and if any are found can replace this equipment with the manufacturer's genuine pool parts to ensure proper performance.

Use automation to control pool functions at off-peak hours.

tion system, such as iAquaLink 2.0. residual value is displayed on the digital indicator in mg/l (PPM).

PPM— is probably the easiest measurement for end users to understand. The system is easy to set up and maintain. As long as the pH and the flow are relatively stable, the Amperometric PPM measurement is accurate. The Amperometric sensor is also affected by pH, Cyanuric acid, and salt systems, but the effect is less than on the ORP measurement because of the linear relationship of the sensor. Amperometric measurements also require flow to operate, when there is no flow the oxidizer is soon consumed by the measurement leaving none left to measure.

Selective Membrane PPM provides direct readings of Free Chlorine in water. These are true readings of Free Chlorine and not indirect values derived from ORP. An advantage of the PPM sensor is that it's not affected by cyanuric acid (CYA) and MPS, thereby

assuring constant readings of Free Chlorine et all times. Colormetric PPM— measures sanitizer level in parts per million, however it takes measurements in a very different way. The term Colorimetric is used to describe a system of measurement where reaction based chemical indicators are used to detect the presence of a specified chemical. The indicator reacts with the specified chemical and produces a visible color change in the solution. The stronger the color of the solution, the more compound is in the solution. DPD Test kits, an example of colormetric measuring devices, are very familiar to those in the pool and spa industry. However, studies have shown that there can be significant differences in readings from these kits due to differences in color perception between individual users. However, when the eye that evaluates the test is automated, a DPD test becomes a very accurate measure. Essentially, a colormetric system is an automated hand check. The controller is programmed to test the chemical levels in the water at certain times or time intervals each day. When it is time to test, the controller sends a signal to the colormetric unit, which is separate from the controller. This signal starts the testing process. A test chamber is filled with water from the pool or spa. A beam of light goes through the test chamber and is detected on the other side to establish a base for the reading. Reagents are added and mixed with the sample. The beam of light is again measured and the difference between the amount of light received in the base reading and the reading with reagents is the measure of the amount of sanitizer. Colormetric systems are some of the most accurate automated sanitizer measuring systems available. They are also among the most expensive until recently, when we engineered a PPM/pH controller called the SmarterPool which sells in the same range as a low end ORP/pH controller. We also made a TrueDPD accessory which can be added to our other chemical controllers. The measurement is not affected by the presence of salt or cyanuric acid in the water. As there are no electrodes to corrode or gather build up, they also work wonderfully on salt systems. Colormetric sensors

also require flushing the sample to

waste, this can amount to 2-3 gallons of water per day.

Primary disinfection & pH control

Primary disinfection using sodium hypochlorite, calcium hypochlorite, bromine, di-chlor, trichlor or chlorine generation (salt systems) has always been a part of the automation of commercial pools and spas. However controllers now go beyond primary disinfection and pH control offering solutions for secondary disinfection, as recommended by the CDC's Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC).

Secondary disinfection support with controllers

More and more often the industry is now seeing the need for a secondary disinfection system as a backup to the primary system. Controllers now control, manage and support the use of backup sanitizing systems which is mandatory for salt water pools.

Enzymes & shock treatments with controllers

Some controllers can also be set up to add enzymes and shock treatments automatically. This treatment can be scheduled at a time and date when no bathers are in the pool and starts automatically. Be aware though that non chlorine shock will cause a temporary increase in ORP and a false DPD reading.

Using a DPD Colormetric Chlorine Measurement System a water test is automatically taken in a pre-programmed frequency as

often as every 15 minutes. Reagents are automatically mixed with a sample of pool water and optically read to determine total chlorine, free chlorine and combined chlorine levels. A true PPM reading is then transmitted thru the controller to the internet based data management system. The colorimetric system is connected directly to the controller providing a true PPM reading not subject to problems associated with PPM

Choosing the best controller for your aquatic facility

The type of measurement system selected for a chemical controller should take all of these factors into account. The cost of any controller is often a hurdle in the decision making process; ORP measurement will require the lowest investment but will not provide

chlorine concentrations as accurately as a colormetric system. The type of measurement system selected for a chemical controller should take all of these factors in to account. The cost of any controller is often a hurdle in the decision making process; ORP measurement will require the lowest investment, but will not give as accurate

chlorine concentrations compared with a colormetric system. Colormetric systems will require a higher initial investment, as well as the ongoing operational costs of reagents. Cost often becomes the focus of a decision making process; however it is more important to focus on the needs of the facility, and to then balance those needs with any monetary limitations. Most controllers will justify the initial expense with the savings in labor and longevity of equipment and surfaces. The type of measurement chosen should reflect the other equipment on the pool. ORP measurements are the most susceptible to outside effects, and are therefore less accurate; cyanuric acid, salt, temperature, and pH lev-

els all affect ORP measurements. Amperometric measurements have a small pH, temperature, and cyanuric effects, but are flow dependent. Colormetric measurements are the least susceptible. ORP will tell you how much of your sanitizer is available for use. Amperometric and selective membrane sensor measurements tell you how much sanitizer is in the water. A controller that measures both can help a pool operator to identify and solve issues when combined chlorine is present in the water. ORP, selective membrane and Amperometric PPM both use electrochemical detection, which offers several advantages simple instrumentation, ease of use, low cost and low power requirements. Colormetric units will use more water in their testing, and require minimal power.

Conclusion

Every commercial swimming pool and spa should have chemical automation for maximum comfort, safety and longevity of the surfaces and equipment. Utilizing ORP controllers is the most cost effective solution as long as the operator understands how ORP works, the swimming pool is indoors or the outdoor pool is using no more than 30 PPM cyanuric acid and it is understood that actual chlorine PPM levels will fluctuate when there is ORP control due to the variables affecting

Ideally, a facility will have ORP & PPM control which will help ensure that the PPM levels required by local health authorities will remain constant, while also measuring the true water quality.

In most instances we now have the media on our side which is invaluable

All of this work paid off again last week in Laguna Beach. CPSA provided the city staff with all of our materials relative to the facts about water use by swimming pools, spas and hot tubs: the economic impact report CPSA had commissioned by PK Data and numerous articles and research that supported our position that pools and spas are not water wasters. Our public relations firm, Miller Public Affairs, went to

work immediately after the moratorium was initially passed. In the few weeks prior to the City Council meeting that resulted in the repeal of the prohibition on August 4th, they were able to influence the Orange County Register to editorialize against the moratorium and publish an op-ed prepared for Alan Smith that appeared in several papers, and were instrumental in an article produced the day of the hearing by the Orange County Register highlighting this

CPSA had also organized local builders, Ceil Fraser and Alan Smith, to testify at the hearing with CPSA President John Norwood. We also had the advantage and luxury of approximately 20 residents that showed up in support of our position. Last week also marked the first time the

issue and the effect on local citi-

Association of Pool & Spa Professionals weighed in after having just recently agreed to hire a firm in Southern California to assist CPSA with making needed presentations before local public entities. This additional help assists CPSA with coverage in southern California which reduces our expenses, takes some pressure off local members that have been filling the void, and guarantees that we will have at least one person representing the industry at any city council or water district meeting. CPSA has and will continue working with city or water district staff who propose unwarranted restrictions and will provide them with factual materials as we utilize public relations personnel to build local media support for the industry position.

On average, CPSA has been receiving 5 notices per week that contain potential water use restrictions affecting swimming pools,

spas and hot tubs. We engage with each of these cities to assess the threat and then, where necessary, engage the process outlined above. In most cases we are winning the battles. Even where we have not won initially, we keep working, and just recently 5 cities have reversed their bans on filling new pools. It's becoming increasingly clear that the message is getting through. This week, we were alerted that the City of Yreka (population 7,700) is including a prohibition on the issuance of permits for pool construction during Stage 4 of the municipal code and Water Shortage Contingency plan. We were also tipped off that the City of Fort Bragg has a prohibition on filling swimming pools. As a result, we have begun engaging these policy makers.

Bottom line, this is hard work and it is expensive, which is why we need to keep working to expand the membership and financial support for CPSA. If you are reading this, CPSA is defending your job or business; please help spread the word. Here are some facts:

- 1. Swimming pools, spas and hot tubs are not water wasters. This fact has been confirmed by the state, numerous water districts and cities.
- 2. There are no state prohibitions on the use of public water to fill or refill pools or spas. This includes the Governor's Proclamations and State Water Resources Control Board regulations.
- 3. Approximately 13,000 new pools will be built in California during 2015. The amount of water it will take to fill these new pools is approximately 8/1000 of 1% of just the state's water used for urban purposes.
- 4. New swimming pools, spas and hot tubs use a tiny fraction of 1% of a city's or water district's annual water use. Generally a rounding error! This fact has caused several cities that enacted bans on filling new pools to reverse their actions and prevented others from taking any action relative to swimming pools and spas.
- 5. Once built, swimming pools use about the same amount of water through evaporation as the same size area planted in drought resistant landscaping. If the pool is covered when not in use, the pool will use 1/2 of the water that drought resistant landscape uses annually. Covered spas and hot tubs lose less than 5% of water due to evaporation as they are always covered to keep in the heat.
- 6. Bans on building new pools or prohibitions on filling new pools are highly discriminatory to this industry because they are not supported by the facts about water use by pools and spas and because there are no other water use restrictions in most city's water shortage contingency plans that shut down an industry.
- 7. The swimming pool, spa and hot tub industry supports the use of covers; turning off continuous flow automatic fill devises or replacing them with timed or weather based systems; use of water saving filters or other equipment; storing water in bladders, temporary pools or otherwise where possible when remodeling a pool or spa; and using new technology to clean chemicals and solid from pool water rather than dumping and refilling the pool.


