California Capitol Report

Challenges keep coming

John Norwood is president of The California Pool and Spa Association (formerly SPEC).

Challenges to the swimming pool, spa and hot tub industry just keep coming. The last two years were dominated by the drought and fighting off state and local restrictions on the use of public water to fill and refill swimming pools, spas and hot tubs. But just when we started feeling good about CPSA's many victories in these battles and early rain and snow started to look promising, reality set in.

On the water front, the State Water Quality Control Board has extended its water conservation mandates and a dry couple weeks in February has dampened enthusiasm that the historic drought may be coming to an end. CPSA continues to receive multiple notices each week that local cities and water districts are renewing their drought contingency restrictions for 2016. The good news is that public entities seem to be moving away from fill restrictions and permit bans for pools, spas, and hot tubs and centering their attention on covers as the primary

conservation restriction applicable to the industry.

Another big challenge facing the industry is that the California Energy Commission just opened a new procedure which proposes to update and improve energy efficiency standards for all pool pumps and motors under 5 horsepower. The current standard applies only to filtration pumps. The proposed rules would apply to all pumps and motors including cleaner, spa and water feature pumps. In addition to the focus on pool pumps, the Energy Commission is

REGION 3





REGION 8




After a brief rehab from college schooling, he moved from Boston, MA to San Jose, CA and was employed at Siemens before accepting a job in the public sector.

Region 12 includes the Dallas, Ft. Worth, Mid Cities DFW, Tarrant County and Waxahachie chapters.


REGION 11


Question:

A glass table on the pool deck was knocked over in the wind and a lot of broken glass went into the pool. The property manager initially refused to drain the pool, instead telling me to remove as much glass as possible with my pool vac. I advised him that I needed to drain and dry vacuum the pool and he eventually agreed, but insisted that his maintenance

staff would be responsible for removing the glass on the pool deck. I locked the pool gate but he wants the pool open tomorrow. Do you see any issues?

Answer:

You're in a tough spot as you will probably be blamed for injuries resulting from glass in the pool and on the deck. Do you want to take the chance that the maintenance staff will do the job properly? What if they inadvertently sweep some of the glass back into the pool? I'd at least do a visual inspection of the pool deck before opening the pool and, if necessary, vacuum or brush the pool deck. The time you spend will be worth the assurance that the pool and deck is safe for use.

Spring is right around the corner and it's time to start thinking about preparing your customers' pools for the swimming season. If the pool isn't in tip top shape when the outdoor temperatures start to rise, it won't be long until the water starts getting cloudy and algae starts to grow. It always seems to happen overnight, or so you might think. Whether you service their pool or not, here are a few things that will make the transition from winter to summer much easier.

As the pool water starts to warm up, the chlorine demand increases due to warmer weather, spring pollens, air borne algae spores and bather load. Balanced pH and total alkalinity will keep the chlorine active and prevent issues with the pool surface. Make sure these are always kept in balance and especially this time of year. Conduct a complete water test including cyanuric acid, calcium hardness, metals and phosphates. Issues with any one of these factors can create problems in the near future.

Maintaining a chlorine residual so the water is ready for increased seasonal demand is important with any chlorination process - manual or automatic. With automated chlorination, such as the increasingly popular salt chlorine generators, you'll need to check on not only the water but also the device. Make sure the salt chlorine generator is free of buildup on the blades. The unit may need to be cleaned by using an acid / water solution. That's four parts water to one part acid, always adding acid to water and not the other way around — for safety. Make sure the flow sensor is opening and closing with water flow. If not, replace the defective sensor with a new one. Also make sure to have the appropriate amount of salt in the pool to maximize chlorine generation. These simple steps will make the biggest difference in avoiding an algae bloom right at the beginning of the

Starting the season with a clean filter will also make a big difference in the quality of the water. Spring time is when you need the filter to be working at peak performance. Make sure to inspect the elements and manifold parts and replace any broken or worn parts.

The circulation pump basket should be cleaned and inspected. Cracked or broken baskets should be replaced as this will prevent debris from getting lodged in the impeller. You'll know that you're too late and debris has bypassed the basket if you see a low filter pressure reading. This low reading probably means water isn't getting into the filter effectively. Even though I like to preach saving energy with every opportunity, it may be necessary to temporarily increase the run time or pump speed, especially if the water starts to get cloudy. We don't want to compromise the quality of the water for a few cents in energy savings. Once the pollen stops flying and the season is stabilized, return back to energy saving mode.

While every pool will have a pump, filter and water to check on in the spring, it's also a good idea

to inspect any other equipment that may be in use – skimmers, heater, automation system, lights, cleaner,

In summary, preparation and prevention in the spring makes for a long and enjoyable swimming season all through to the fall.

Argument against the amendment: An affiliate membership is not needed therefore we do not need a description of this type of

Argument for the amendment: Allows each region more flexibility in electing a regional director.

From Eric and Jenel Resh, of The Smart! Company

Last month's *IPSSAN* published an "article" entitled Oreq Corp Wins Eric Resh Patent Infringement Lawsuit: The article apparently was prepared and submitted to the *IPSSAN* by Oreq, and in any case the article includes at least the following incorrect and/or misleading statements.

In the lawsuit, Oreq did not win a "sizable award in costs against Resh". Instead, Oreq admitted in court filings that, in a little over a year (from June 2013 through October 2014), Oreq spent \$660,000 on its own attorney fees. In the following year or so, from November 2014 through at least July 2015, Oreq spent additional money (potentially \$100,000 or more) in connection with Resh's appeal of the district court's decision. Thus, it is likely that Oreq spent more than \$750K defending the lawsuit and related appeal.

In contrast to the "sizeable"

amount of money that Oreq SPENT, the district court ordered that Resh, like all parties who do not prevail, simply pay minor court costs (approximately \$8,000 for depositions and approximately \$4,000 for documents and copying fees) totaling approximately \$12K.

We assume that IPSSAN readers will understand that \$12K is NOT "sizeable," especially since Oreq and the Hetzners had to pay \$750K to defend against Resh's patent.

In fact, Oreq and the Hetzners even asked the court to order Mr. Resh to pay their \$660K in attorney's fees. The court denied their request. In denying Oreq/Hetzner's request for reimbursement of their \$660K in attorney's fees, the court held that Oreq and the Hetzner's failed to demonstrate that Resh was not simply trying "to protect what he believed to be his intellectual property." In other words, the court held consistently with Mr. Resh's position (then and now) about protecting Resh's

patent rights. As noted below, Mr. Resh believed in his patent and continues to believe that his other patents, upon issuance, will be property rights that he intends to vigorously defend within the bounds of our legal system.


IPSSAN readers may realize that the Resh patent 5,473,786 that was central to the lawsuit was issued long ago, in 1995. That patent therefore expired during the lawsuit (near the end of 2014). After it expired, everyone was free to practice its teachings (since expired patents become part of the public domain). Accordingly, Oreq could have saved itself the aforementioned \$750K by simply waiting until the end of 2014 to copy Resh's design.

On a related point, IPSSAN

readers may realize that Mr. Resh's 5,473,786 leaf rake designs have become the standard for pool leaf nets, as is evident in the many new models that various manufacturers put on the market in recent months.

In passing, the Reshes believe that the courts did not rule properly in the lawsuit and appeal. Regardless, and as many readers may also know, Mr. Resh is continuing to innovate and bring improved tools and technology to our industry, and is pursuing several new patents for improved pool products that he has invented. Many readers may have seen or even used his patent pending Piranha Power Pole and/or Piranha II nets (the net has an even more complete smooth leading edge and distinctive black rim, and the telescoping pole has a click-lock mechanism to adjust its length and includes a distinctive red handle). The Reshes hope that the first of several patents on those pole and net inventions will issue in the next few months, and that those patents will provide them a basis for stopping any and all third parties (manufacturers, customers, distributors, etc.) from making, using, selling, offering to sell, or importing infringing products.

From the Reshes' perspective, if competitors infringe, litigation simply becomes the cost of doing business for patent holders, and while the Reshes welcome legitimate competition, they intend to vigorously pursue anyone whom they feel is infringing their intellectual property rights.



You're liable to need it

Why commercial pool service professionals need liability insurance

An increasing number of commercial pool owners are requiring any service profession who offers pool maintenance to carry liability insurance. As the exclusive insurance provider for the Independent Pool & Spa Service Association since 1981, Ray Arouesty, J.D., senior vice president of Arrow Insurance Service (a division of HUB International Insurance Services, Inc. in West Lake Village, Calif.), is a leading expert on liability insurance provisions and needs for pool professionals. He says he believes the increased frequency of this requirement goes back to the risk managers and insurance companies for property management firms recognizing the

risk involved with swimming pool maintenance.

"When you have issues like damage to the property or injuries, frequently there is a lawsuit filed," Arouesty says. "The lawsuit is probably going to be filed first against the property owner and that goes to the insurance company that insures the property. They send it out to their attorneys, who review the lawsuit and then file what's known as a cross-complaint to hold the culpable party responsible, which is typically the swimming pool service technician."

If the service tech is uninsured or doesn't have the funds to make good for the damage or injury claim, then the property owner will be held responsible. "That's why they want evidence of insurance when they hire a swimming pool service technician," Arouesty says. "Insurance is a key element in competency for doing a job."

In addition to being an insurance broker for 40 years, Arouesty obtained a California pool repair contractor's license in 1990 and has been an attorney for 25 years. He recognizes no standard insurance policy has the provisions that a service technician needs. "The closest thing to a standard policy for the swimming pool service industry is totally inadequate," he says. "A standard policy has so many exclusions for the common claims that the service technician faces that it doesn't give him a whole lot of coverage.

Arouesty recommends evaluating risk when looking for a policy, examining what you do each day in your job. Among the areas where he's seen a standard insurance policy fall short on are coverage for chemical damage, chemical exposure, mold damage caused by overfilling the pool — one of the most common errors Arouesty sees each year that results in a claim — repairs or remodeling. The definition of repairs or remodeling is often so vague that it's difficult to determine what is and is not covered.

Forgoing liability insurance could lose you more than a potential client; Arouesty explains that a liability policy could also save you from bankruptcy. Insurance primarily provides two distinct coverages, he says: monetary damages and defense coverage. On most policies, he says, legal defense coverage is unlimited. "In many cases, we see the cost of the legal defense exceeding the amount of damage done," he adds.

So, if there is a drowning and a lawsuit is filed that implicates the service tech, what does that mean if he doesn't have insurance? "He's going to have to pay for his own lawyer, and most technicians I know don't have the financial wherewithal to even get a retainer of \$25,000 for a defense lawyer," Arouesty says. "So he's looking at possible bankruptcy."

Service technicians are around chemicals, expensive equipment, adding water to pools, doing repairs, remodeling, and driving a truck with a bunch of chemicals. They need liability insurance to protect themselves more than anyone else, Arouesty says, "and they must examine what they do on the job to make sure everything is covered. Any policy has to address those hazards that are very, very common in the industry."

IPSSA Inc. has a matching grant fund of \$24,000 to assist individual regions and chapters for community involvement, safety programs, and promoting IPSSA to the public. - Matching grant requests must be submitted in writing to the regional director by December 1st each year.
- The regional director shall qualify the request to meet the spirit of the matching grant program.
- · The region must approve the grant by either a regional Board meet-

ing, regional Board teleconference, or e-mail ballot, and the results will be posted in the regional minutes.

• The regional director shall then request the funds from the IPSSA BORD president or chief financial officer without BORD approval, as long as the requested amount does not exceed the region's budgeted amount.





also proposing increased standards on portable spas, hot tubs, exercise spas, combination exercise/spas, and inflatable spas.

Last but not least, the California Legislature is back in session and last week was the bill introduction deadline for 2016. We are still reviewing the almost 2,000 newly introduced bills, but the proposed tax of services is back and we'll be on watch as several new bills on water conservation and urban water management plans that could affect the industry. There will no doubt will be an attempt to force a minimum wage bill to head off an initiative that would move the minimum wage in California to \$15 per hour statewide. There are also numerous bills aimed at wage and job discrimination, restrictions on obtaining certain types of information during the hiring process and bills targeting independent contractors and the sharing economy. CPSA will be reviewing all of these bills for possible impact on the swimming pool, spa and hot tub industry.
