The California Legislature returned to Sacramento from their summer recess on August 6 for the final few weeks of the 2018 legislative session. Pending bills must be sent to the Governor no later than August 31 at midnight. The Governor will then have 30 days to sign bills into law, veto them or let them become law without his signature.

The California Pool & Spa Association / The Pool Spa & Aquatics Alliance have numerous bills on its radar to work on in the final few weeks of the legislative session. Like most business groups, the great majority of bills CPSA is following are those that the association opposes or is trying to get amendments to get to a neutral position. These bills (see related article) generally make it more difficult for small businesses to operate in California. These include a number of bad labor and employment bills. However, CPSA has now joined a new



coalition of business organizations, including the state Chamber of Commerce, Employment Law Counsel, technology and construction industry associations, in support of legislation to halt the application of the California Supreme Court decision in Dynamex v. Superior Court.

In Dynamex, the Court drastically changed the rules on when a person can be legally classified as an independent contractor. This was an unexpected decision which has employers throughout California reeling to figure out how to comply. At least one court has held that the decision applies retroactively, and the Supreme Court has refused to weigh in differently. The point of the legislative effort to delay implementation of the decision is it is the

Recent BORD Action to Protect Member Rights and use of IPSSA Logo



The BORD took prompt action, recently, and issued a "cease and desist" letter to a contractor posing as an IPSSA member.

A Monterey Coast IPSSA member was recently under-bid by an individual who represented himself as an IPSSA member and advertised IPSSA membership on his business card. Our member

reported this to his chapter board, who then contacted IPSSA. After discovering that the individual had never been a member of IPSSA, the BORD contacted IPSSA legal counsel. Mark Alcorn, legal counsel, immediately issued the "cease and desist" letter, promising legal action within 20 days if the individual did not certify that he would discontinue his false advertising. The contractor subsequently signed the certification.

Unauthorized use of the IPSSA logo and false representation as a member are deceptive trade practices and are considered trademark infringements. Any legal actions taken are intended to protect an organization's assets and goodwill, and to recover potential statutory damages due to the infringement.



States Sue To Stop Formation of **Association Health Plans**

Last year President Trump

announced that the Department of Labor would begin establishing rules permitting the establishment of Association Health Insurance Plans. The announcement was met with enthusiasm by many groups, including IPSSA, who viewed the announcement as an opportunity to offer its members comprehensive health insurance coverage at reduced rates.

On July 26, 2018, however, the Attorney Generals for 11 states filed a lawsuit against the Department of Labor claiming that the new Association Health Plan regulations violate the Affordable Care Act, ERISA, and the Administrative Procedure Act. The states filing the suit include Massachusetts, New York, California, Washington, Oregon, Delaware, Kentucky, New Jersey, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia and the District of Columbia.

In the suit the Attorneys General claim that by allowing the formation of Association Health Insurance Plans the Department of Labor undermined the Affordable Care Act and threated states and the existing small group health insurance plans. They state that small employers should not be exempt from the requirements to participate under the regulations of the Affordable Health Care Act.

The lawsuit also states that the Department of Labor exceeded its authority and violated the Administrative Procedural Act and ERISA by unilaterally redefining the term "employee" to include business owners and sole

This is a blow to small business owners and the new development has put at least a temporary halt to our efforts to create a group association health insurance for IPSSA. Insurance carriers have indicated they will wait on the outcome of the lawsuit before considering any Association Health Insurance Plans.

We will monitor the developments in this lawsuit and keep you apprised of developments as they occur.

Answers to recent questions asked to IPSSA's insurance broker

This month's question is from a member in the San Fernando Valley Chapter

Question

I just received a phone call from the property manager at a motel telling me that a disgruntled guest poured a bottle of anti-freeze into the pool. They are asking me to handle it but I've never dealt with a situation like this before. Do you have any advice?

Answer:

Antifreeze in a pool is a first

for me, but I think you should handle it like any other contaminated water situation. First you should close the pool at once to avoid anyone from swimming in the pool. Adequate signage on the gates would be prudent as well. You may be tempted to immediately drain the pool, but I'd proceed with caution. Municipalities have very specific rules regarding draining pool water into the street or sewer and you may be prohibited to drain pool water contaminated with antifreeze. A violation could subject you to a fine or even criminal prosecution, neither of which are covered by general liability insurance policies.

Assuming you can drain the water you should refer to the label on the antifreeze bottle/MSDS

sheet for the recommended cleanup procedures. Consider contacting the manufacturer as well. You may need to pressure wash the plaster to remove any residue after draining. Don't forget to clean the filter and address the filter grids. You also need to consider that the liquid poured into the pool might not be anti-freeze despite the fact that it came from an antifreeze bottle. The only way to know for sure would be with lab testing - an expensive proposition.

Finally, since summer temperatures in your area exceed 100 degrees, it may not be the best time to drain a pool. An empty pool is at risk for plaster damage including cracking and delamination, so you should get a detailed waiver, release, and hold harmless

agreement from the pool owner. Keep in mind that you also are at risk if the customer challenges the validity or enforceability of the waiver form.

Maybe this is a job you want to decline, given the uncertainty of the chemical and the risk of damage to the pool shell. If so, advise the customer to contact a company that specializes in hazardous waste disposal. Don't forget to document your conversation in a certified letter to the property manager.

REMINDERS: Quick Tips & Tricks

September is one of the busy months of summer—when high-temperatures bring high-bather loads to swimming pools. To keep pools running smoothly, busy service professionals can benefit from remembering three simple rules of thumb: Test, Treat & Maintain.

TEST: Equipment Inspections Inspect all equipment before busy summer months. A pump or filter that fails in season, could

cause a shutdown. Be proactive and have extra pump motors and extra filter media (such as sand) on hand. Also be sure that all baskets and filters are clean and free of debris.

TREAT: Air & Water Quality Aquatic safety begins with water clarity -be sure the main drain is clearly visible from the pool deck. Allow time for seasonal shock treatments to remove bacteria. Install a UV unit (recommended by MAHC) as an extra layer of protection against E.Coli and Cryptosporidium. UV also improves air quality by removing odors caused by chloramines. Take the time to learn more about new, smaller, affordable units that are NSF approved—making them accessible to both residential and commercial pools! By installing a UV unit, you give your customers cleaner pool water and increase

your profits!

MAINTAIN: Control & Main-

tain water balance

Maintain proper water balance using an automatic chemical controller to maintain proper pH, ORP, temperature and flow. Check the system frequently during highbather loads, especially the circulation and flow rate. Chemical controllers monitor and adjust chemicals as needed to maintain proper and safe water balance.



repair of swimming pools after a wildfire.

During the fire

Water pressure and water quality at the source will be affected during and after times of wild fires. For residents trying to protect their property, using the hose may not always be effective. In some cases where water pressure becomes an issue during the fire, some fire departments may incorporate pumps in the pool to use the water for protecting homes. Homeowners in wildfire areas can also buy pumps that can soak down their property. These pumps can typically work at a flow of 150 gpm and can disperse the contents of a 20,000-gallon pool within 2 hours. Pool techs should be aware ahead of time of this possibility and should check that hydrostatic relief valves are in place on these pools to prevent the pool vessels from popping out of the ground during these emergency use times. If there is a high groundwater table or the pool is built over an underground spring, this could be a very real possibility.

Wildfires are Rampant—But how do they Affect Our Pools?

By Harold Evans

The wildfires are causing a major disruption across the United States. Not only is the destruction evident, but there will be a cleanup process once it is complete. There are lots of questions on how to properly clean up pools and manage the process. So, to understand this a little better let's start with the facts.

First, the ash that is created from the wildfires creates a lot of debris that needs to either be filtered out or vacuumed out of the pool. This debris can contain organic carbon, phosphorus, and nitrogen. These items can potentially create a phosphate and a nitrate problem for your pools. The ash will also tend to be more alkaline which can cause the pH of the water to increase. This is great for gardening, but we do not want these things in our pools.

Second, the flame retardants that are commonly used to fight



wildfires can be comprised of up to 10% fertilizer (like ammonia phosphate and sulfate ions). The mixture is dropped on the fires from planes and helicopters, and creates a sticky solution that is designed to help "smother" the flame until it can be better controlled. These retardants can also travel in the wind and could poten-

tially get in your pool...but probably only if you're relatively close to the blaze.

Third, unlike the flame retardant, the smoke and airborne particles can travel a long way from where the fire is being contained. It is not uncommon for this smoke to travel hundreds of miles and depending on how high it rises, it can be thousands of miles. So, if you're in the general vicinity of a wildfire it would be safe to assume you're being affected in some way.

As wildfires seem to be a more common occurrence and the winds are blowing, this reality is something that has to be managed. The debris settles in our pools and creates a perfect environment for chemical inefficiencies and stress on the equipment. Along with proper circulation and filtration, some of our products can aide in the cleanup process. Our CV-600 Enzyme Water Cleaner will help speed up the cleanup process by





during times of wildfires as result of possible high winds. Smoke, ash, tree branches, leaves and fire suppressant chemicals will all most likely end up in the pool. There is the possibility that live animals may seek shelter in the water or pool area. Do not attempt to deal with live wild animals on your own. Immediately contact your local animal control or wildlife management officials. Use extreme caution in and around areas where wildfires are still active. Protective gear such as respiratory mask, goggles and gloves may be required in these situations. It is prudent to carry some emergency supplies on your truck at all times. This could include bottled water, safety flares, a protective non-flammable blanket, a battery powered radio and flashlight. In addition, it is vital to comply with the emergency management in the area. Avoid areas of heavy smoke where emergency crews are setup. Service companies should never attempt to cross an emergency barrier or evacuation zone to deal with pools. Fire can change course and move rapidly especially in areas of high winds. If your route is anywhere near where fires are, make sure to have several planned escape routes thought out ahead of time. Smoke and ash can be a problem for miles beyond the fire. In the summer of 2017, smoke from the fires in British Columbia spread all the way down to the Seattle Washington area. The airborne ash and debris affected many pools in the area. Some of the pools developed filter problems and bouts of algae.

After the fire

Great care should be taken when undertaking the task of clean up after a fire. Be aware of live downed power lines. In many cases in fire-damaged homes, the fire department will turn off the power. This is done because wires may have melted or been fused from the heat. Be sure to check with the fire department before attempting to turn pump and filter breakers back on. Only a licensed electrical contractor should determine the integrity of the breakers for the pumps.

Pool Clean Up

Swimming pools in fire areas will contain ash, debris, firefighting chemicals and toxins. It is best when allowable to drain and re-fill the pool. Inspect the integrity of the pool walls, plaster, the pipefittings, decking and surrounding landscape. The components of smoke from fire can cause severe lasting damage to equipment and structures. In addition, the chemistry of the pool will be adversely effected. Smoke is corrosive and oxidative. It will cause severe damage wherever it has settled. If equipment and decking are covered in ash and smoke, continue to use caution. Wear personal protective equipment and a breathing apparatus as well as gloves. There are many toxins in smoke and ash residue that can cause sickness. The best case is to allow professionals to deal with excessive clean up situations.

The contents of ash

In the case of wildfires, there will be a lot of ash that ends up in pools. Ash from fires that burn lower than 840 degrees Fahrenheit

is mostly organic carbon. At a higher temperature, the carbon is burned away and inorganic compounds are left. These include things like calcium, magnesium and sodium. The fires in Northern California and the current fires in Southern California not only burned forest, but also homes and structures. Because the combustion rate is much higher for buildings, the make-up of the ash is much more different. At a very high combustion rate, the ash can

contain potassium and calcium oxides which create quicklime. If enough of this ash gets into the pool and then to the filter, it can create a limestone cement coating on the filter media. Ash from homes and structures can also contain toxins such as lead, arsenic and hexavalent chromium. Most of the ash that lands in pool water is also hydrophobic and repels water. This explains why the ash floats and is so difficult to remove



by skimming. Changing the charge of the ash by using a chitosan clarifier or an enzyme can help in the removal of the ash.

The ingredients of fire-fighting suppressants

Most of the dry suppressants dropped on wild fires are a made primarily of di-ammonium phosphate. The result of this is an increase in ortho-phosphate ending up in the waterways and in swimming pools. Phosphate in pools leads to many water quality issues and can combine with calcium to form calcium phosphate scale on heat exchangers. In 2003, the Cedar Fire in San Diego California was one of the biggest wildfires in California history. After that fire, pool service profes-

sionals reported a very high spike in phosphate levels in pools. This could have been in direct relation to the large amounts of phosphatebased suppressants that were dropped in the area.

In cases where homes were not damaged but were in a vicinity to the fire, the following steps can be taken:

- Remove all larger debris as soon as is possible.
 - Brush all surfaces thoroughly
- Skim smaller material with a pool net
- Make sure filter is clean and in operational order
 - Inspect all equipment
- Super-chlorinate the pool to 20 ppm or use a quality Chlorine Continued on page 21

Legislature that should make public policy, not the role of the courts to legislate important public policy changes. In addition, many businesses which have based their business model on the use of independent contractors need time to react and should not be subject to liability for complying with what had been the law in California regarding independent contractors for decades. The coalition has set up a website, https://imindependent.co/, as part of its effort to develop grassroots support for this important effort. This is an extremely uphill battle as organized labor groups and plaintiff attorneys will actively oppose the bill. With only three weeks left in the 2018 legislative session, there is not much time to accomplish this important task.





free oxidizer

- Follow immediately with a clarifier to help remove small ash material to the filter
- Use of an enzyme can help break down some un-filterable non-living organic material
- Test and treat for phosphates once the chlorine levels have come down below 5 ppm
- Add a good broad spectrum algaecide
- Clean filter as necessary throughout this process

Further cautions

The extreme heat from fires can cause the ground to bake leading to a lack of absorption. The heat bakes the soil forming a solid layer that causes it to repel water. This is a condition known as hydrophobicity. When rains come, the hydrophobic condition of the soil increases the rate of water run-off. Water can concentrate in these areas causing erosion. Excessive erosion can come from firefighting efforts and lead to flooding during rains. Pool areas need protection with sand bags or other diversion methods to drains to prevent an influx of floodwater in the pool.

Pools drained during the fire will need to be inspected for damage to plaster surfaces, deck areas and all equipment connections. Most likely, these pools will need to be re-surfaced before regular use can begin.

In Conclusion:

- Use extreme caution in areas where wildfires are active.
- Always check ahead of time with emergency management personnel before attempting to enter neighborhoods where fires have been.
- Wear smoke protection when necessary (breathing mask and goggles).
- Water in pools can contain toxins from smoke and ash and firefighting chemicals it is best to drain when possible. No one should ever swim in a pool in the immediate aftermath of a fire.
- Remember that wildfires can move fast and change course in seconds. Have more than one escape route planned ahead of time. It is best to stay out of the area.
- Shock, floc, enzyme, phosphate removal and algae prevention are all good remedial treatments once the fires are gone.
- Check and inspect all equipment thoroughly during the cleanup process. Filters may need to be backwashed and cleaned frequently during this time.
- Ensure that pools equipped with firehose pumps also have hydrostatic relief valves to prevent popping from rapid draining.
- Be aware of erosion and flooding problems that may occur from damaged soil. Sand bag any vulnerable areas in advance. Ensure that the flow of water is to drains and culverts to prevent flooding.
