California Capitol Report

CPSA requests Governor veto contractor liability bill

John Norwood is president of The California Pool and Spa Association (formerly SPEC).

This week, the California Pool and Spa Association submitted comments to Governor Jerry Brown registering our opposition to AB 1701. The CPSA is part of a coalition organized by the California Building Industry Association that contains 66 other groups composed of contractors and members of the business community that also oppose this dangerous bill.

AB 1701 holds general contractors and subcontractors jointly liable for unpaid wages, including fringe benefits. Specifically, for all contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2018, the bill requires a direct contractor making or taking a contract in the state for the erection, construction, alteration, or repair of a building, structure, or other work, to assume, and be liable for, debt owed to a wage claimant that is



incurred by a subcontractor, at any tier, acting under, by, or for the direct contractor for the wage claimant's performance of labor included in the subject of the original contract. The legislation authorizes the Labor Commissioner to bring an action to enforce the liability against a general contractor through either a civil action or the administrative process for disputing unpaid wages.

This bill does not require a worker or third party to exhaust his or her options before moving on to the general contractor, nor does this measure require the worker or third party to secure a judgment against the subcontractor in order to pursue a joint liability action. In addition, the bill does not provide the general contractor



FATAL CHILD POOL & SPA DROWNINGS SUMMER 2017



- ➤ From Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day 2017 (May 27 - Sept. 4), at least 163 children younger than age 15 fatally drowned in swimming pools and spas, according to media reports compiled by the USA Swimming Foundation.
- ➤ Of the 163 reports, 112 victims nearly 70 percent were children younger than age five.
- ➤ Florida, California, Texas and Arizona suffered the highest number of pool and spa drownings involving children younger than 15.

Question:

It seems like I'm constantly receiving postcards and telephone calls from insurance salespeople trying to get me to switch from my IPSSA endorsed insurance. They all say that their policies are just as good as the coverage you provide to IPSSA members. Is that true?

Answer:

There are major differences between the insurance provided to IPSSA members and that offered by every other insurance provider. Here are a few:

- (1) At least two other insurance programs members share the limit of liability with all other members of a chapter or even all other pool service techs written under that group. This can be a real problem if there are many claims as you may not have the amount of coverage you think you have. IPSSA members each have their own \$3 million coverage limit and IPSSA members never share limits of liability with anyone.
- (2) Many other insurance policies have a 'pollution exclusion' that provides no coverage for injury or property damage claims from pool chemicals, including chlorine and acid. Policies with this exclusion will provide no legal defense or coverage for the very common pool claims we routinely cover. Imagine a policy that gives no coverage for damage to tile caused by

tile cleaning solutions. Imagine a policy that excludes claims for damage caused by leaking bottles of acid. Imagine a policy that would not cover a customer's lawsuit for chemical rash or inhalation of fumes. IPSSA members have chemical injury and property damage coverage and are covered to \$1 million for these claims.

- (3) Other insurance policies exclude claims for injury or death caused by carbon monoxide fumes. In fact, the insurance company for another pool association recently went to court to deny a pool builder's claim for a carbon monoxide related death. Only IPSSA members are specifically covered for these claims. They are covered to \$1 million.
- (4) Other insurance companies will not pay for damage to the thing you are working on under their 'workmanship exclusion'. For example, other insurance companies give no coverage for tile scratched or damaged while its being cleaned. They have no coverage for damage to a heater, motor or pump if it is damaged while a member is repairing it. They give no coverage for damaged controllers if it's accidentally damaged during a repair. Every IPSSA member on our insurance plan has \$50,000 coverage for this type of claim.
- (5) No other pool association group has life insurance coverage

for death caused by illness, such as cancer, stroke or diabetes. IPSSA members are covered to \$50,000 to age 70. Members between age 70 and 80 have \$20,000 coverage. Advanced benefits are even available before death if a member is diagnosed with a terminal illness, which among other things, can be used to pay for hospice care.

- (6) No other pool association has coverage to pay a member's medical bills if he is hurt on the job. This is very important coverage since most regular members do not have worker's compensation coverage. Regular IPSSA members are covered to \$5,000 in medical expenses if they are hurt on the
- (7) No other association insurance plan gives coverage for the common claims following a pool inspection. IPSSA members are covered to \$50,000 for inspections even if no property is damaged, for example where the customer says he overpaid for the house based on the incorrect pool inspection. This important benefit is called 'Professional Liability Coverage'.
- (8) Very few companies provide coverage to re-key commercial locks if a member loses keys. We recently had a \$1500 key claim when an employee lost the master key to a large commercial facility.
- (9) IPSSA members can buy an additional \$1 million or even \$2 million liability coverage as an op-
- (10) No other pool association offers coverage for remodeling even if a member sub-contracts that job. IPSSA members can add remodeling at under \$30 per
- (11) IPSSA members pay no deductible for injury claims. Some other companies even charge a deductible when a member is determined not to be at fault.
- (12) IPSSA members are covered up to \$100,000 for popped pool claims. Ask any other carrier to state in writing if they will cover a popped pool claim.
- (13) IPSSA members can continue coverage after they retire to cover claims for injuries that occur after the member retires. The cost is under \$30 per month and without this optional coverage they would have no insurance. Other insurance programs don't offer this coverage.
- (14) IPSSA members can add liability and coverage for contents in their stores and offices as an option.
- (15) IPSSA members pay \$57 per month for their general liability insurance. This is among the lowest cost insurance plan in the country for the pool service indus-

Ray Arouesty is President of millions of people miserable. As homes get repaired pool techs will be facing swimming pools that are a mess and in many cases debris removal will only be possible if the pools are drained. Members need to exercise caution, however, before removing pool water in

water soaked areas.

Hydrostatic pressure is the upward force on the bottom of a pool shell exerted by underground water pressure. The amount of pressure beneath the pool shell increases as the water table rises. This uward force can cause a pool to lift from the ground, breaking electrical conduit, plumbing and decking as it rises. The "popped pool" is usually a total loss with damages often exceeding \$100,000. We therefore recommend members drain no pools at this time and members should explain the risk of significant pool damage to customers anxious to begin repairs.






Attend the 2ND Annual Biennial **CMAHC** Conference in-person or online

Industry and public health professionals can help keep the MAHC sustainable, current, and complete by providing expertise to drive this important guidance.

The Council for the Model Aquatic Health Code (CMAHC) announces that CMAHC members will be voting on 179 proposed changes to the Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC) this October. Industry professionals are encouraged to join the CMAHC and urged to add their voice to the chorus of public health and industry experts at the second Vote on the Code biennial conference, October 17-18, in Denver, Colorado.



The CMAHC Technical Review Committee has completed a review of all 179 proposed MAHC changes received in 2017. All completed and final Change Request (CR) reviews and revisions are now posted for viewing and commenting on the CMAHC website. Members are invited to comment on any proposed CRs or reviews. The CMAHC conference will include presentation of key CRs, the technical review, and summaries of member comments as well as time for caucusing on the CRs and floor discussion. Topics include acoustic design, chlorinator sizing, float tanks, design of benches/ledges, wing walls/shelves, lifeguarding and supervision, and filtration/disinfection issues. The breadth of topics makes it essential that people register for the conference and attend in-person or virtually by livestreaming to ensure their voice is heard, and allow them to help influence the vote to make the MAHC the best guidance it can be. There will also be a vote for a new CMAHC Board of Directors member. The CMAHC will continue to accept comments to influence the vote through November 3, 2017. Electronic voting opens with the conference and will close at midnight EST on November 19,

The CMAHC exists solely to promote and sustain the MAHC. Unlike other codes, the MAHC is kept sustainable, current, and

These proposed changes are then passed by the CMAHC to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to advise CDC on how the MAHC needs to change to keep up with the latest science and best prac-

CDC worked with public health, academia, and aquatics industry representatives across the United States on developing the Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC), a voluntary guidance document to prevent drowning, injuries, and the spread of recreational water illnesses at public swimming pools and spas. The Council for the Model Aquatic



Health Code (CMAHC), a nonprofit organization, was created to work in partnership with CDC to ensure that the MAHC is regularly improved and updated to keep pace with the latest science, industry advances, and public health

with legal standing to go after the sub-contractors bond for any wages the general contractor become responsible to pay. Under current law only material persons, employees and homeowners have legal standing.

"AB 1701 would place a tremendous burden on small contractors like our members who have little ability to monitor or control the conduct of its subcontractors with regard to the payment of wages and benefits, especially when they are trying to juggle several jobs in a busy season," wrote John Norwood, CPSA lobbyist and Executive Director. "For example, if a plaster contractor is short a couple men to do a plaster job and picks up a couple of labors he or she pays cash, how will the general contractor know?"

A significant percent of the pool and landscape business is currently going to the underground economy and the state is doing little to attack this problem. There is tremendous pressure on our members to "cheat to complete" under current conditions without the additional burdens imposed on general contractors by this legislation. AB 1701 adds an financial liability onto the small business person that there is no way to calculate or anticipate for up to a year after the project is complete, with little recourse to sub-contractors who often have little or no financial wherewithal. At minimum there should have been a size or dollar threshold for this legislation to apply.

There has to date been no case made that the current remedies for such issues are inadequate; adding a new private right of action to these remedies for subcontractor delinquencies for up to one year following the date of completion of the work exposes contractors to increased, unnecessary litigation that does not solve a purported problem. Rather than creating an ability to avoid the harm of unpaid workers, AB 1701 would make the worker go through a lengthy process of litigation - beginning one year after the work is complete, delaying payment for years.

Again, we are hopeful the Governor will reject this harmful legislation. At minimum, this bill should be amended to incorporate a threshold for the bill to apply

and amend California Business and Professions Code Section 7071.5 (f) to give the general contractor the ability to collect on the subcontractors bond for the unpaid wages that the general contractor is responsible to pay.

As it stands, AB 1701 is a dangerous and poorly conceived bill that threatens great harm to the pool and spa industry.



harvested turtles. Hatchlings are subject to many dangers in the ocean and it takes many years for those that do survive to reach breeding age. Slowly but surely Sea Turtle Inc. has worked toward population increase by monitoring turtle nest, collecting the eggs and allowing hatchlings to at least have a chance for survival. Although federally regulated, Sea Turtle Inc. receives no federal or state tax money.
