California Capitol Report

California Enacts Sweeping New Water Laws

Last week, Governor Jerry Brown signed into law a pair of bills that will shape the way water is used and conserved in California for years, if not decades to come. These two bills, AB 1668(Friedman, D-Glendale) and SB 606 (Hertzberg, D-Van Nuys) give new powers to the State Water Resources Control Board to create and enforce water conservation targets in California, as well as shaping how local water boards will enact those targets. It is important to note that there are no initial effects on the pool and spa industry, as the per capita water quotas suggested in the bill apply to indoor water only.

However, it will be critical for the industry to be involved in what will be an extensive regulatory process to develop standards regarding the use of outdoor water. Therefore it is important to understand how these new rules will govern the actions of local water districts moving forward, and what it will mean for the



future.

The most relevant of the pair of bills for the swimming pool and spa industry is AB 1668, as it covers the research and adoption of new water usage standards in California. The most important aspects of the bill are as follows:

- Establishing a series of decreasing per capita water quotas for indoor water use, beginning with 55 gallons per capita with the enrollment of the law, 52.5 gallons per capita beginning on January 1, 2025, and 50 gallons per capita beginning January 1, 2030
- The development and adoption of long-term standards for the efficient use of water by the State Water Resources Control Board and the Department of Water Resources on or before June 30, 2022

From the Basic Training ditoner and Stabilizer) and Additional Buffers such as Borates (Sodium Tetra borate).


A pool is said to be "in balance" when the pH, total alkalinity, calcium hardness, TDS, and optionally the cyanuric acid and borates are all within the recom-

Regular accurate water testing and a routine continuing maintenance program will result in a balanced, stable and easily maintained pool. A preventative maintenance program also ensures that if problems do arise, they can be quickly and easily corrected.

The characteristics of water vary so much from area to area that it would be difficult to provide a set formula for the addition of chemicals. General guidelines will be provided. Your circumstances may require different

One thing that you can do to make maintaining all your pools and spas easier in the future is to keep accurate records from the beginning of tests made, chemical additions, dates added, amounts,

Hey Ray!

Answers to recent questions asked to IPSSA's insurance broker

Question:

I did a calcium removal procedure on some rocks near the pool deck over a year ago. The customer recently contacted me stating that the calcium returned. I refused when she demanded that I refund the amount I charged and I am now set to go to arbitration on this issue tomorrow. Can you help me out on this?

Answer:

Your question raises so many issues. First, I've been told that calcium deposits on the surface of pavers, brick and rocks frequently migrates to the surface of these items from the ground, so it's difficult to prevent it from re-occurring unless you install an impermeable ground barrier. Accordingly, it would have been a good idea to inform the customer of the likelihood of the reappearance of the calcium deposits. Your customer may have a good argument against you if she can convince the arbitrator that she should have been informed of this fact, since she may not have hired you if she knew that the calcium would reappear.

From an insurance standpoint you may have a few challenges. General liability insurance covers claims that involve injury to people or damage to tangible property. Typically there is no coverage when a customer states that you didn't do

your job properly unless there is damage. There is also no coverage if the customer alleges that you breached a contract with her.

Next, there is the issue of your timing in contacting my office. Insureds have an obligation to report a claim as soon as soon as possible so the insurance company can evaluate the damage, obtain expert opinions and attempt to resolve the matter, if it so chooses. By waiting until the very last minute to contact us you have prevented your insurance company from doing that and it may take the position that you breached an

important insurance policy condi-

My best advise at this point is to ask the arbitrator for a continuance of the arbitration hearing and get me more details about this incident. We will see what the insurance carrier says. Alternatively, you may want to see if you can settle with the customer for a percentage of what you charged her ASAP, due to the uncertainty of (1) obtaining a continuance, (2) the outcome of the arbitration hearing, and (3) the insurance carrier response to the very late claim





CPSC Calls for Increased Water Safety Efforts as Summer Swim Season Arrives

New data shows, drowning is still the leading cause of unintentional death among children 1-4 and the second leading cause among children 5-14

A new report released today by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) indicates that the number of reported fatal child drowning incidents in swimming pools involving children younger than five—the most vulnerable population—has not increased significantly from last year's reports.

Although the number of report-

ed child drowning numbers have remained nearly the same year over year, fatal and nonfatal child incidents in pools and spas continue to pose a public health risk across the United States. CPSC Acting Chairman Ann Marie Buerkle is urging families and caregivers nationwide to remain vigilant while children are in and around the water this summer.

"While it is promising that the

drowning rate did not increase, there are still too many children who drown each year in pools and spas across the country," said Acting Chairman Buerkle. "These incidents are preventable. As a mother, grandmother and registered nurse, I raised my kids, and now my grandkids, with a respect for water. Swimming should be a fun way for families to be active, as long as everyone knows how to pool safely."

Buerkle also emphasized the importance of parents and care-

givers following the CPSC Pool Safely campaign's simple water safety steps that can help prevent drowning tragedies. Constant adult supervision, along with four-sided fencing, knowing how to perform CPR and teaching children how to swim are all critical ways to continue the decline in child drownings.

CPSC's latest data show there were, on average, 351 reported fatal

and results and so on. Over a short period of time, a pattern will emerge. This pattern combined with your experience will help you determine a specific maintenance routine for each of your pools on service. No routine eliminates the need to test and analyze the water. Keeping records will also serve as a tool to enable you to identify abnormal conditions by comparison.

Let's break down the water balance paraments:

Ph- In our daily lives we deal with percentages all the time—like somethings is 50 percent bigger than something else. pH is like a percentage term.

Acid – Lemon juice, vinegar and soft drinks all taste sour. That is because they contain a lot more hydrogen ions (H+) than hydrox-

yl ions (OH-) (greater percentage). They are mild acids and therefore are called 'acidic'.

Base – Baking soda (sodium bicarbonate) tastes brackish (or salty). So does seawater. That's because they contain more hydroxyl ions (OH-) than hydrogen ions (H+) – (greater percentage). They are mild bases and therefore are called 'basic'. Another word for basic is alkaline.

pH is one of the most important aspects of pool and spa care. If you exercise proper pH and total alkalinity control, most water balance problems will never occur.

pH is a value that indicates how acidic or basic a solution is. By the way, the p stands for power (mathematical) and the H for hydrogen. pH is always written with a lower case 'p' and an upper case 'H'.

Scientists know that pH is a measure of the concentration of hydrogen ions (H+) in the water. Hydrogen is the lightest element on the atomic chart of elements. As you know, it is lighter than air. Consider this, a metric ton)about 2,200 pounds) of pure water contains only about 1 milligram (1/100th of a gram) of hydrogen ions (H+) and hydroxyl ions (OH-) each. This is the basis of the pH scale. The more hydrogen ions (H+) there are in the water the lower the pH. The more hydroxyl ions (OH-) there are in the water the higher the pH. Because you are not a scientist you only need to remember that pH is a measure of the relative degree of acid or base in the water.

Extend Your Customer's Swim Season

with a Liquid Solar Cover

Water is a precious resource that we all must work to preserve. The reduction of evaporation helps to conserve water in backyard swimming pool environments and reduces the amount of topping off pools during the season. You can save your customers' water, money and energy by recommending that a liquid solar cover product be included in their pool maintenance program. Classified as evapora-

tion suppressants, despite the name, liquid solar covers do not heat the pool themselves. They do, however help prevent the loss of heat from the vaporization of water. Simply put when water evaporates it requires energy in the



form of heat for the process to occur. This process is the heat of vaporization. Energy is needed as water molecules begin to dance around and then disassociate into a vapor gas. Evaporation suppression is the reduction of evaporation by controlling the rate at which vapor escapes from the water surface. In other words, the dance of the molecules is slowed down considerably. The use of a liquid solar cover serves to save both heat and water reduction from evaporation. In addition, liquid solar covers help to hold the heat of radiation from the sun and thus keep the

pools warmer, longer.

Have you ever walked out to a pool to see water just steaming away? This process is evaporation, and it occurs when a liquid becomes a gas or vapor. Water closest to the surface is constantly changing into water vapor. Four main factors contribute to evaporation. First the larger the surface area the more water will evaporate. Evaporation will be greater in larger surface area pools. Next, water temperature in relation to the air. When water temperature is higher than the surrounding air. Air Continued on page 13

movement above the surface such as windy conditions is another cause. Lastly, relative humidity. The drier the air is the more evaporation occurs. The strength of the radiation from the sun plays a vital role in evaporation. In the Northern Hemisphere, evaporation rates are highest during the months of June, July and August. During dry summer months, evaporation rates increase. This is because water needs heat to reach the point of evaporation. It is possible for a 15,000-gallon pool to lose as much as 1500 gallons a month during dry hot months. Liquid solar covers are ideal for these times in reducing water loss.

The Department of Energy (DOE) states that 70% of total energy loss in a pool is due to

evaporation.* According to the National Swimming Pool Foundation in the Pool and Spa Operator Handbook, 50% of relative heat loss is due to evaporation. When pools lose water to evaporation, continual top offs are needed. When water evaporates from a pool only pure water leaves. Because of this, additional solids are left behind and both calcium hardness increases along with the total dissolved solids (TDS). In some cases, the contents of source water can cost a pretty penny with the necessary adjustments needed due to metal or phosphate content from tap water. The balancing process has to be started again. This leads to additional labor time and the added expense of additional chemicals. Protecting pool

water from evaporation is a costeffective way to reduce unnecessary top-offs and water chemistry adjustments. Another benefit to the use of liquid solar covers is not only the savings in heat and water but also chemicals and precious time.

The traditional solution to heat loss and evaporation has been to use a solid cover, which does significantly decrease heat loss and evaporation. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, solid covers can prevent from 30 to 50% of water loss from the pool. Solar bubble covers are especially great at the beginning of the season to help the water heat up more quickly. There are, however, some downfalls to using a solar cover that you often don't realize until

you're the one wrestling to put it back on by yourself. They are bulky and tough to move, not to mention the additional dirt and debris you may be introducing to the pool when dragging the cover through the yard. If a bubble solar cover is left on too long on hot days, it may overheat the pool. This can consume chlorine quicker and could lead to green pools.

Auto-covers are available yet are expensive so not every pool owner has that option. For these reasons, pool owners should consider using a liquid solar product to help maintain heat and reduce evaporation in their swimming pools. Liquid solar covers can also increase the length of the swimming season without the pool owners having to deal *Continued on page 17*



child drownings in pools and spas in 2015 involving children younger than 15. Of those 351 reported fatal child drownings in 2015, 266 (76 percent) involved children younger than five. Other key findings include:

- Annually, 73 percent of the hospital emergency room-treated nonfatal drowning injuries from 2015 through 2017 involved children younger than five.
- Male children younger than 15 had twice as many fatal drownings as female children of the same age.
- From 2015 through 2017, an estimated average of 6,400 children younger than 15 years old were reportedly treated in hospital emergency rooms for nonfatal drowning injuries in pools or spas.
- Between 2015 and 2017, residential locations made up 74 percent of reported fatal drowning incidents, and at least 45 percent of reported nonfatal drowning incidents for children younger than 15.
- · In addition, residential locations dominated reported incidents involving victims younger than five, with 54 percent of nonfatal drowning injuries among that age group from 2015 through 2017-and 85 percent for fatal drownings from 2013 through 2015-all occurring at a residence.
- The majority of the estimated hospital emergency room-treated, nonfatal drowning injuries for 2015 through 2017, and the reported fatal drownings for 2013 through 2015, were associated with pools (versus

Today, CPSC also released an updated report on suction entrapment incidents in swimming pools, spas and whirlpool bathtubs. Key findings include:

• Since the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool & Spa Safety Act went into effect in December 2008, there have been no reported fatalities involving a child being entrapped on a suction outlet cover in a public pool or spa.

with any of the inconveniences of a solid cover. Liquid solar covers can help in savings of heat when pools are using a heater. According to the DOE report, it takes one BTU (British thermal unit) to raise 1 pound of water by 1 degree. However, each pound of 80 degree F water that evaporates takes 1,048 BTU's of heat from the pool.

Types of Liquid Solar Evaporation Suppressants used in the pool industry include cetyl alcohol, stearyl alcohol and ethyl alcohol (ethanol). The technology of evaporation suppression uses monomolecular films. The films are a single molecule in thickness and create an additional surface tension. All of these are fatty alcohols so that they readily float on the surface. Dispersants are also used in the formulas to spread the material across the surface of the water. This technology comes from the drinking water reservoir industry. Studies on evaporation suppression go back to the early 1950's. One paper from the US Geological Survey published in 1960 reports on numerous studies done.* Many ingredients were tested but the studies all concluded that the use of cetyl alcohol or stearyl alcohol were found to be effective. In some cases, combining both cetyl alcohol with stearyl was shown to be the most effective at reduction of evaporation. All three types of liquid solar products are tested and proven non-toxic. Cetyl alcohol and stearyl are both found in numerous cosmetics and detergents. They are also used for food preservation as well. The levels of the ethanol-based liquids have been tested and shown to be relatively benign in pool use. Ethanol can be flammable however. Both cetyl alcohol and stearyl are not flammable and are food grade ingredients. A study in 1956 of cetyl alcohol in reservoirs pointed out that there was no adverse effect to the quality of the water or

taste and odor. Liquid evaporation suppressants create an invisible liquid barrier at the surface of the swimming pool to help trap heat and reduce evaporation. This barrier is called a film. The film is very thin, only one molecule thick. Thus, the film is called a monomolecular film. The products are added to the skimmer with the circulation system running to disperse the monomolecular layer on the surface. Think of these products like putting a lid on a pot of boiling water. Some concerns regarding the formation of chloramines and the inability of oxidation gases escaping the pool due to the surface tension have been expressed by some professionals. It should be noted that the evaporation films are broken up when swimming or high winds or other means of breaking surface tension occur. At these times of surface tension, interruption such as heavy swimming there is plenty of opportunity for gases to escape to the atmosphere. In addition, there is some natural permeability of the films.

The purpose of liquid solar technology is to reduce heat loss and evaporation, and it works even when bathers are swimming in the pool. The monomolecular film creates extra surface tension on the water that prevents release of water vapor to the atmosphere.

While the surface tension can be broken when swimmers are present, the tight molecular arrangement of the film causes it to quickly reform. The typical evaporation reduction rate of liquid covers runs from 15 to 40%. Ŝo, consider the 15,000-gallon pool that during the summer loses 1500 gallons a month...a liquid solar cover can save between 225 to 600 gallons of water a month. Over the 3 months of summer, that is a savings of between 675 to 1,800 gallons of water. The number one difference between a physical solar cover and a liquid product is that a physical cover does nothing if it is sitting bunched up in your backyard. If someone forgets to put the solid cover on when the temperature drops on a cool night there will be considerable evaporation loss. When liquid solar products are used along with a physical solar covers there is maximum coverage and extra protection.

Pool service professionals are now realizing the importance of offering these relatively new products to their clients. Consumers can sit by their pools, watch the steam evaporating and think "We could cook hot dogs with all the water and heat evaporating from the pool!" Pool service professionals can turn this into an opportunity to sell a liquid solar cover product whenever they sell or repair pool heaters. Consumers are investing a significant amount of money on a pool heater and pool professionals want to be sure their customer is satisfied with their purchase, because heating a pool can be expensive. Many service pros are now including a liquid solar product with start-up packages and explain to their customers that they should include the product in the weekly maintenance of their pool in order to remove evaporation and heat loss. A liquid solar cover product is a terrific alternative to a cumbersome, and often times unsightly, solar blanket that can be difficult to remove and put back on, not to mention tough to

Initially pool professionals were skeptical of the liquid solar cover products and through that it would be tough sell because you

are selling something you can't see. But eventually it's the fact that you can't see it that really makes it an easy sell. The main reason for this product's success is that it fixes the 'problem' of the traditional solar pool coverbecause it detracts from the beauty of the backyard. Many pools are the centerpiece of the landscape and by covering the sparkling water, the client can't enjoy the beauty of the water in the sunlight. In fact, many clients tell their pool professional that the liquid solar cover has allowed them to enjoy their pool more from an aesthetic point of view. Some pool professionals are even convinced that the traditional solar

cover actually decreases the client's use of their pool because those covers are so cumbersome to handle. When you come home from work and look out at an 18x36 beast of a solar blanket, the thought of grappling to try to remove the cover so you can go swimming seems daunting, especially if you are just one person. Some pool professionals like to say that the liquid solar cover pays for itself because the cost per swim becomes so much less, because the customers swim so much more!

Evaporation of pool water especially in the dry summer months is also a very real problem. Evaporation will cause both heat



California Capitol Report

countywide drought and water shortage contingency plans by January 1, 2020

- Establishing fines for water suppliers that commit outlined violations
- Requiring that outdoor irrigated landscape meet efficiency standards equivalent to those set forth in the Model Outdoor Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO), including those applicable to swimming pools and spas

Another critical note is that these guidelines, especially those regarding indoor and outdoor water use, are being given to the water supplier in order to meet their maximum allowed usages set forth in SB 606. While other reporting on this issue may have stated that water quotas for indoor and outdoor use were now in place for individual users with heavy fines attached to violations, that is simply not the case. These two pieces of legislation provide framework for water districts to reduce their overall water usage, ranging from broad targets to specific guidelines on how to measure and reduce consumption.

Regarding outdoor water usage, there is a key piece of language in both bills that help protect the pool and spa industry from being lumped in with the potentially damaging formulas and guidelines set forth in MWELO. The current text of MWELO does not differentiate pools and spas from ornamental water features, classifying them as "high water users" so that their size and even usage is limited in landscapes. However in both AB 1668 and AB

606, there is language that states "Ornamental water features that are artificially supplied with water...shall be analyzed separately from swimming pools and spas." This exemption means that pools and spas may not be considered with fountains and ponds, allowing for more nuanced and holistic overviews of the ways in which pools use water.

Both AB 1668 and SB 606 are complex and far-reaching pieces of legislation that will have long lasting impacts on how water is used and managed in our state. Conservation and reduction will be the norms moving forward, and it is critical that the pool and spa industry stay on top of these changes in order to avoid being left out or unfairly targeted. The California Pool and Spa Association has been actively involved in not only the legislative

process for these two bills but also the ongoing development of MWELO and other water regulations. Making the pool and spa industry's voice is heard in the long process of updating MWELO and being an active participant in these pieces of legislation ensure that the industry will be able to continue to grow in California.

CPSA is currently the only trade association representing the swimming pool and spa industry that is active in both the legislative and regulatory processes on these important water issues. In order to protect the future of the industry in California and keep up the fight we need your support. Only a fraction of the industry are currently members of CPSA. Our membership needs to grow to maintain and support the work and expertise required to be involved in this work in the next few years. We are entirely dependent on our members for support.
