California Capitol Report

### **Upcoming meetings** and regulations

John Norwood is president of The California Pool and Spa Association (formerly SPEC).

In August the California Energy Commission will be conducting a public workshop seeking comments regarding proposed energy efficiency regulations for pool pump replacement motors and portable electric spas. This is part of a multi-year rulemaking process that began in March of 2012, with a draft staff report with analysis of pool pumps released in 2016. Following that analysis the U.S. Department of Energy finalized rules for minimum energy efficiency standards in 2017, with the compliance date set for July 19, 2021. The current proposal by the Energy Commission would update test procedures and energy standards that were not covered by the most recent federal standards. Also included are updates to the energy efficiency standard for standby mode in portable electric spas, as well as the test procedures and labelling requirements for portable spas.

The workshop will be held on Thursday, August 3rd, 2017, at 1516 9th Street in Sacramento beginning at 9 AM. On the subject of further regulations, the CPSA is scheduled to meet with the Department of Pesticide Regulation regarding



their investigation of the safety and application of chlorine in swimming pools on Wednesday, August 23rd. Because chlorine is classified as a pesticide, it is the DPR's purview to periodically review whether or not it is being used safely and whether it has caused undue harm. The Department conducted a study and found in the last ten years, 273 people have been harmed by chlorine by means of improper handling and application as well as injuries to swimmers caused by chlorine gas.

After these findings the Department reached out to the CPSA in order to discuss their ideas for solutions to these injuries. One such proposal was mandating that every pool service technician who handles chlorine be required to be licensed by the DPR, but after speaking with the CPSA the DPR is instead considering a public information and educational campaign on the dangers of improperly handled chlorine. This model would be similar to other voluntary campaigns the DPR has run in the past that have proven to be very effective, and would increase awareness regarding chlorine safety without a burdensome and expensive requirement that would blanket the entire pool and spa industry. Tin response to outreach to CPSA by the Department, CPSA will be coordinating a number of organizations for input at the upcoming meeting.



### Getting back to basics and benefitting from energy-saving incentives

Pumps are the heart of a pool circulation system—not only are they the vehicle that moves water through the various systems, but also now the focus of substantial rebates which can drastically reduce the costs of owning and operating a pool. So it's important for service professionals to get back to basics and understand the significance of hydraulics on residential and commercial pools and why utilities are pushing for consumers and aquatic facilities to install variable-speed pumps (VSPs). To take advantage of utility rebates, pool professionals need to understand how pumps work, what the difference is between single and variable-speed models, and the factors that influence energy savings in the equipment room. By being able to explain how VSPs work and the potential energy savings, pool professionals will find themselves doing more pump upgrades as a part of their service offerings.

How centrifugal pumps work

All pool pumps are centrifugal. They have a shaft-driven impeller that rotates inside a casing, which allows water into the suction port (inlet) where it is then 'thrown' to the outside of the casing before exiting through the discharge port. The impeller is a circular pump part that rotates to provide centrifugal force for propelling water in the circulation system. It spins on the end of the electric motor shaft and is the only moving part of a centrifugal pump.

The velocity (or speed) transferred to the water by the impeller is converted to pressure energy, otherwise known as total dynamic head (TDH). Two things make centrifugal pumps unique:

1. They can provide high flow-

2. Their flowrate varies conerably with changes in the TDH of the particular piping system. This allows the flowrate to be 'throttled' considerably with a simple valve placed into the discharge piping, without causing excessive pressure build up or the need for a pressure-relief valve.

However, throttling the flowrate of a centrifugal pump has certain limits, as it should not be operated below the minimum (safe) flowrate that is indicated by the pump manufacturer, or what is required for your given turnover rate. If this happens, it can cause excessive recirculation to occur inside the pump casing, resulting in the pump overheating and increasing wear and tear on internal seals and bearings. The ideal

flowrate is the point at which efficiency of the pump maximizes energy use and reduces deterioration of the internal components.

Atmospheric pressure also af-

fects the pump's ability to operate. A self-priming pump will lose 10 per cent of its ability to lift water for every 1000 ft of elevation. For





example, at 5000 ft a pump can lift water 5 ft, while at sea level a pump can lift water up to 10 ft. In other words, the atmospheric pressure at sea level is 14.7 lbs, while at 5000 ft the pressure is 12 lbs. This is important to remember because the higher the elevation, the more vacuum required in the

system to make the pump operate properly.

Throttling centrifugal pumps with a discharge valve is not as energy-efficient as using a variable-frequency drive (VFD) to slow the pump/motor speed down, but it is much less expensive to install. To understand why many

utilities are offering large incentives and rebates to those that switch from single-speed pumps to VSPs, it is important to understand how they differ.

### **Pump motor differences**

Historically, pool pumps with induction motors, which only operate at one or two speeds, draw more energy than is necessary to circulate water, and in some cases pump more water than necessary. These units must constantly operate at high speed to perform demanding jobs such as running a waterfall or pool cleaner. On the other hand, it takes far less power to filter the pool water—a difference single-speed pumps cannot address.

The programmability of a VSP is where these pumps differ. In fact, some have built-in, constantflow software, which maximizes the advantages of these pumps, as it will automatically adjust its speed to deliver the required

flowrate for each programmed task. For instance, to achieve the maximum laminar jet height of 7 ft at a distance of 8 ft, a water supply of 10 gallons per minute with 16 ft of head (measured at the laminar) is required to produce a smooth 6-ft arc of water. As the filter accumulates dirt, however, the pump will sense resistance in the circulation system and automatically ramp up its speed to continually provide the proper flowrate the water feature requires. With other pump types, the water feature will gradually throw a shorter arc of water as the filter gets dirtier.

VFD pumps can also be programmed to achieve specific turnover rates which allows for the reduction of motor speed, power, and energy use during periods when filters are clean, instead of sizing the pump to assume worstcase operating conditions.

No matter what type of pump

is being used, however, slower speeds save energy, reduce noise levels, as well as wear and tear on other pool equipment the water circulates.

### How aquatic facilities can benefit from pump efficiency

With respect to commercial pools, a three-phase pump is a nobrainer as it can save an aquatic facility approximately 35 to 60 per cent on its energy bills in comparison to using a one- or two-speed model. Further, when combined with a VFD, it increases the pump's efficiencies, as well as provides better energy savings. And even with a single-phase application, a VFD can be used with a three-phase pump to bring savings to those facilities as well.

Technological advancements in today's pool equipment make it imperative for industry professionals to take the time to sit with facility managers to ensure they are achieving the water quality, parameter reporting, and cost controls necessary to keep their facilities operating efficiently.

With many municipal and YMCA-type pools struggling to keep their doors open, the integration of all components in the pump room is paramount to ensuring the lowest possible operating costs. This was the case for one such facility in Woodstock, Ont., with a 87,660 gal pool built more than 35 years ago. Hollandia Pools and Spas, a commercial design/build and service company based in London, Ont., was called upon to

swimming is the "funnest sport" with posters, club support materials, and public service announcements. Visit swimtoday.org to learn more or to find a local facility that offers swim lessons, hosts a team, and is operated by CPO® Certified professionals.

The Jewish Community Center (JCC) Association is receiving \$22,000, targeted to benefit children near and dear to their hearts: Twenty JCCs are receiving funding for their Special Needs Swim Programs. Twenty additional JCCs are receiving funding to provide swim lessons to five or more children from Angels of America's Fallen (see below) at each of their locations.

Angels of America's Fallen (AOAF) is a third-year Campaign recipient, directly funding swimming for the children of fallen military and first responders. AOAF supports the children by engaging them in healthy activities throughout their entire childhood. Last year, two-year old Lylah, who was on AOAF's waiting list for an activity of her choice, fell into the family pool and tragically drowned. Affectionately, "Lessons from Lylah" was initiated to enroll the children of the fallen in learn to swim programs. The American Chemistry Council has directed their donation to this program.

Momentum continues to grow with the New York State Parks (NY State Parks) learn to swim program, supported this year by an announcement from Governor Cuomo. This program started with an industry collaboration five years ago: NSPF, Red Cross, and NY State Parks continue to work together, expanding this year to 27 NY State Parks and teaching about 3,000 children each year. Since the program started, the NY Department of Health, Master Pools Guild, and the NESPA Foundation have joined the effort with generous donations. "This is a great example of government, non-profits, and industry collaborating and changing thousands of people's lives for the better," says NSPF Board Chairman Bruce





design and renovate the equipment room.

"Having the opportunity to design the pump room for maximum efficiencies allowed us to not only upgrade the existing equipment, but also enabled us to integrate additional technologies to improve the pool's operating efficiencies and at the same time increase the facility's cost savings," says the company's Richard

Deakin.

A big part of the energy savings provided to this particular YMCA was the result of the installation of VFDs on the pumps.

"The facilities where we have installed these units typically see an annual savings of at least \$10,000 in operating costs," says Deakin. "The units are not free, but the return on investment (ROI) is normally less than three years,

and some areas are even being given rebates from utility companies, making the payback period even shorter."

### Selecting the right pump


Proper pump selection (sizing) and optimal flowrates (as mentioned above), are additional ways to reduce energy costs. Affinity laws indicate the power demanded by a pump is proportional to the cube of the flowrate. For example, if the pump's flowrate is doubled, then its power demand is increased by a factor of eight. Therefore, it is important to use the smallest pump that is capable of turning over the entire pool volume in an acceptable amount of time.

During the pump selection phase for an aquatic facility, the auxiliary features (e.g. spray pads, fountains, and waterfalls) should also be considered, as it is common for them to use the pool's main pump. Some building codes, however, require the use of a multispeed pump, or in some cases, a separate pump for each auxiliary pool load. Pumps for aquatic facilities are oversized by design, sometimes more than 20 to 40 per cent bigger than they need to be. This is because many architects and engineers look at what is required, then pick the next size up to be sure the pump can handle the job.

### Comparing equipment costs to energy savings

Even with the advantages explained, some homeowners and facility operators still find the cost of a VSP or VFD hard to justify. However, before ruling one out, the price of a new pump should be compared to the expense of doing nothing. For example, an aquatic facility using a single-speed pump may have operational costs of up to \$900 per year. After five years, the facility will have spent \$4500 to operate the pump. However, comparable operational costs for a facility with a well-designed circulation system that uses a VSP or VFD may be as little as \$200 per year. During the same five-year period, it would cost the facility less than a quarter the amount it would have spent using a singlespeed pump. Cost savings will continue to multiply the longer the VSP or VFD is used. (Costs and savings will vary by region). The initial cost of a VSP or VFD can typically be recouped during the second year of operation, especially in those pools that run year

With the substantial energyuse rebates some local power companies offer, in conjunction with the savings in daily operational expenses, some end-users are getting back approximately 50 per cent of the pump's cost in less than a year. Now is the time for service professionals to incorporate variable speed pumps into their service offerings.
