Note that human skeletal remains representing 17 individuals, as recovered from the same burial feature(s) as these funerary objects, were previously reburied in 1991; however, a few additional human bone fragments and teeth representing at minimum one of the individuals were inadvertently retained by the University of Tennessee, Knoxville following the forensic inventory that was conducted in 1987 prior to the 1991 reburial. The additional human remains were identified in the university's Department of Anthropology collections in 2021.

Reason: Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA). Public Law 101-601- November 16, 1990. Section 7, Repatriation. This collection of associated funerary objects is under the control of the Archaeological Research Center (ARC); however, the corresponding human remains are currently under the control of the University of Tennessee, Knoxville (UTK). In collaboration with the ARC, the UTK has submitted the NAGPRA Notice of Inventory Completion for publication in the Federal Register. The human remains and associated funerary objects covered by this deaccession request will be repatriated to representatives of the Flandreau Santee Sioux Tribe if no other tribal counterclaims are received within 30 days of the Federal Register publication.
