Executive Summary

To further improve public access to disaster response information and assistance resources, the legislature directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management to develop and deploy a Disaster Web Portal in accordance with <u>H.B. 2325 Sec.</u> 418.057 which requires the web portal to:

- (1) provide disaster information to the public, including information on programs and services available to disaster victims and funding for and expenditures of disaster assistance programs
- (2) include information on disaster response and recovery activities
- (3) provide information on obtaining assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, state agencies, organized volunteer groups, and any other entities providing disaster assistance

The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) coordinates state emergency management programs that are intended to ensure the state and local government entities respond to and recover from emergencies and disasters, and implement plans and programs to help prevent or lessen the impact of emergencies and disasters. TDEM develops and maintains extensive Crisis Information Management capabilities that are used by state and local jurisdictions to coordinate response and recovery efforts. However, enabling more robust and easily accessible access to disaster information and resources for individual citizens is the objective of this legislation and resulting project.

Overview

Purpose

During an unfolding disaster, it can be difficult for individual citizens to locate current official information and resources. The Disaster Web Portal is designed to be a hub for disaster information, and to provide both current news and notifications, and access to essential information for disaster survivors. The Disaster Web Portal is designed to be the HUB for information on current disasters:


- Provide up-to-date information on response and recover efforts during disasters
- Provide access to information on what to do before, during, and after common disasters in Texas
- Provide access to information on real-time traffic and weather reports
- Provide information about state programs such as the State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry (STEAR)

- Provide access to disaster resources for Individuals/Household Assistance and Business Assistance via U.S. Small business Administration (SBA) loans
- Collection of links to other state resources for disaster survivors

Comprehensive Source of Disaster Information

The Disaster Portal serves Texans as an aggregate site that provides access to comprehensive information on active disasters in Texas and provides information on programs and services available to disaster victims. The Disaster Portal can be accessed via any internet connection.

The following example screenshots are from the initial deployment of the Disaster Portal, which present important disaster response and recovery information, and aggregating links and access to essential data and services.
