2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

The architectural works noted above exemplify the creative talent, industry, versatility and accomplishments of Eugene Mackey. In expressing a noble idea with strength and dignity as in Court of Honor, a war memorial; in composing a most inviting and efficient place to study, as in the Olin Library; and in accomplishing a unique solution for the growth and exhibition of plant materials, as in the Climatron; he has contributed in an outstanding way to the excellence of architecture and advancement of the profession.

As President of the St. Louis Chapter he dedicated himself to the chapter effort of expediting the construction of Saarinen's design for the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial. It was largely due to his untiring work, as President of the St. Louis Chapter, that the Jefferson Memorial project, long dormant, was activated and is now being constructed.


The purpose of this letter is to request your presence at the 1964 Convention of The Institute to be held in St. Louis, Missouri, starting June 14, 1964.

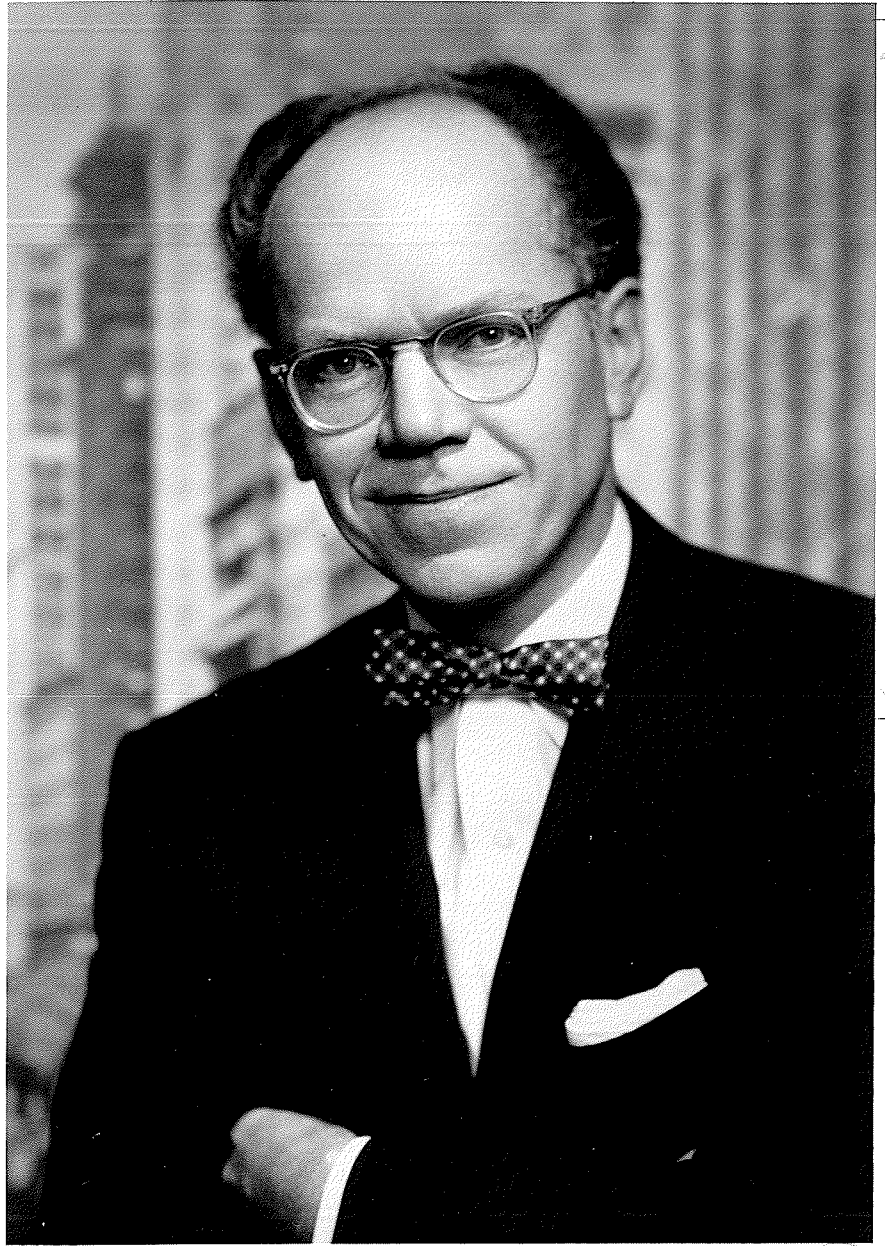
