

Board Policy 4330: Spectator Conduct and Sportsmanship for Athletic Status: Approved and Co-Curricular Events

Any person, including an adult, who behaves in an unsportsmanlike manner during an athletic or co-curricular event may be ejected from the event the person is attending and/or denied admission to school events for up to a year.

The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to deny future admission to any person for up to one year by delivering or mailing a notice informing them of this denial of admission. With an option to appeal to the board at the next regular board meeting. Individuals will need to fill out a request to address the board for the appeal.

Examples of unsportsmanlike conduct include, but most certainly are not limited to:

1. Using vulgar or obscene language or gestures;
2. Possessing or being under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or illegal substance;
3. Possessing a weapon; (In violation of state law)
4. Fighting or otherwise striking or threatening another person;
5. Failing to obey the instructions of a security officer or School District employee; and
6. Engaging in any activity which is illegal or disruptive of the educational process.
