

## **Data Protection Notice**

# **Mayor Paweł Adamowicz Award**

#### 1. Introduction

The European Committee of the Regions (CoR) is committed to respecting and protecting your personal data in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (EUDPR).

Your personal data may be collected and processed for the annual evaluation of Mayor Paweł Adamowicz Award –nominations and the establishment of the Award winner.

### 2. Who is responsible for the processing of personal data?

The CoR, the City of Gdańsk and the International Cities of Refuge Network are responsible (as joint controllers) for the processing of personal data.

The responsible service (delegated controller) is Unit B.3 CIVEX Commission Secretariat - Commission for Citizenship, Governance, Institutional and External affairs – <a href="mailto:civex@cor.europa.eu">civex@cor.europa.eu</a> and in particular is the Mayor Paweł Adamowicz Award secretariat within Unit B.3 CIVEX Commission Secretariat — Adamowicz Award@cor.europa.eu.

#### 3. What is the purpose of the processing?

The CoR, the City of Gdańsk and the International Cities of Refuge Network (the Award Partners) have together developed and launched the Mayor Paweł Adamowicz Award for courage and excellence in promotion of freedom, solidarity and equality. Together we will collect, store, process and share with the Evaluation Committee and the Jury of the Award various types of personal data in order to allow the aforementioned bodies to evaluate the nominations and establish an Award winner.

Personal data shall be processed by the Joint Controllers for the following purposes:

- establish an Award winner;
- administer and evaluate the Award nominations;
- organise the Award proclamation and the Award ceremony;
- promote the Award.

#### 4. What is the legal basis for the processing?

The legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 5.1.d of the EUDPR, according to which "the data subject has given consent to the processing of his or her personal data for one or more specific purposes"

#### 5. What personal data are processed?

The type of data to be collected includes:

- name;
- email address;
- telephone numbers;
- job title;

- employer details
- address;
- video and images taken during the Award ceremony.

#### 6. Who are the recipients or categories of recipients of your personal data?

- Natural persons in contractual relationship with one of the three institutions (staff members) organising the Award and that are actively and directly involved in the Award Secretariat work.
- Natural persons who have been appointed members of the Award Evaluation Committee and the Jury.

#### 7. Are your personal data transferred to a third country or international organisation?

Noyour personal data are not transferred to non-EU Member States or to international organisations, apart from the cases that some of the Evaluation Committee members might be from international organisations. In this case, when personal data are transmitted to third countries or international organisations for the evaluation process of the nominations, any such transfer shall fully comply with the requirements laid down in Chapter V of Regulation (EU)2018/1725.

#### 8. How can you exercise your rights?

You have the right to access your personal data, to rectify any inaccurate or incomplete personal data, to restrict (under certain conditions) the processing of your personal data, to request the deletion of your personal data (if processed unlawfully) and, where applicable, the right to data portability.

Where applicable, you have the right to object to the processing of your data on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time. You also have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Please note that withdrawal of consent will not have retroactive effect.

You have the right of recourse to the European Data Protection Supervisor (<a href="mailto:edps@edps.europa.eu">edps@edps.europa.eu</a>) if you consider that your rights under the EUDPR have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data by the CoR.

#### 9. How long are your personal data kept for?

Your data (excluding photos) will be kept for a maximum period of 12 months after the end of the Award edition marked by the date of the Award ceremony, unless you explicitly agree to your contact details being kept in order to receive invitations to future similar events organised by the CoR.

Your photos that have been published (for example on the web or in publications) will remain in that format indefinitely.

10. Are the personal data collected used for automated decision-making, including profiling?

No, the CoR will not use your personal data to make automated decisions about you.

"Automated decisions" are defined as decisions made without human intervention.

# 11. Will your personal data be further processed for a purpose other than that for which data have been obtained?

No, your personal data will not be further processed for a different purpose.
