## COMMENT INVITED ON THE PETITION OF ALENCO COMMUNICATIONS, INC., ET AL., FOR A DECLARATORY RULING AND FOR PREEMPTION OF AN ORDER BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS

Interested parties are invited to comment on the petition filed by Alenco Communications, Inc., *et al.*, seeking a declaratory ruling that customer equipment used in connection with fixed or mobile satellite service is not within the definition of "facilities" as used in section 214(e) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.<sup>1</sup> Petitioners also seek preemption of an order by the Public Utility Commission of Texas designating DialToneServices, L.P. as an eligible telecommunications carrier for purposes of receiving high-cost universal service support.<sup>2</sup>

Interested parties may file **comments on or before May 25, 2007**, and **reply comments on or before June 11, 2007**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies. Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <a href="http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/">http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/</a>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. If multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of the proceeding, commenters must transmit one electronic copy of the comments to each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number, in this case, **CC Docket No. 96-45**. summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>5</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>6</sup>
