VISION:

To ensure the citizens of Louisiana that gaming is strictly and impartially regulated as provided by the laws of this state.

MISSION:

To regulate all gaming activities under its jurisdiction in a manner which instills public confidence and trust that gaming activities are conducted honestly and free from criminal and corruptive elements; to ensure the integrity of individual gaming activities by the regulation of persons, practices, associations and activities within the gaming industry.

PHILOSOPHY:

To effectively achieve our mission by providing professional and knowledgeable service while maintaining impartial but strict regulation of gaming activities.

GOAL:

I. To strictly regulate all gaming activities under the jurisdiction of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board by ensuring the initial and continuing suitability of all licensees and permittees and eliminating to the extent possible known criminal and corrupt influences on the gaming industry. La. R.S. 27:2, 27:15, 27:15.1, 27:28, 27:42, 27:70, 27:306 (A), 27:202, 27:234, 27:235, 27:310, 27:352, 27:363, 27:603, and 27:604.

OBJECTIVE: I.1.

To ensure that 100% of the known disqualified and unsuitable persons identified by the Louisiana State Police and/or Attorney General gaming investigators are denied a license or permit, in order to eliminate criminal and known corrupt influences on the gaming industry each year through the end of FY 2027-2028.

STRATEGY:

- I.1.1. To coordinate with law enforcement agencies to identify corrupt influences within the gaming industry operating in Louisiana.
- I.1.2. To benchmark methods used by other gaming jurisdictions to identify and eliminate corrupt influences and unsuitable persons in their gaming industries.
- I.1.3. To administer the appropriate state agencies in the conduct of investigations of all persons required by law to meet suitability.
- I.1.4. To require the compliance of the gaming industry with all statutory requirements for gaming.
- I.1.5. To continue to afford applicants, licensees and permittees administrative remedies as required by law.

LOUISIANA GAMING CONTROL BOARD STRATEGIC PLAN – APPENDIX FY 2023-2024 THROUGH 2027-2028

1. The Louisiana Gaming Control Board serves the citizens of the State of Louisiana through the regulation of the gaming industry as mandated by the legislature.

2. INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL VARIABLES

INTERNAL FACTORS:

The Louisiana Gaming Control Board consists of nine members and two ex officio members. The chairman is the only full-time member and serves as the Board's CEO. The Board currently has three staff positions, one confidential assistant, one principal assistant, one administrative coordinator, and a docket clerk who is an employee of the attorney general's office.

The attorney general is statutorily authorized to serve as legal advisor and legal representative to the Board and to provide investigative services to the Board. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of State Police, has responsibility for investigations and enforcement of gaming law, rules and regulations, and may issue certain gaming licenses and permits in accordance with law.

There is one individual serving as a hearing officer whose duty is to conduct administrative hearings and render decisions. The hearing officer's support staff consists of employees of the Attorney General.

In addition to the internal factor of the operational structure of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, there are several external factors which affect board function.

EXTERNAL FACTORS:

Measuring outcomes is difficult in any context, but particularly so in gaming regulation. We must be guided principally by the legislative mandate to strictly regulate gaming. "Success" is attained when gaming is strictly, impartially and fairly regulated. It is not reducible to simple numerical counts of license or permit issuances, denials, revocations or suspensions. "Success" is obtained when crime, wrongdoing or unsuitable conduct is deterred through effective regulation; yet quantitative measurement of the benefits of this deterrence remains a complex challenge.

In addition, it is extremely difficult to isolate the particular effects of regulatory activity from other factors that affect outcomes and over which the Board has little control.

A. Social-Structural factors.

The opportunity for adolescents and young adults has increased due to the increase of licensed gaming facilities in Louisiana. Absent successful intervention, commensurate growth in underage gaming can be expected due to increased opportunities. Additionally, the Board is compelled by statute to provide for the enforcement of compulsive gaming regulations and programs.

B. Emergencies and other unpredictable events.

History suggests that the temporary closure of a licensed riverboat due to hurricanes, flood conditions, a particularly sensitive and complex case, or some other crisis that strains our time, attention and resources may occur.

C. Changing statutory responsibilities.

The Board's mission, goals, priorities and workload are affected directly by laws enacted by the legislature; for example, the enactment of legislation requiring the establishment and quarterly update of a central registry of all licensed gaming operators.

D. Rule Promulgation process.

Changes in rules are necessary due to outside influences. The Board remains adaptable and flexible to the changing needs of the State.

E. Changing technology.

Advancing technology affects the Board's ability to keep pace with the regulation of the gaming industry. Not only is the technology more complex, but there are changes in the way it is being applied. Technology holds great promise for strengthening the capabilities of gaming regulation and criminal investigations. At the same time however, technology is increasing the ability of potential criminals to evade detection and providing new opportunities for criminal behavior. The Board's goal in decreasing criminal behavior and corrupt influences is dependent in large measure upon the ability of its support agencies to wisely use technology.

F. The effectiveness and capacity of our state partners.

Maintaining proactive regulatory policies requires the coordinated efforts of all levels of government. For the continued success of the Board, the support of the agencies which provide regulatory, investigative, enforcement and legal services is needed.

G. Developments in gaming industry.

Fifteen riverboat casinos are authorized to operate in Louisiana and all fifteen casinos are currently operational. The final riverboat license held by Golden Nugget Lake Charles, LLC opened December 6, 2014. Pari-mutuel gaming is operating at four facilities. Although the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is responsible for

the regulation of slot machines at qualified pari-mutuel facilities, the Louisiana Racing Commission is responsible for the regulation of horse racing.

In 2018, a referendum vote authorized Fantasy Sports in 49 parishes. Enabling legislation was introduced in the 2019 regular legislative session, and passed. Rulemaking commenced for this new form of gambling. The LGCB was designated as the regulatory agency for overseeing Fantasy Sports.

Act 141 of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session was signed by Governor Edwards on June 9, 2020. This piece of legislation provided the regulatory structure and laws for the operation of fantasy sports. It required the Louisiana Gaming Control Board to institute rulemaking procedures no later than August 1, 2020. During the Boards July 16, 2020 meeting, the Board approved the institution of rulemaking for Fantasy Sports. The Board, State Police Gaming Division, and the AG's Gaming Division worked diligently to promulgate rules and facilitate the applications for fantasy sports operations in Louisiana. Emergency rules were not authorized in the legislation. Therefore, in order to comply with the Administrative Procedures Act and due to **substantive** changes, the rulemaking process took from July 16, 2020 until February 20, 2021. Fantasy Sports went live on July 15, 2021. These numbers will be considered in the annual report for fiscal year 2021-2022.

On June 10, 2021, the Louisiana State Legislature approved legislation establishing a licensing framework for retail and online sports betting in the fifty-five Louisiana parishes that voted to authorize sports betting in the November 2020 election.

During the 2021 Regular Session, the Louisiana Legislature adopted Act 440, which directs the Gaming Control Board to adopt emergency rules for the promulgation of the initial administrative rules pertaining to sports wagering that shall be considered to constitute a matter of imminent peril to public health, safety, and welfare. The proposed rules codify Acts 80, 440, and 435 of the 2021 Regular Legislative Session and Act 215 of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session that enact the Louisiana Sports Wagering Act and authorize the conducting, application, licensing, permitting, enforcement, collection of fees and taxes, and regulation of racehorse wagering and sports wagering.

The Gaming Control Board determined that the Emergency Rules were necessary to comply with the legislative mandate in Act 440 of the 2021 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature. This Emergency Rules became effective August 23, 2021. Retail Sports wagering went live in October of 2021 and Mobile Sports Wagering went live in February of 2022. These numbers will be considered in the annual report for fiscal year 2021-2022.

Through these limitations and complexities, the Board has maintained a proactive effort to identify goals, strategies and indicators of performance that are meaningful, appropriate to our mission, and adaptive to the evolution of the gaming industry.
