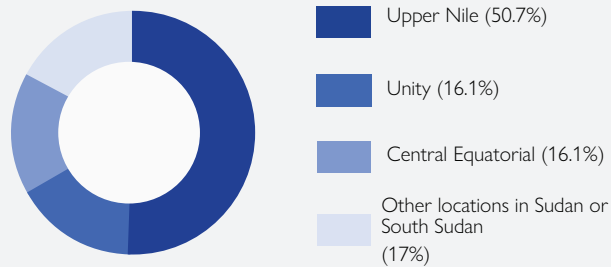


## Overview

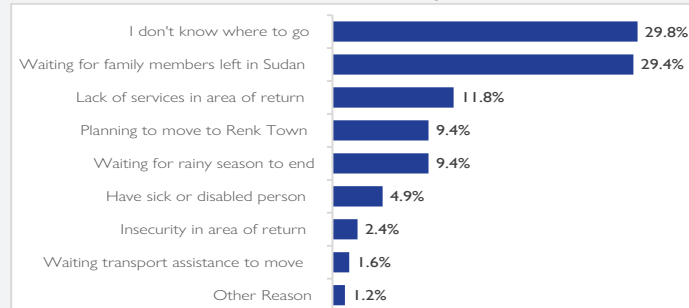
More than fifteen months (April 16th 2023 till date) since the fighting between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) erupted in Khartoum, which has led to the world's largest displacement crisis with more than 10.7 million displaced, including 2.1 million who have fled to neighboring countries such as South Sudan. On the 7th of July 2024, IOM Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) conducted a rapid intention survey covering Renk TC 1, 2 and TC-Extension. The objective of the assessment is to understand the population's return intentions, preferred destinations of return, as well as reasons for choosing to remain in the transit center. As of the start of data collection, a total of **10,735** individuals (**8,130** returnees and **2,605** refugees) were reported to be present at the Renk TC while **652** households were sampled to be interviewed with the vast majority of respondents being South Sudanese (99.8%)

## Intentions of returnees

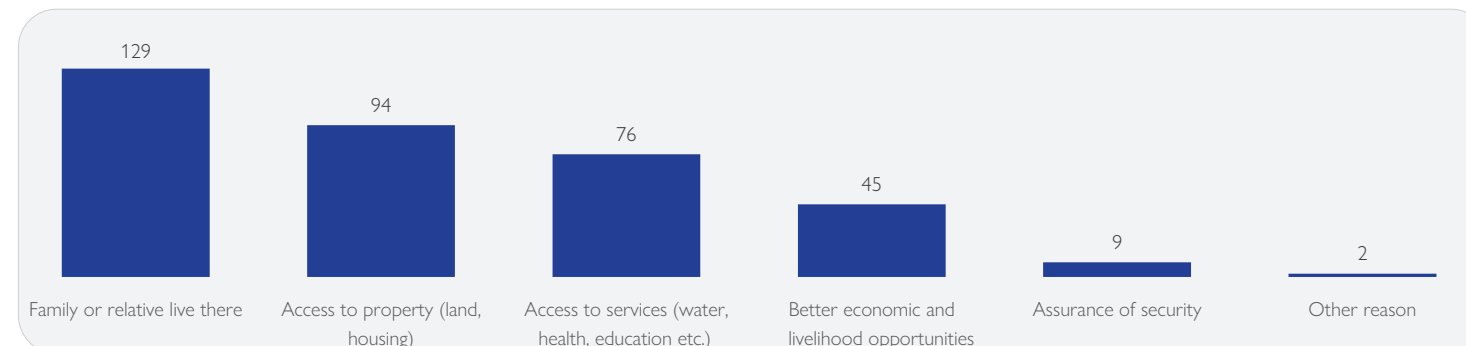
**53.4%** (348 households) intend to return to their areas of origin (39.1%) or other areas within South Sudan (14.3%) with more than half reporting Upper Nile (50.7%) as the state of intended return.



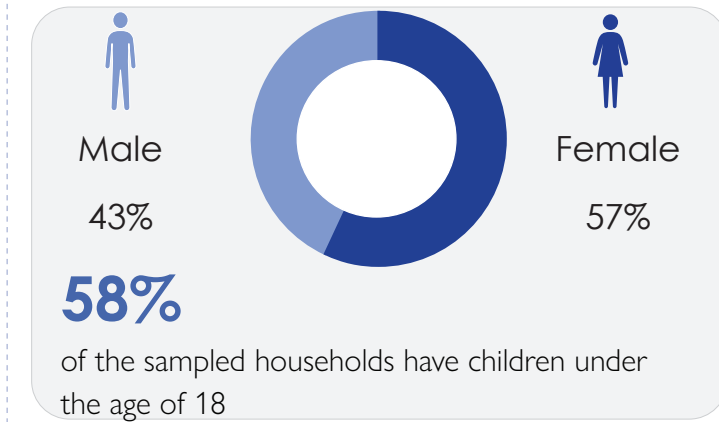
**39.7%** of respondents who reported they intend to remain at the Renk TC for the short-term indicated the following reasons



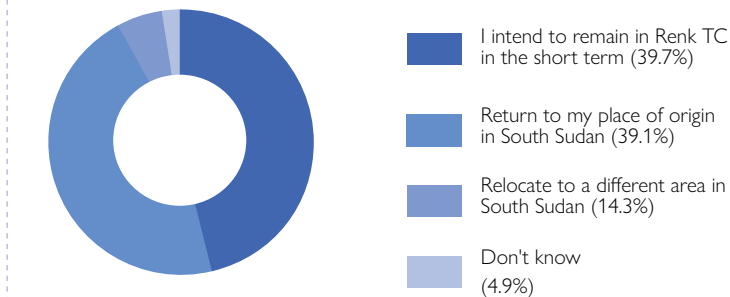
## Main reason for choice of destination (by number of households who intend to leave Renk TC)
