RUSH RENEW RIVALRY WITH STEELHEADS

The Rapid City Rush stay at home to wrap up their first of three five-game homestands this weekend against the Idaho Steelheads. The Steelheads have lost a lot of familiar faces to call-ups and recalls, including Mark Rassell who has enjoyed a scoring tear with the Calgary Wranglers. The Rush took three of six possible points from the Steelheads in the last series between these two teams and earned their first win in Boise in over two years.

BIG BLUELINE GUYS

The Rush received the services of Jarrod Gourley and Will Riedell via assignment from the Wranglers this week. Rapid City has recently been shorthanded on the blueline and have been forced to play with 12 forwards and five defenseman eight times since the mid-December road trip. The Rush will be without both Kenton Helgesen and TJ Fergus on the backend as they have both been placed on the injured reserve list.

INC-RAD-IBLE

Matt Radomsky is once against expected to shoulder most of the workload in net after Connor Murphy was recalled by the Wranglers on Thursday afternoon. Radomsky is 10-9-2 this season and has made more starts than any other goaltender for the Rush this year, including four consecutive starts since January 7. Jason Pawloski is 2-1-0, but earned a win over Idaho on December 16 in Boise.

CAN YOU FEEL THE POWER

The Rush scored four powerplay goals against Fort Wayne in three games this past week. The powerplay explosion helped propel the Rush to a 9-5 drubbing of the Komets on Saturday night, making it the fourth time this season the Rush have scored eight or more goals. R.C. has won each of those contests this season by four or more goals.

QUICK HITTERS

HOME COOKING

The Rush started the season 0-7-1-0 at home this year, however, since December the team is 8-1-0-0 at home with only a single loss to Fort Wayne last Friday. The Rush won 20 games at home last season, a franchise best since joining the ECHL in 2014-15. The Rush are an even 3-3-0 in January since going 8-4-1 in December.

LO-GO!

Logan Nelson's three-point night against Fort Wayne on Saturday catapulted him to 398 career professional points. Nelson, a Minnesota-native, has played all of his pro career in North America and was drafted by the NHL's Buffalo Sabres. Nelson is also set to become just the sixth player in Rush history (CHL and ECHL) to play 200 games in a Rush uniform.

DU YOU BELIEVE WHAT YOU JUST SAW?

Rookie forward Mark Duarte had a career-high offensive output vs. Fort Wayne on Saturday night. Duarte was named the game's first star with two goals and two assists. Duarte was red-hot to open the season, keeping pace with Blake Bennett for the team lead in goals through November. However, an AHL recall for Duarte did not allow for him to continue his scoring run. Duarte was an OHL prospect last season with the Soo Greyhounds before earning his AHL deal with the Calgary Wranglers.

CLOSER THAN YOU THINK

The Rush are locked in at fourth in ECHL's Mountain Division with Allen one point behind and Tulsa one point ahead. The Idaho Steelheads have maintained an iron grasp on second place in the division, but the Rush can close the deficit to within a single-digit point total this weekend. The Steelheads are shorthanded without Mark Rassell and Keaton Mastrodonato both currently skating in the AHL. Rassell, a Calgary-area native, is currently playing with the Calgary Wranglers.

"I'LL DO THAT ANY DAY"

Some Rush players had the opportunity to visit with individuals at the Northern Hills Training Center in Spearfish on Thursday afternoon. NHTC helps individuals with cognitive disabilities learn vocational trades, gain employment, and work towards self-sufficiency. The Rush got to take photos, give a short presentation, and play a few rounds of cornhole with people who use the services of the facility. Logan Nelson, Keanu Yamamoto, Tyson Helgesen and Matt Radomsky made the field trip.

"That's awesome... those people are just great," said Nelson. "I'll do that any day."

GETTING SOME MILEAGE

The Rush will embark on a six-game, 13-day, two-city road trip starting on Tuesday. Rapid City will meet Utah for the first time this season from Maverik Center on Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday and then pack up for Portland, Maine, to meet the Maine Mariners for the first time in franchise history.

RETIRED NUMBERS



SCOTT WRAY Retired: Saturday – April 4, 2015

Wray joined the Rush after spending two seasons with the rival Rocky Mountain Rage in the CHL. His first season in Rapid City was his best year of professional hockey with 31 goals, 47 assists and 78 points. That season, Wray would help lead Rapid City to their only hockey championship, winning the CHL Ray Miron Presidents Cup. Wray is the only Rush player to ever eclipse 100 goals with the franchise (106) and his 314 games played rank second in franchise history. In 2010-11 and from 2012-14, Wray served as the Rush captain. After his retirement in 2014, Wray was the head coach of the Powassan VooDoos of the NOJHL and is currently an assistant with the OHL's North Bay Battalion where he has been since 2017.



Retired: Saturday - March 31, 2018 **DANNY BATTOCHIO**

After a strong OHL career and three years at St. Francis Xavier University, Battochio joined the Rush and played every North American game of his career with the team. In 2010, he was named a CHL all-rookie team member and backstopped the Rush to a CHL title. With 131 career wins with Rapid City, no other goaltender has come close to the impact Battochio made during his tenure with the Rush. In every professional season, he posted a better-than-.900 save percentage and posted a winning record all but one season between the pipes. Still living in the Black Hills, Battochio has served as an emergency backup goaltender for the Rush in seasons past, donning his iconic number 30 each time.



RILEY WESELOWSKI Retired: Saturday - October 29, 2022

Touted out of Bemidii State, Weselowski began his career with the Idaho Steelheads before landing with the Rush in the 2009-10 season. A young bruiser on the 2010 championship team, he was awarded an "A" on his sweater in the 2011 season and became a fixture on the Rapid City blueline. He is the all-time leader in games played for the Rush with 571 appearances and has more penalty minutes than any other Rush player with 440. Weselowski would finish his playing career in Florida and then Wichita before hanging up his skates. He is now the assistant coach for the Kansas City Mavericks and coached against the Rush on the night of his jersey retirement.

HEAD COACH, SCOTT BURT

MACKENZIE, B.C. | FEBRUARY 2, 1977 | 3RD SEASON AS HEAD

Scott Burt was named head coach and director of hockey operations of the Rapid City Rush on July 7, 2021.

In his first season as head coach, Burt led the Rush to a record of 36-25-6-5, and an ECHL-era franchise record 83 points, as well as the first Kelly Cup Playoff appearance in seven years.

In June of 2022, Burt was promoted to head coach and general manager. The 2022-23 saw Burt lead the Rush to their second consecutive 30-win season with a record of 33-34-5-0, but the Rush missed the playoffs by a mere three points

Prior to joining the Rush, Burt was the assistant coach of the Idaho Steelheads for two years. Before that, he spent six seasons as the assistant coach of the Spokane Chiefs in the WHL. In Spokane, Burt coached alongside Don Nachbaur, a former assistant coach with the NHL's Los Angeles Kings and current assistant coach with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers, and Dan Lambert, a former assistant coach of the NHL's Nashville Predators. The Chiefs made the playoffs in five of his six seasons in Spokane and advanced to the Western Conference Finals in 2019.

Burt's coaching career began with the ECHL's Alaska Aces as an assistant coach for a pair of seasons from 2011 to 2013. There, the former Aces Captain made playoffs in both of his seasons on the bench, reaching the 2012 Kelly Cup Playoffs Western Conference Finals and 2013 Western Conference Semifinals. He also helped coach the Aces to a 2013 Brabham Cup regular season championship with an ECHL-best 49-15-4-4 record and 106 standings points.

A native of Mackenzie, British Columbia Burt began coaching after 13 seasons as a forward in the WCHL, ECHL, and AHL. All but three seasons of his career were played in the ECHL with the Idaho Steelheads, Utah Grizzlies, and Alaska Aces, amassing career totals of 149 goals, 207 assists, 356 points, and 1,067 PIM in 586 ECHL games. As a player, Burt made the playoffs in all but two of his 13 seasons, played for his league championship on six different occasions, and twice was named the captain of his team, rotating as Steelheads Captain in 2007 while also serving as Aces Captain from 2009 to 2011. Burt is a three-time Kelly Cup Champion, one of only six people with his name on the ECHL's most coveted prize three times, winning titles with Idaho in 2004 and 2007, and in his final professional season with the Aces in 2011.

Overall, in his 13-year playing career in the ECHL, Burt recorded 203 goals, 259 assists, 461 points, and 1,266 PIM in 739 games. In his full career Burt dressed for the Toledo Storm, Wheeling Nailers, Alaska Aces, and Idaho Steelheads in both the ECHL and WCHL.

- Burt was a WHL prospect who played with Seattle, Swift Current, Edmonton, and Red Deer. In his junior career he was teammates with future-NHLers Jan Hrdina (Seattle), Brent Sopel (Swift Current), and Arron Asham (Red Deer). He finished juniors with 254 games played, 85 goals, 87 assists, and 172 points.
- He is a three-time ECHL Kelly Cup champion... 2004 and 2007 with the Idaho Steelheads, and 2011 with the Alaska Aces.
- Served two seasons as assistant coach in Alaska (2011-13) before joining the WHL's Spokane Chiefs as an assistant. While in Spokane, he helped develop current NHL talent in Kailer Yamamoto (SEA), Luke Toporowski (BOS), and Ty Smith (PIT). He returned to the ECHL as Idaho's assistant coach for one season (2019-20) before accept the head coaching job in Rapid City.
- Married to his wife Audrey, a former Food Network personality. They have one daughter, Sophie.





ASST. COACH, PETER DRIKOS

MISSISSAUGA, ONT. | FEBRUARY 15, 1986 | 1st Season as a.c.

Peter Drikos joins the Rush for his first season behind the bench as assistant coach.

Drikos most recently served as the Cobourg Cougars (OJHL) head coach and general manger, capping off his eighth season of coaching Canadian juniors—five of them spent as head coach.

After playing for his hometown AAA U18 team, Drikos began a four-year OPJHL career that spanned from 2003-07. In 2006, he helped lead the St. Michael's Buzzers to their second consecutive OPJHL championship.

In 2008-09, Drikos dressed in Canada's CIS league for Ryerson University and then began his professional playing career.

Drikos' best season of hockey came in 2009-10 with the West Michigan Blizzard in the All-American Hockey League. That season, he logged five goals and 20 assists. tying him for third place on the team in the category.

During the 2010-11 season, Drikos joined the FHL's Akwesasne Warriors and won a Commissioner's Cup title.

During the 2011-12 season, Drikos played earned him a three-game loan to the SPHL's Mississippi RiverKings.

After a short hiatus from the game, the OJHL's Toronto Patriots tabbed Drikos to be an assistant coach. After two seasons as an assistant (one with Toronto and one with the Orangeville Flyers), he was hired as the head coach of the Brampton Bombers, a post he would hold for two seasons.

Drikos would also join the Milton Menace staff as an assistant for one season in 2019-20 before re-joining the Toronto Patriots staff as their head coach the following year. After two seasons in Toronto, Drikos accepted the general manager and head coach role in Cobourg.

Drikos is a native of Mississauga, Ontario, who officially arrived in Rapid City on September 12, 2023.
