### Friday's Matchup

It's the second of a three-game series between the Grizzlies and Steelheads. It's the eleventh of 14 meetings this season between the clubs. For the Grizzlies it's the second game of six straight at home. It's the final homestand of the regular season. 5 of the final 7 games in the regular season will be at Maverik Center, where Utah is 19-10-2 on the season, outscoring teams 104 to 94. Utah is 10-0 at home when leading after 1 period and 12-1 when leading after 2 frames. Utah is 7-1-2 at home in one-goal games. The Grizz have outscored opponents 44 to 28 in the third periods over their last 29 games.

**Dylan Fitze** has scored 11 goals and 7 assists over his last 16 games. Brandon Cutler has a point in 6 of his last 7 games (3 goals, 7 assists). Utah is 6-0-3 in games decided past regulation. Utah is 21-4-2 when scoring first this season.

### Grizzlies Sign Defenseman Luc Salem, Forward Blake Wells

The Utah Grizzlies signed forward **Blake Wells** on March 29<sup>th</sup> and defenseman **Luc Salem** on March 28<sup>th</sup>. **Wells** started his college career at UMass-Lowell and in 4 seasons from 2019-2023 he scored 7 goals and 11 assists. Wells had a +13 combined rating in 4 seasons at UMass-Lowell, including a +11 season in the 2021-22 campaign. Wells was an assistant captain during the 2022-23 season. He transferred to American International College (AIC) and had 4 goals and 6 assists and a +3 rating in 32 games during the 2023-24 season.

Wells will wear number 54 for the Grizzlies,

**Salem** played his college hockey at St. Lawrence University. In 4 college seasons he scored 18 goals and 37 assists in 128 games. Salems best statistical season came as junior, where he led his team with 10 goals and 17 assists in 36 games during the 2022-23 season. Salem led the team with a +12 rating in the 2022-23 campaign. Luc was the captain during his senior 2023-24 season, where he scored 3 goals and 5 assists in 38 games. Salem resides in Santa Monica, California. He will wear number 5 for the Grizzlies.

### **Grizzlies Among League Leaders**

**Brandon Cutler** is tied for 5<sup>th</sup> in the league with 31 goals this season. He is 2<sup>nd</sup> in shots on goal with 249. **Brett Stapley** has 11 points (4 goals, 7 assists) in his last 7 games. Stapley tied for 7th in the league with 67 points (22 goals, 45 assists). The 45 assists are 7<sup>th</sup> best in the league.

**Josh Wesley** leads the league in goals among defensemen with 17. Wesley leads league defensemen with 7 power play goals and is 3<sup>rd</sup> among defensemen with 170 shots on goal. **Kyle Mayhew** is 6th among league defensemen with 50 points. The 50 points for Mayhew lead all rookie defensemen. Mayhew is 3<sup>rd</sup> among league rookies with 15 power play assists.

### Shots, Shots, Shots, Shots, Shots, Shots, Everybody (Lil Jon's Voice)

The Grizzlies took a season high 58 shots, including 28 in the third period in their 4-3 loss against the Rapid City Rush. The 58 shots tie for a league lead in a game this season (Idaho had 58 shots on November 15, 2023). The 28 shots in the third period is the most Utah has taken in a single period this season. The previous high in a game this season was a 51-shot effort in a 3-2 loss at Allen on December 1. Utah is 11-9-1 when outshooting opponents this season and they are 18-22-2 when they have been outshot.

### Brandon Cutler Joins Grizzlies 30 Goal Club

Brandon Cutler scored his 30<sup>th</sup> goal of the season on March 18<sup>th</sup> vs Norfolk. Cutler is the first Grizzly to reach 30plus goals since Caleb Herbert tallied 32 goals for the 2018-19 club. Current Grizzlies Head Coach Ryan Kinasewich is the only player to have multiple 30 plus goal seasons in team history.

### Military Night Miracle at Maverik Center

On March 16<sup>th</sup> the Utah Grizzlies overcame a 4-1 deficit late in regulation as they scored 3 goals in 68 seconds to tie the game. Kyle Mayhew scored a 5 on 3 power play goal 17:03 in. 48 seconds later Dylan Fitze scored a 5 on 4 power play goal to make it a one goal game. Just 20 seconds later it was Grizzlies captain Josh Wesley who scored on a one-timer from the slot to tie the game 18:11 in. Wesley scored the overtime game winner on a power play 1:30 in. An outstanding crowd of 8562 saw the game on Military Night presented by Mountainland Supply Company. Josh Wesley scored 2 goals and 1 assist on the night. Kyle Mayhew had 1 goal and 2 assists. Cole Gallant had 1 goal and 1 assist. Brett Stapley had 3 assists, including the main assist on the overtime game winner.

#### Great Crowds at Maverik Center

A big crowd of 8562 on Military Night saw the Grizzlies win a 5-4 overtime thriller. It was the 6<sup>th</sup> time this season the Grizzlies had a crowd of over 8000. Utah has had 8 games with over 7600 fans at Maverik Center. For the season Utah is averaging 5,836 fans per game and they are on pace to have the largest average attendance since the 2002-03 season when the AHL's Grizzlies averaged 6,353 per game.

### Tyler Penner Appeared in his 209th Straight Regular Season Game

Grizzlies' ironman Tyler Penner appeared in his 200<sup>th</sup> straight regular season game on March 8 vs Rapid City. Penner has 33 goals and 41 assists in his Grizzlies career. Penner is in his third season with the Grizzlies. He played with the Birmingham Bulls in the SPHL in the 2020-21 season. Penner played his college hockey at Colgate University from 2016-2020. Penner's current streak is at 209 straight regular season games and 233 games including playoffs. Penner had 2 assists in Utah's 5-2 victory over Norfolk on March 17.

### Utah Has Had Success at Home

The Grizzlies will be home for 5 of their final 8 games of the 2023-24 regular season. The Grizzlies are 19-10-2 at home this season. They have outscored opponents 104 to 94 at Maverik Center this season. 40 of Utah's 61 standings points have come at home. Utah's penalty kill is 7<sup>th</sup> in the league at home (77 for 93, 82.8 %). Utah is 10-0 at home when leading after 1 period and 12-1 when leading after 2 periods. The Grizz are 7-1-2 at home in one goal games.

**Garrett Metcalf** – Goaltender of the Week (October 19-22, 2023). Metcalf was named Warrior Hockey ECHL Goaltender of the Week after earning his first pro career regular season shutout and the first shutout in the league this season. Metcalf saved all 35 shots in a 1-0 win on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. He had 1 shutout at Mercyhurst College in the 2018-19 season. Metcalf also had a 39 save shutout vs Idaho in the Grizzlies 6-0 preseason win on October 13, 2023. In 34 career games with Utah, he has a record of 16-12-2 with a .906 save percentage and a 3.05 Goals Against Average.

Alex Beaucage – Player of the Week (March 4-10, 2024). Beaucage scored two goals and added four assists for six points in two games against Rapid City that week. The 22-year-old had an assist in a 3-2 overtime loss on March 8<sup>th</sup> before notching five points (2g-3a), including the overtime game-winning goal, in a 5-4 victory on March 9<sup>th</sup>.

### Staff for 2023-2024 Season

Ryan Kinasewich enters his third season as Grizzlies Head Coach/General Manager. Kinasewich led the Grizzlies to a 42-27-2-1 record, winning the Mountain Division title for the first time in team history. Christian Horn is the new Grizzlies assistant coach. Last season Horn was an assistant coach with the EIHL's Cardiff Devils. Horn played with Utah in the final game of the 2019-2020 season, scoring 1 goal at Rapid City on March 7, 2020. Horn played in 24 games with Utah in the 2020-2021 season, scoring 2 goals and 5 assists. Jaxson Hibbard is the first year Head Equipment Manager after spending the past 2 seasons as Assistant Equipment Manager. Collin Lee will be in his fourth year as Grizzlies Athletic Trainer. Broadcaster Tyson Whiting begins his sixth season as the "Voice of the Grizzlies".

Dylan was a key contributor in the second half of the season as he scored 23 points (9 goals, 14 assists) in the final 27 games of the regular season. Fitze tied for the team lead with 3 goals in the 2023 Kelly Cup Playoffs. He is currently in AHL camp with the Manitoba Moose.




