MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

June 28, 2012

The meeting convened at 9:35 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. Lauren Cramer, the Intern for the summer, was introduced to the Commission.

<u>ITEM 1:</u> Tentative Agenda

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

<u>Decision:</u> The tentative agenda was approved with additions.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the May 17, 2012 Meeting

Discussion: The draft minutes of the May 17, 2012 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

Decision: The draft minutes were approved.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Executive Department, Comptroller's Office, Department of the Environment, Department of Health & Mental Hygiene, Injured Worker's Insurance Fund, Maryland Higher Education Commission, Department of Education, Department of Labor, Licensing & Regulation, Department of Transportation, Maryland Transportation Authority, State Highway Administration, Department of Business & Economic Development and St. Mary's College of Maryland. The Regulatory & Compliance Engineer position in the Department of the Environment, the Administrator II position in the Maryland Higher Education Commission and the Computer Network Specialist I position in the Department of Business & Economic Development position were discussed in detail.

<u>Decision:</u> The Regulatory & Compliance Engineer position in the Department of the Environment and the Administrator II position in the Maryland Higher Education Commission were not deleted from the financial disclosure listing. The Computer Network Specialist I position in the Department of Business & Economic Development position was not added to the financial disclosure listing. The Commission approved the remainder of Mr. Lord's recommendations.

ITEM 5: Local Government – Draft Ethics Laws – Counties

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed ethics laws, policies and regulations received from Baltimore County and Cecil County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed ethics laws, policies and regulations for Baltimore County and Cecil County.

<u>ITEM 6:</u> Local Government – Draft Ethics Laws – Municipalities

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair and Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the City of Crisfield, Town of Williamsport, Town of Poolesville, and the Town of Centreville.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the City of Crisfield, Town of Williamsport, Town of Poolesville, and the Town of Centreville.

ITEM 7: Local Government - Draft and Adopted Policies and Regulations - Boards of Education

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on the adopted ethics policies and regulations received from the Prince George's County Board of Education, Allegany County Board of Education, Howard County Board of Education, Charles County Board of Education, Kent County Board of Education, Cecil County Board of Education, Baltimore City Public Schools and Caroline County Board of Education.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the drafts and adopted ethics policies and regulations.

<u>ITEM 8:</u> Executive Director's Report – Assistant General Counsel's Departure

<u>Discussion</u>: There was a general discussion of the departure of Deadra Daly from the Ethics Commission, who has accepted a position as Ethics Counsel to the Maryland General Assembly.

ITEM 9: Executive Director's Report - Trainings

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on trainings conducted by the staff and the request from MTA to train all or most of its staff.

ITEM 10: Executive Director's Report - Status of Legislation

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the status of SB 920 which passed but did not include the provisions regarding the Ethics Commission and financial disclosure requirements. Further identified for the Commission were a number of issues that might be addressed by the workgroup created by SB 920. There has been no word as to when the workgroup will get started.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission decided that it will develop a position on issues considered by the workgroup as those issues come up, and discussions can occur among Commission members by conference call and email.

ITEM 11: Local Government – Town of Greensboro (11-0501)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the full exemption request received from the Town of Greensboro. Janet DeLude, Town Manager, spoke on behalf of the Town of Greensboro.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted a partial exemption permitting the Town of Greensboro not to adopt lobbying provisions. The Town of Greensboro must adopt conflicts of interest and financial disclosure provisions.

ITEM 12: Local Government – Town of Princess Anne (11-0489)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the continuation of a partial exemption request received from the Town of Princess Anne. Paul Wilbur, Town Attorney; Council President Haywood and Councilman Thomas spoke on behalf of the Town of Princess Anne.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted a partial exemption permitting the Town of Princess Anne not to adopt lobbying provisions. The Town of Princess Anne must adopt conflicts of interest and financial disclosure provisions.

ITEM_13: Local Government – Pocomoke City (11-0424)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the continuation of a partial exemption request received from Pocomoke City. Paul Wilbur, Esq. spoke on behalf of Pocomoke City.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted a partial exemption permitting Pocomoke City not to adopt lobbying provisions. Pocomoke City must adopt conflicts of interest and financial disclosure provisions.

<u>ITEM 14:</u> Local Government – Town of Pittsville (12-0084)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the full exemption request received from the Town of Pittsville. Paul Wilbur, Town Attorney, spoke on behalf of the Town of Pittsville.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted a full exemption for the Town of Pittsville.

ITEM 15: Local Government – Town of Delmar (12-0107)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the full exemption request received from the Town of Delmar.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted a partial exemption permitting the Town of Delmar not to adopt lobbying provisions. The Town of Delmar must adopt conflicts of interest and financial disclosure provisions.

ITEM 16: Local Government – Town of Williamsport (12-0090)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the continuation of a partial exemption request received from the Town of Williamsport.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted a partial exemption permitting the Town of Williamsport not to adopt lobbying provisions. The Town of Williamsport must adopt conflicts of interest and financial disclosure provisions.

ITEM 17: Local Government – Town of Mardela Springs (12-0089)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the full exemption request received from the Town of Mardela Springs.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted a full exemption for the Town of Mardela Springs.

ITEM 18: Local Government – Town of Barnesville (12-0083)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a full exemption request or the continuation of a partial exemption request received from the Town of Barnesville.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted a full exemption for the Town of Barnesville.

<u>ITEM 19:</u> Continuation of Executive Director's Report – Local Government Conference

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on discussions with MACO, MML and MABE regarding hosting a local government conference.

<u>Decision</u>: The groups were interested in putting a conference together, possibly on a regional basis, in the Fall of 2013. The timing will allow discussion of any legislation that is generated in the 2013 Legislative Session following the efforts of the workgroup established by SB 920.

ITEM 20: Executive Director's Report – Records Retention

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on proposed changes to the Commission's record retention policy.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the proposed changes to the records retention policy.

ITEM 21: Executive Director's Report – Financial Disclosure Filing

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord asked the Commission to consider adopting a policy for addressing extensions to filers who are on extended leave, due to illness, military service or other reasons beyond their control.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission will adopt a policy whereby the decision whether to permit a public official to file a financial disclosure statement after the April 30 deadline (without being subject to enforcement action) is vested in the Executive Director.

ITEM 22: Local Government Matter – Formal Consideration of Exemption Requests

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on four new requests from municipalities seeking exemptions and requested that the Commission consider these requests at the September 13, 2012 meeting. The Commission received requests from the City of Westminster, the Town of Sharptown, the Town of Fairmount Heights, and the Town of Goldsboro.

ITEM 23: Proposed Changes to Commission's Regulations

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on proposed changes to the Commission's Financial Disclosure Regulations – Board and Commission Members; Secondary Employment and Financial Interest Exception Regulations; Participation Exception Regulations; and Activity Reports Regulations.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the draft regulations.

Meeting was closed at 11:30 a.m. to consider confidential advice matters.

ITEM 24: Draft Advisory Opinion – REQ-12-01r

Discussion: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the draft advisory opinion.

Decision: The Commission approved the draft advisory opinion.

ITEM 25: Informal Matter - Secondary Employment - Department of Human Resources (11-0591)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to be a direct care provider for a private organization that is regulated by DHR.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined this secondary employment is not allowable.

ITEM 26: Informal Matter – Secondary Employment - Department of Human Resources (12-0170)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue her employment as a therapist and consultant for a private mental health counseling practice.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 27: Informal Matters – Secondary Employment - Department of Human Resources (12-0229)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a sales associate at a department store.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 28: Informal Matters – Secondary Employment – State Highway Administration (12-0228)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the State Highway Administration wanting to continue working as an alarm monitor for a private security company.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 29: Informal Matters – Financial Interest – Department of Health & Mental Hygiene (12-0253)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on a financial interest request regarding a DHMH employee's attributable interest in a proposed assisted living facility which DHMH regulates.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined this financial interest is allowable under the financial interest exception criteria in the Commission's regulations.

<u>ITEM 30:</u> Informal Matters – Secondary Employment - Department of the Environment (12-0232)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of the Environment wanting to work as a field inspector for a research group conducting research and data collection at a Department of the Environment facility.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that this secondary employment is not allowable.

<u>ITEM 31:</u> Informal Matters – Secondary Employment - Department of the Environment (12-0233)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of the Environment wanting to work as a field inspector for a research group conducting research and data collection at a Department of the Environment facility.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that this secondary employment is not allowable.

ITEM 32: Informal Matters – Post-Employment – Maryland Transit Administration (12-0252)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on a post-employment request regarding an employee in the Maryland Transit Administration wanting to be a maintenance fleet manager with a private bus service.

Decision: The Commission determined this post-employment activity is not allowable.

<u>ITEM 33:</u> Informal Matters – Post-Employment – Maryland Transit Administration (12-0252)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on a post-employment request regarding a former employee of the Maryland Transit Administration wanting to be an executive director for a county transit system.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined this post-employment activity is allowable.

ITEM 34: Informal Matter – Procurement Memo Update

Discussion: Mr. Lord presented changes to the Commission's informational memorandum on procurement.

Decision: The Commission approved the changes proposed.

ITEM 35: Informal Matter – Lobbyist Registration Exemption (12-0262)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Daly briefed the Commission on an existing, but seldom cited exemption from lobbying regulation in certain circumstances for trustees, administrators or faculty members.

Decision: The Commission reconfirmed its previous position.

ITEM 36: Informal Matter – Event Tickets

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair advised the Commission of a situation where a public official was offered tickets to a sporting event and sought guidance from the Commission.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission agreed that, if the source of the tickets was not a controlled donor, it was not prohibited for a public official to accept them under the gift provisions.

(Mr. Lord, Mr. Colquhoun, Ms. Whitehead and Ms. Schutz participated in the briefings but did not participate in the decisions regarding items 37 through 44.)
