MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

October 24, 2013 - VIA TELEPHONE CONFERENCE CALL

The telephone conference call meeting convened at 9:30 a.m. Commission staff participated in the call at the Commission's offices in Annapolis.

<u>ITEM 1</u>: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

<u>Decision:</u> The tentative agenda was approved with additions.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the September 12, 2013 Meeting

<u>Discussion:</u> The draft minutes of the September 12, 2013 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

<u>Decision:</u> The draft minutes were approved as adjusted.

ITEM 3: Commission Meeting Dates for Calendar Year 2014

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission meetings scheduled for calendar year 2014 are January 16, March 6, May 15, June 26, September 11, October 30 and December 11.

ITEM 4: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Executive Department, Department of Business & Economic Development, Department of Housing & Community Development, Chesapeake Employers' Insurance Company, Department of Transportation, Maryland Transportation Authority, University of Maryland College Park, University of Maryland-Baltimore, Frostburg State University, Bowie State University, College of Southern Maryland, Salisbury University, Anne Arundel Community College and Howard Community College.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

ITEM 5: Board and Commission Executive Unit Determinations

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the following list as to whether or not they should be considered an executive unit covered by the Ethics Law:

State Advisory Council on Quality Care at the End of Life
Technology Assistance Program Advisory Council
Maryland Commission for Effective Community Inclusion of Individuals with Intellectual
& Developmental Disabilities
Maryland Veterans Trust

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined the State Advisory Council on Quality Care at the End of Life and the Maryland Veterans Trust should be considered executive units covered by the Public Ethics Law.

The Commission determined that the Technology Assistance Program Advisory Council and the Maryland Commission for Effective Community Inclusion of Individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Board were not executive units covered by the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 6: Chesapeake Employers' Insurance Company and Injured Workers' Insurance Fund

<u>Discussion:</u> There was a discussion regarding the status of the employees who will remain under the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund ("IWIF") and will be involved in lobbying activities for the new organization, Chesapeake Employers' Insurance Company ("Chesapeake"), and a discussion concerning the status of the Board of Directors, formerly with IWIF and now managing Chesapeake.

<u>Decision:</u> With respect to the lobbying activities of IWIF personnel on behalf of Chesapeake, the Commission agreed with Chesapeake's proposed legislative change to address the current prohibition in the Public Ethics Law on employees of the State also serving as lobbyists. With respect to the status of Chesapeake's Board, the Commission agreed with the staff recommendation that the Board is not an executive unit.

ITEM 7: Financial Disclosure Exemption Request

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Maryland State Department of Education Dispute Resolution Workgroup, Workgroup Created by the Council for the Procurement of Health, Education and Social Services, Task Force on Juvenile Court Jurisdiction, Task Force to Study Housing and Supportive Services for Unaccompanied Homeless Youth, Task Force to Study Food Allergy Awareness, Food Safety, and Food Service Facility, and the Workgroup on Cancer Clusters and Environmental Causes of Cancer requests for exemptions from the financial disclosure requirement.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved exemptions for the Maryland State Department of Education Dispute Resolution Workgroup, Workgroup Created by the Council for the Procurement of Health, Education and Social Services, Task Force on Juvenile Court Jurisdiction, Task Force to Study Housing and Supportive Services for Unaccompanied Homeless Youth, Task Force to Study Food Allergy Awareness, Food Safety, and Food Service Facility, and the Workgroup on Cancer Clusters and Environmental Causes of Cancer.

ITEM 8: Executive Director's Report – Executive Department Classification Study

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Classification Study to be conducted by the Department of Budget and Management for 7 staff positions at the Ethics Commission.

The meeting was closed at 10:10 a.m. to consider confidential informal advice matters.

<u>ITEM 9:</u> Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (13-0370)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the State Highway Administration working as a bookkeeper for a private company.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 10: Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (13-0341)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources working as a family service coordinator and mental health therapist for a private foundation.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 11: Informal Advice – Gift Exceptions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on proposed guidance to be used when a staff member accompanies an official to a ticketed event or participates on a panel or speaking engagement.

Decision: The Commission approved the guidance to be provided in future circumstances.

<u>ITEM 12:</u> Special Informational Memorandum – Gift Law Memo

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on proposed changes to the gift law informational memorandum concerning bonus program points.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the changes to the memorandum.

ITEM 13: Informal Matter – MdTA Procurement

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a request made by the MdTA for guidance concerning the application of procurement restrictions to contractors engaged in preliminary work in connection with the Governor Harry W. Nice Memorial Bridge Improvement Project.

The Commission agreed, consistent with past practice in such matters, to request the agency to submit a request or requests to the Commission for informal advice with respect to those tasks the agency believes satisfy an exception to the procurement restrictions, with full justification for the agency's position.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the status of the counties and municipalities certification requirements of the Public Ethics Law as reflected in letters sent to the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from Wicomico County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations.

<u>ITEM 17:</u> Local Government – Town of Chesapeake Beach (13-0323)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the Town of Chesapeake Beach.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission did not approve all of the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations.
