MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

February 27, 2014

The meeting convened at 9:30 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. New member, Martin G. Madden, was introduced to the Commission.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

Department of Planning, Department of Information Technology, Department of Housing & Community Development, Treasurer's Office, Maryland School for the Deaf, Department of Transportation, Maryland Transportation Authority, State Highway Administration, University of Maryland College Park, University of Baltimore, University of Maryland-Baltimore, Montgomery College, Frostburg State University, Anne Arundel Community College, Prince George's Community College and the Public Service Commission.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

The Commission denied an exemption for Commission to Coordinate the Study, Commemoration, and Impact of Slavery's History and Legacy in Maryland.

Mr. Lord will draft an informational memo for the next meeting for review by the Commission which will explain the existing position, and which can be published on the Commission's website if the Commission determines to continue with the existing position.
