## MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

**September 18, 2014**

The meeting convened at 9:30 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis.

The Commission welcomed new staff member, Stephen Clark, as the Financial Disclosure Compliance Officer.

ITEM 1: Annual Election of Chairman (July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Vettori was unanimously elected chairman for another one-year term.

**ITEM 2**: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

<u>Decision:</u> The tentative agenda was approved with changes.

ITEM 3: Minutes of the June 26, 2014 and July 2, 2014 Meetings

<u>Discussion:</u> The draft minutes of the June 26, 2014 and July 2, 2014 meetings were reviewed and discussed.

<u>Decision:</u> The draft minutes were approved as adjusted.

ITEM 4: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Department of Health & Mental Hygiene, Department of Housing & Community Development, State Highway Administration, Maryland Health Benefit Exchange, Maryland Insurance Administration, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Business & Economic Development, State Retirement Agency, Military Department, Department of Transportation, Maryland Aviation Administration, Maryland Transportation Authority, University of Maryland College Park, University of Maryland Baltimore, Anne Arundel Community College and Bowie State University.

Decision: The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

ITEM 5: Boards and Commissions – Executive Unit Determinations

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the following list as to whether or not each should be considered an executive unit covered by the Public Ethics Law:

Maryland Health Care Commission Health Care Provider-Carrier Workgroup Retail Energy Supplier Consumer Protection Workgroup Board of Nursing Rehabilitation Committees Electrology Practice Committee Maryland E-Nnovation Initiative Fund Authority

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that the Maryland Health Care Commission Health Care Provider-Carrier Workgroup and the Retail Energy Supplier Consumer Protection Workgroup were not executive units covered by the Public Ethics Law.

The Commission determined the Board of Nursing Rehabilitation Committees, the Electrology Practice Committee and the Maryland E-Nnovation Initiative Fund Authority should be considered executive units and their members are public officials subject to the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 6: Financial Disclosure Exemption Request

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Task Force to Study How to Improve Student Achievement in Middle School, Maryland College and Career-Ready Standards and Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers Implementation Review Workgroup, Maryland Higher Education Commission Advisory Councils, Procurement Advisory Council, Task Force to Study State Lottery Revenue, Amusement Game Advisory Committee, Charitable Protection and Enforcement Workgroup, Behavioral Health Integration Stakeholder Workgroup, State Early Childhood Advisory Council, State Department of Assessments and Taxation Workgroup to Examine Issues Related to the Property Assessment Process, and the Workgroup to Study Appropriate National Safety Standards for Mixing, Reconstituting, and other Similar Acts under the Supervision of an Oncologist, Rheumatologist or Hematologist requests for exemptions from the financial disclosure requirement.

Decision: The Commission approved exemptions for all those boards and commissions listed above.

ITEM 7: Executive Director's Report – Proposed Legislation

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a number of issues, including the status of proposed legislation to make clear in the Law that informal advice matters must be treated with confidentiality, as the Commission's regulations currently provide; a proposal for setting Commission meeting dates in calendar year 2015; the status of the Commission's regulatory changes as required by 2014 legislation; and media reports on the staff's advice on a charitable giving matter.

ITEM 8: Local Government – Allegany County (14-0350)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from Allegany County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations.

ITEM 9: Local Government – Calvert County (14-0316)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from Calvert County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission did not approve the proposed draft ethics law as meeting all of the requirements of Subtitle 8 of the Public Ethics Law and COMAR 19A.04. The Commission directed staff to inform the Montgomery County Ethics Commission of two recommended changes to the proposed draft.

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Governor's Office who also works as a medical laboratory technologist.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 16:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (14-0299)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a home study coordinator for a private adoption company.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 17:</u> Informal Matter – Towson University (14-0275)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee at Towson University wanting to continue employment as an officer with a private events company that runs summer youth camps. He also holds an interest in the private events company that uses Towson University fields.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment and financial interest.

ITEM 18: Informal Matter – Department of Health & Mental Hygiene (14-0326)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Health & Mental Hygiene wanting to continue working as a consultant physician for a private treatment center.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.
