MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

December 11, 2014

The meeting convened at 9:40 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved with changes.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the October 30, 2014 Meeting

Discussion: The draft minutes of the October 30, 2014 meetings were reviewed and discussed.

Decision: The draft minutes were approved as adjusted.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Executive Department, the Department of Housing & Community Development, Department of the Environment, Maryland Health Benefit Exchange, Maryland Transportation Authority, University of Maryland College Park, University of Maryland Baltimore, University of Baltimore and Howard Community College.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

ITEM 4: Boards and Commissions – Executive Unit Determinations

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission as to whether or not the Behavior Analyst Rehabilitation Subcommittee should be considered an executive unit covered by the Public Ethics Law:

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that the Behavior Analyst Rehabilitation Subcommittee should be considered an executive unit and its members are public officials subject to the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 5: Financial Disclosure Exemption Request

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Task Force to Study Sports Injuries in High School Female Athletes' request for exemption from the financial disclosure requirement.

Decision: The Commission approved the exemption.

<u>ITEM 6:</u> Executive Director's Report – Proposed Regulations

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the proposed changes to its regulations which were approved by the Commission in September 2014. The comment period has closed and the Commission may review them for final approval on December 16, 2014. Mr. Lord proposed a conference call meeting on December 17, 2014, for the Commission to adopt the regulations.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the conference call for December 17, 2014.

The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting at 10:00 a.m. pursuant to §3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act to consider confidential advice matters per §5-303 of the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 7: Agency Advice – Proposed Legislation

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on advice requested by a State agency concerning legislation proposed by the agency and its impact on the Public Ethics Law.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission unanimously determined to advise the agency that it did not object to the agency's proposed legislation.

The meeting was reopened at 10:25 a.m.

ITEM 8: Local Government – Town of St. Michaels (14-0110)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the full exemption request from the Town of St. Michaels. Town Commissioner Ann Borders and Town Attorney Charles MacLeod appeared on behalf of the Town of St. Michaels. St. Michaels Commissioner Myers, and Town Manager Weissman were also present at the meeting.

Decision: The Commission determined to grant the full exemption for the Town of St. Michaels.

ITEM 9: Local Government – City of Westminster (12-0208)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a renewed request to set in for further review a previous request for a modification to the required conflict of interest and financial disclosure provisions of the City of Westminster's ethics law.

City Attorney Elissa Levan appeared on behalf of the City of Westminster.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined this matter will be reviewed at the February 12, 2015 meeting. Ms. Levan requested that the Commission make a record of the upcoming review. The Commission advised that the meeting will not be recorded by the Commission. The Commission advised Ms. Levan that the City of Westminster may bring a court reporter at the City's own expense.

ITEM 10: Local Government – Chesapeake Beach (12-0563)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the Town of Chesapeake Beach. Town Attorney Elissa Levan appeared on behalf of the Town.

Decision: The Commission approved the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations.

<u>Discussion:</u> There was a general discussion on the question of making the Local Government Status Report available on the Commission's website.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved making the Local Government Status Report available on the Commission's website.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the Frederick County Board of Education.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission approved the proposed and adopted ethics laws, policies and regulations.

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of the ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the City of Gaithersburg and noted the Commission may wish to reconsider an earlier decision declining to set in for further review a request by the City for a modification to the required conflict of interest and financial disclosure provisions. City Attorney Lynn Board appeared on behalf of the City of Gaithersburg

Decision: The Commission determined this matter will be reviewed at the February 12, 2015 meeting.

<u>ITEM 16:</u> Local Government – Town of Mount Airy (14-0420)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of the proposed changes to the ethics laws, policies and regulations received from the Town of Mount Airy.

The Montgomery County Ethics Commission exempted Montgomery County employees from the gift solicitation restrictions in any activities related to the solicitation of donations of leave from fellow employees pursuant to the Montgomery County Personnel Regulation 17-10. The Montgomery County Ethics Commission is required to report such waivers to the State Ethics Commission pursuant to the provisions of the Montgomery County Code.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission did not take any action on this matter and will file this information in the Montgomery County files in the Commission's office.

The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting at 11:50 a.m. pursuant to §3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act to consider confidential advice matters per §5-303 of the Public Ethics Law and confidential enforcement matters per §5-407 of the Public Ethics Law.
