MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

April 16, 2105

The meeting convened at 9:35 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved with changes.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the February 12, 2015 Meeting

<u>Discussion:</u> The draft minutes of the February 12, 2015 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

Decision: The draft minutes were approved as adjusted.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Department of Budget & Management, Department of Information Technology, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Assessments & Taxation, Department of Juvenile Services, Maryland Higher Education Commission, Injured Worker's Insurance Fund, Department of Transportation, Maryland Transportation Authority, Maryland Port Administration, University of Maryland-College Park, University of Maryland-Baltimore, University of Maryland-Eastern Shore, Anne Arundel Community College, Frederick Community College and Community College of Baltimore County.

Decision: The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

<u>ITEM 4:</u> Executive Director's Report – Draft Annual Report

<u>Discussion</u>: There was a general discussion of the draft Annual Report.

Decision: The draft Annual Report was approved.

<u>ITEM 5:</u> Executive Director's Report – Revised Gift Law Memorandum

Discussion: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on changes to the Gift Law memorandum.

Decision: The changes to the Gift Law memorandum were approved.

<u>ITEM 6</u>: Executive Director's Report – Mutual Fund Reporting

<u>Discussion:</u> There was a general discussion of mutual fund reporting on financial disclosure statements, and the advice staff has been providing concerning reporting of interests in instruments similar to mutual funds, including exchange-traded funds.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission directed the staff to contact offices that are more familiar with mutual funds and similar instruments to determine if additional exemptions from the financial disclosure reporting requirements are appropriate.

ITEM 7: Executive Director's Report – SAFE Program

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the SAFE Program which protects employees who are victims of domestic violence from disclosing their home addresses, permitting those who participate in the program to provide a PO Box instead. An issue has arisen concerning how an individual whose home address is protected under this Program should address the financial disclosure requirement to report real property interests.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission will address such circumstances if/when they arise on a case by case basis. In matters involving Members of the General Assembly, the Commission will defer to the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics per §5-304 of the Ethics Law.

ITEM 8: Executive Director's Report – Legislation Outcome

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the outcome of legislation involving the Public Ethics Law that was introduced in the 2015 General Assembly.

<u>ITEM 9:</u> Local Government – City of Gaithersburg (14-0419)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of the City of Gaithersburg's local ethics law.

<u>Decision:</u> General Counsel will send a letter stating the City of Gaithersburg is not in compliance and ask the City to advise the Commission of its plan for enactment of a compliant law for review at the next meeting.

ITEM 10: Local Government – Town of Hampstead (12-0441)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of the Town of Hampstead's local ethics laws since the Commission's Public Notice was issued.

<u>Decision:</u> General Counsel will update the Commission regarding this matter at the next meeting.

<u>Decision:</u> General Counsel will send a letter stating the Town of Mount Airy is not in compliance and ask the Town to advise the Commission of its plan for enactment of a compliant law for review at the next meeting.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of the City of Westminster's local ethics law.

<u>Decision:</u> General Counsel will send a letter stating the City of Westminster is not in compliance and ask the City to advise the Commission of its plan for enactment of a compliant law for review at the next meeting.

The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting at 10:15 a.m. pursuant to §3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act to consider confidential advice matters per §5-303 of the Public Ethics Law and confidential enforcement matters per §5-407 of the Public Ethics Law.

<u>ITEM 38</u>: Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (15-0072)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the secondary employment request from an employee in the Department of Human Resources who wants to continue the secondary employment with and financial interest in his private engineering technologies business.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the employee's continued secondary employment and financial interest under the Public Ethics Law.

<u>ITEM 39:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Housing & Community Development (15-0094)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on the secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Housing & Community Development who wants to continue employment as a member on a board of directors with an organization that provides housing and supportive services to adults and children with developmental disabilities.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 40:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (15-0116)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as an electronics associate in a department store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 41:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (15-0140)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a sales associate in a department store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 42: Informal Matter – Post-Employment (15-0143)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a post-employment request regarding a former employee in the Department of General Services who wants to work as either a broker/real estate agent or as an equity partner in a real estate company.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined the post-employment provisions of the Public Ethics Law do not prohibit either of these activities.

<u>ITEM 43:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Transportation (15-0134)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a financial interest request in which an employee in the Department of the Transportation requested guidance on whether or not he may lease office space in a commercial building he owns to a member of the Maryland General Assembly.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that this financial interest was not prohibited under the Public Ethics Law and provided additional participation and prestige of office guidance.

ITEM 44: Informal Matter – Procurement (15-0144)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a contractor that requested advice on the impact of the Ethics Law's procurement provision on its ability to participate as a company which intended to bid on a State project.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that the company was not precluded from bidding on a subsequent procurement related to the project in question.

<u>ITEM 45:</u> Informal Matter – Procurement (15-0145)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a contractor that requested advice on the impact of the Ethics Law's procurement provision on its ability to participate as a company which intended to bid on a State project.

Decision:	The Commission determined that the company	was not precluded from	bidding on a subsequent
