## MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

February 11, 2016

The meeting convened at 9:35 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

<u>ITEM 1</u>: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved with changes.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the December 17, 2015 Meeting

Discussion: The draft minutes of the December 17, 2015 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by him. The recommendations covered the Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce, Treasurer's Office, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Transportation, University of Maryland-Baltimore, College of Southern Maryland, Community College of Baltimore County and Morgan State University. There was a general discussion regarding the requirement for university coaches to file financial disclosure.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations. University coaches do not meet the requirements to file financial disclosure.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request from an employee in the Department of Human Resources who wants to continue employment as a facilitator in a sexual assault and spouse abuse resource center.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request from an employee in the Department of Human Resources who wants to continue employment as a social worker for a private health system.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 36:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0048)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request from an employee in the Department of Human Resources who wants to continue employment as a residential counselor at a private health system.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 37: Informal Matter – Sheriff's Office (15-0569)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a financial interest exception request regarding an employee in the Sheriff's Office who has an attributable financial interest in her spouse's business that is a vendor to the Sheriff's Office.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined the employee did not meet the requirements for a participation exception and directed Counsel to draft a non-participation agreement for the employee. The Commission determined that contingent on the execution of the nonparticipation agreement, they would approve the employee's attributable financial interest in her spouse's business.

ITEM 38: Informal Matter – Governor's Office (15-0054)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the status of this matter.

<u>ITEM 39:</u> Informal Matter – Elected Official (16-0035) Dr. Smyth did not participate in this matter.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on whether § 5-505 prohibits an elected official from accepting a gift of a signed guitar from a recording artist and received at a benefit concert that the elected official participated in.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined this is a ceremonial gift and is allowable under the gift exceptions.

ITEM 40: Executive Director's Report – Proposed Legislation

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on proposed legislation regarding bills affecting the Public Ethics Law, discussed the expected impact of those bills if enacted, and obtained the Commission's guidance on the approach to take on the bills. The bills include: SB 395 – Ethics – Local Government – Conflict of Interest and Financial Disclosure; HB 726 – Ethics - Reports of Regulated Lobbyist – Open Data Format and SB 194 – Ethics Commission, Commission on Judicial Disabilities, Judicial Ethics Committee and Joint Ethics Committee – Duties.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:00 p.m.
