June 16, 2016

The meeting convened at 9:37 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

<u>Decision:</u> The tentative agenda was approved with changes.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the April 14, 2016 Meeting

Discussion: The draft minutes of the April 14, 2016 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

ITEM 18: Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0183)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Tateyama briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a sales associate at a grocery store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 19:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0235)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Tateyama briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a sales associate at a retail store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 20:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0254)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Tateyama briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee of the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a sales associate at a convenience store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 21: Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0207)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a direct support professional with a private school.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 22:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (16-0206)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee of the Department of Human Resources to continue working as a therapist at a private psychology provider.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment with restrictions.

<u>ITEM 23:</u> Informal Matter – Maryland Association of Realtors (16-0152)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a request for an advisory opinion seeking a change to the Commission's long-standing position expressed in a previous advisory opinion which prohibits members of State regulatory boards from teaching licensing courses regulated by those boards. The Maryland Association of Realtors' Director of Regulatory Affairs was present and made a brief presentation to the Commission.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission after discussion did not grant the request to issue an advisory and determined not to alter its current position.

<u>ITEM 24:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (16-0201)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Tateyama briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene wanting to continue working as a physician at a hospital.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 25: Informal Matter – Governor's Office (16-0025)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Governor's Office wanting to continue to serve on a community college board of trustees.

Decision: The Commission approved the secondary employment with restrictions.

ITEM 26: Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (16-0217)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the State Highway Administration wanting to continue working for a real estate appraisal company.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 27:</u> Informal Matter – University of Maryland School of Medicine (16-0164) (Dr. Smyth did not participate in this matter.)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a financial interest exception request and secondary employment request regarding an employee of the University of Maryland School of Medicine wanting to retain an interest in a beverage company.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted the financial interest exception request and approved the secondary employment request with restrictions.

ITEM 28: Informal Matter – Maryland Innovation Initiative Board (16-0249)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a request from a member of one of the TEDCO Boards to retain a financial interest in a private entity that may seek funding from a separate TEDCO entity.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined to grant an exemption to allow the Board member to retain the financial interest pursuant to §5-209 of the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 29: Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (16-0171)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a post-employment request regarding a former employee of the State Highway Administration wanting to work for a private engineering contractor.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that the proposed employment would violate the provisions of the post-employment provisions of the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 30: Informal Matter – Maryland Department of the Environment (16-0184)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a request from a former employee of the Maryland Department of the Environment seeking post-employment guidance related to the former employee's ability to work on an upcoming matter for an energy company.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined to that the post-employment restrictions of the Public Ethics Law do not prohibit the former employee from working on a future application submitted by the energy company.

<u>ITEM 31:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (16-0238)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on previously issued staff advice on prestige of office and participation given to an employee of the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation in a matter relating to realty property owned by his wife.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the previously provided Staff advice.

ITEM 32: Informal Matter – Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (16-0244)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a participation exception request from an employee of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services regarding participation in matters involving a contracting company where he has a qualifying relative employed by a subsidiary of that entity.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that the employee met the regulatory criteria to allow a participation exception and granted the exception. The Commission will also provide the employee with guidance on the remaining conflict of interest provisions.

ITEM 33: Informal Matter – Governor's Office (16-0250)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair and Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the application of the prestige of office provision to an official seeking to participate in a charitable fundraising activity.

Decision: The Commission approved the proposed staff advice.

<u>ITEM 34:</u> Informal Matter – Governor's Office (16-0242)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on advice provided to an employee of the Governor's Office regarding participation restrictions

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission provided confirmation of the Staff advice.

ITEM 35: Executive Director's Report – Proposed Regulation Changes

Discussion: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on this matter.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed Regulation changes.

ITEM 36: Executive Director's Report – Bi-County Commissions

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on an inconsistency in the Ethics Law pertaining to the filing of financial disclosure statements by Bi-County Commission members and candidates. Mr. Lord suggested a possible change to the Law to make the filing process consistent and advised he was seeking comments from the commissions and affected counties.

Decision: The Commission approved the proposal to seek a change to the Law to address the inconsistency.

ITEM 37: Executive Director's Report –Local Government

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on matters relating to certain local government compliance matters.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:29 p.m.

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
