ITEM 26: Local Government - Baltimore City Public Schools

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on proposed amendments to the previously approved local ethics law for the Baltimore City Public Schools.

Decision: The Commission approved the proposed amendments.

**ITEM 27:** Adoption of Proposed Regulations

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the proposed regulation changes that were published in the Maryland Register dated April 28, 2017.

Decision: The Commission adopted the regulations as proposed.

ITEM 28: Discussion of Proposed Regulation Changes

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the proposed regulation changes as a result of enactment of HB 879 (Public Integrity Act of 2017) and HB 143 (Elections – Miscellaneous Duties and Procedures).

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed regulation changes.

The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting at 12:30 p.m. pursuant to §3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act to consider confidential advice matters per §5-303 of the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 29: Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (17-0168)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue employment as a customer service associate at a food store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 30:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Resources (17-0179)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue to work as an IT agent with a department store.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

ITEM 31: Informal Matter - Department of Human Resources (17-0196)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working in the local post office.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 32:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Health & Mental Hygiene (17-0203)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Health & Mental Hygiene wanting to continue as a medical consultant with a non-profit health care facility.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 33:</u> Informal Matters – Department of Human Resources (17-0156)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Human Resources wanting to continue working as a life skills tutor with a family crisis center.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 34:</u> Informal Matter – Maryland Health Care Commission (17-0204)

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on staff advice provided to a member of the Maryland Health Care Commission who wanted to serve as a temporary county health officer.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission concurred in the advice provided by staff and determined that time-sensitive advice requests that do not require a Commission determination and do not involve sensitive issues should

be addressed by Commission staff in accordance with long-standing practice.

ITEM 35: Informal Matter – Department of Housing & Community Development (17-0200)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Housing & Community Development who wants to serve as a member of an electric cooperative and if elected wants to serve as chair.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission granted an exception to allow the secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 36:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Housing & Community Development (17-0167)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Housing & Community Development who wants to continue working as an instructor with an institute for public procurement and also as an instructor for a program management institute.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission declined to grant an exception to allow outside employment as an instructor with an entity that trains employees from the employee's State agency. The Commission approved the secondary employment as an instructor for the program management institute that does not provide training for agency employees.

ITEM 37: Informal Matter – Department of Natural Resources (17-0210)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the application of the conflict of interest provisions to an individual who is currently an honorary member on a Department of Natural Resources board.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined that an honorary member of the board is not a "public official" for the purposes of the Public Ethics Law.

ITEM 38: Informal Matter – Prince George's County Zoning Law (17-0171)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a request for advice concerning whether the prohibition on participation by a member of the Prince George's County Council is triggered by contributions made during the 36-month time period to a State Delegate's campaign committee, before the requester actually becomes a candidate for the County Council.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission determined a contribution by an applicant within 36 months of filing an application to an individual who holds elective office other than the County Council, who subsequently becomes a candidate for the County Council, and is ultimately elected, triggers the requirement that the candidate recuse him or herself from participation in the proceedings on the application, and approved the addition of a Q&A to the Commission's informational memorandum that addresses this matter.

ITEM 39: Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (17-0218)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a financial interest exception request regarding an employee of the State Highway Administration who has an attributable interest in her husband's business which is seeking to participate in a procurement as a subcontractor with the Maryland Transportation Authority.

Decision: The Commission allowed the financial interest exception with certain restrictions.

## ITEM 40: Executive Director's Report – Records Retention Schedule Revision

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the proposed change to the Commission's records retention schedule which seeks to change retention of judges' financial disclosure statements from two years after the filer leaves office to retain four years of filings.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed changes to the records retention schedule.
