MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

April 18, 2019

The meeting convened at 9:35 a.m. at the Commission's offices in Annapolis. There was an introduction of the two new members of the Commission, Aruna Miller and Geneau Thames and two new staff members, Emma Craig and Stephen Garrett. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved as adjusted.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the February 14, 2019 Meeting

<u>Discussion</u>: The draft minutes of the February 14, 2019 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

Decision: The draft minutes were approved.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by Financial Disclosure Administrator Young Smith and him. The recommendations covered the Executive Department, Department of Information Technology, Department of Human Services, State Police, Department of Juvenile Services, Department of Health, Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, Department of Natural Resources, Department of General Services, Food Center Authority, Public Service Commission, State Retirement Agency, Maryland 529, Department of Environment, Maryland Environmental Service, Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, Maryland Transit Administration, Maryland Port Administration, University of Maryland College Park, University System of Maryland, Towson University, Harford Community College, Howard Community College, Garrett College, Prince George's Community College, Treasurer's Office and the Department of Commerce.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved exemptions for the Active Assailant Interdisciplinary Work Group, the Commission to Study Mental and Behavioral Health in Maryland and the Workgroup to Analyze Results of the Juvenile Services Education County Pilot Program.

The Commission voted unanimously to close the meeting at 10:00 a.m. pursuant to §3-305(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Act to consider confidential enforcement matters per §5-407 of the Public Ethics Law.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission will not pursue any further action in this matter, being satisfied to continue with its longstanding position that clerks of the court and registers of wills fall under its jurisdiction in light of the conclusions in an Attorney General's advice letter. The Commission did direct Mr. Lord to advise the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals of its position, so that the Court may seek further clarification if desired. The Commission also directed Mr. Lord to notify the Conference of Circuit Court Clerks and the Association of Registers of Wills concerning the conclusions reached in the Attorney General's advice letter.

(Mr. Lord, Mr. Colquhoun, Ms. Pizzi and Mr. Garrett participated in the briefings, but did not participate in the decisions regarding Items 6 through 13.)

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined this activity is allowable with restrictions and the Department Secretary may participate in these activities.

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Natural Resources who also has a financial interest in her spouse's private business where she works providing graphic and web design services and administrative functions.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment with restrictions.
