August 22, 2019

The Commission also approved at this time changes to the Secondary Employment memorandum.

ITEM 39: Executive Director's Report – Lobbyist Climate Survey

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Lord advised the Commission that the response rate from lobbyists participating in the climate survey initiated by the Department of Legislative Services in the spring was only 15%. The substantive comments will not be available until the fall.

ITEM 40: Executive Director's Report – Legislative Proposal

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the status of the legislative proposal approved at the July meeting.

<u>ITEM 41:</u> Executive Director's Report – Meeting Schedule

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord discussed the process for identifying meeting dates for calendar year 2020. He will ascertain the availability of the staff and Commission members in the weeks prior to the next meeting and after dates are identified that are acceptable they will be submitted for the Commission's approval at the October meeting. Mr. Lord also inquired about whether the Commission was amenable, despite at least one conflict, to hold the next meeting on October 24 as currently scheduled.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined to leave the next meeting on the October 24 date as 4 Commissioners anticipate being able to attend.
