ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

<u>Discussion:</u> The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that waiving the receipt of eligible compensation by a board member does not exempt the board member from filing Form 1.

<u>ITEM 36:</u> Executive Director's Report – Legislative Summary

Discussion: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the status of legislation affecting the Public Ethics Law, discussed the expected impact of those bills if enacted, and obtained the Commission's guidance on the approach to take on the bills. The bills include: HB 159 (State Ethics Commission - Determination of Public Officials in an Executive Unit – Information from Units of State Government); HB 190/SB 348 (Public Ethics – Officials and Lobbyists – Reporting Ceremonial Gifts and Awards of Insignificant Monetary Value); HB 282 (Prince George's County - Ethics – Limitations on Applicant Campaign Contributions); HB 315/SB 202 (Public Ethics - Executive Branch - Lobbying by Former Secretaries of Principal Departments (Shut the Revolving Door Act of 2020)); HB 346/SB 284 (Redistricting Reform Act of 2020); HB 360/SB 283 (Ethics and Accountability in Government Act); HB 370 (Bicounty Commissions - Annual Reports - Conflicts of Interest and Lobbying); HB 397/SB803 (Public Ethics -Legislative Unit – Definition); HB 953/SB 927 (Public Ethics - Issue Lobbying Communications - Lobbyist Registration and Disclosure Requirements); HB 1055/SB 974 (Public Ethics – Lobbyists – Gift Exception and Regulated Activities Exemption and SB 970 (Public Ethics – Disclosures and Fines and Penalties-Revisions); HB 1404 (Public Ethics – Financial Disclosure – Requirements (Conflicts of Interest Act)); HB 1565/HB 1544 (Campaign contributions by zoning applicants); SB 970 (Public Ethics – Disclosures and Fines and Penalties – Revisions).

ITEM 37: Executive Director's Report – Proposed Lobbying Regulation Changes

Discussion: Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the status of the proposed lobbying regulation changes.

ITEM 38: Executive Director's Report – Climate Survey of Lobbyists

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Climate Survey Report that addressed lobbyists and was part of a larger survey undertaken by a contractor engaged by the Department of Legislative Services.
