MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

April 16, 2020

The meeting started at 9:10 a.m. with all participants joining remotely on Google Hangouts; the public portion of the meeting was streamed live. Those listed as present participated remotely in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved as adjusted.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the February 20, 2020 Meeting

<u>Discussion:</u> The draft minutes of the February 20, 2020 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

<u>Decision:</u> The draft minutes were approved.

ITEM 3: Boards and Commissions - Executive Unit Determination

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on whether or not the Provider Review Panel of the State Emergency Medical Services Board should be considered an executive unit covered by the Public Ethics Law.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that the Provider Review Panel of the State Emergency Medical Services Board is an executive agency and its members are public officials covered by the Ethics Law.

ITEM 4: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by Financial Disclosure Administrator, Young Smith and Executive Director, Michael Lord. The recommendations covered Department of the Environment, University of Maryland College Park, Department of Natural Resources, Technology Development Corporation, Department of General Services, Military Department, Department of Juvenile Services, Anne Arundel Community College, State Highway Administration, Howard Community College, University of Maryland Global Campus, Department of Health, Executive Department and the Public Broadcasting Commission.

Decision: The Commission approved Mr. Lord's recommendations.

ITEM 5 Financial Disclosure Exemption Request

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on the Stakeholder Workgroup in the Governor's Office of Small, Minority and Women Business Affairs' request for exemption from the financial disclosure requirement.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved an exemption for the Stakeholder Workgroup in the Governor's Office of Small, Minority and Women Business Affairs.

ITEM 28: Informal Matter – Executive Department (20-0163)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on an employee in the Executive Department who wants to participate, along with the employee's spouse, in the State's resident curatorship program.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission conditionally granted an exception to allow the participation, subject to receipt of favorable recommendations from the employee's supervisor and department head.

<u>ITEM 29:</u> Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (20-0185)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on an employee in the State Highway Administration whose spouse has a financial interest in her family's business, an IT vendor that does business with the State Highway Administration.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that the employee met the regulatory criteria and granted an exception to allow this attributable financial interest.

ITEM 30: Informal Matter – State Highway Administration (20-0186)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on an employee in the State Highway Administration who has a financial interest (stocks from an Employee Stock Option Plan) in her former employer's engineering and construction consulting company. The company does not currently do business with the State Highway Administration.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission determined that the employee met the regulatory criteria and granted an exception to allow this financial interest.

ITEM 31: Informal Matter – Board of Public Works (20-0139)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Board of Public Works who wants to serve on the board of a community development association.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

ITEM 32: Informal Matter – Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors (20-0187)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Lord briefed the Commission staff advice provided to a member of the Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors who wanted to accept short-term contractual employment with the Department of Health as co-Director of the Temporary Mortuary Affairs Center.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission concurred in the advice provided by staff.

<u>ITEM 33:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Human Services (20-0152)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee at the Department of Human Services wanting to work as a family wellness counselor at a private addiction service.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 34:</u> Informal Matter – University of Maryland System (20-0175)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee with the University of Maryland System wanting advice on the application of the Ethics Law if she wins the election for a county board of education.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 35:</u> Informal Matter – Maryland Historical Trust (20-0099)

<u>Discussion</u>: Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee with the Maryland Historical Trust wanting to continue working with a conservation publication fellowship.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

ITEM 36: Informal Matter – Community College of Baltimore County

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee with the Community College of Baltimore County wanting to work as a Fellow with a leadership success program.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

ITEM 37: Informal Matter – Department of Housing and Community Development (20-0107)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee with the Department of Housing and Community Development wanting to be an independent sales agent with a realty company.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee with the Department of Human Services wanting to work as a social worker in a private hospital.

<u>ITEM 42:</u> Informal Matter – Department of Transportation (19-0616)

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Thompson briefed the Commission on a post-employment request regarding a former employee with the Department of Transportation wanting to bid on a contract with his own business that he signed off on while employed with the Department.

<u>Decision</u>: The Commission agreed with the previous advice given that this activity is significant participation that prevents the employee, and his company, from participating in this contract.
