MINUTES OF THE STATE ETHICS COMMISSION MEETING

April 20, 2022

The meeting convened at 9:00 a.m. at 45 Calvert Street, 3rd Floor conference room. Those listed as present participated in all portions of the meeting unless otherwise noted. If other individuals participated in aspects of the meeting, they will be identified in the specific line item where their participation occurred.

ITEM 1: Tentative Agenda

Discussion: The Commission reviewed the tentative agenda.

Decision: The tentative agenda was approved.

ITEM 2: Minutes of the March 2, 2022 Meeting

Discussion: The draft minutes of the March 2, 2022 meeting were reviewed and discussed.

<u>Decision:</u> The draft minutes were approved.

ITEM 3: Financial Disclosure Exemption Request

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on a request for exemption from the financial disclosure requirement from the Prescription Drug Affordability Stakeholder Council.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission granted an exemption for the Prescription Drug Affordability Stakeholder Council.

ITEM 4: Financial Disclosure Additions and Deletions

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair presented a listing of the proposed additions and deletions to the financial disclosure list recommended by State agencies and reviewed by Financial Disclosure Administrator, Young Smith and Executive Director, Jennifer Allgair. The recommendations covered the Worker's Compensation Commission, Department of Health, Department of Public Safety & Correctional Services, Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth and Victim Services, Maryland Transportation Authority, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Information Technology, Department of Budget & Management, Department of Veterans Affairs, Department of Juvenile Services, Maryland Technology Development Corporation, Department of General Services, Department of Transportation, Department of Education, State Highway Administration, Prince George's Community College, University of Maryland Global Campus, Department of Agriculture, Maryland 529 and the Department of Human Services.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved Ms. Allgair's recommendations.

<u>ITEM 5:</u> Local Government – Maryland Association of Counties (MACO) – HB 363 (The Director of MACO was present.)

<u>Discussion:</u> The Director of the Maryland Association of Counties appeared before the Commission to discuss HB 363 from the 2021 General Assembly session. Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on the HB 363 changes to the gift provisions of the Public Ethics Law which added certain associations representing local governments to the definition of a controlled donor under the gift provisions of the Ethics Law. Mr. Colquhoun discussed the Commission's updated local government regulations and Model Laws to reflect these legislative changes and is in the process of working with local governments to amend, review and approve local ethics laws. The Commissioners and Mr. Colquhoun discussed these matters and MACo's concerns with the changes. Mr. Colquhoun also offered to meet with MACo representatives and other local government association representatives to discuss the various exceptions contained in the Public Ethics Law and address specific gift questions in the future.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission suggested that the Director consult with Commission staff or return to the General Assembly for clarifying legislation.

<u>ITEM 6:</u> Local Government – Kent County Board of Education (22-0180)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on the proposed amendments to the local ethics ordinance for the Kent County Board of Education.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed amendments.

<u>ITEM 7:</u> Local Government – Howard County (22-0186)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on the proposed amendments to the local ethics ordinance for Howard County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed amendments.

<u>ITEM 8:</u> Local Government – Talbot County (22-0232)

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Colquhoun briefed the Commission on the proposed amendments to the local ethics ordinance for Talbot County.

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission approved the proposed amendments.

ITEM 9: Executive Director's Report – 2022 Legislative Update

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on legislation that passed affecting the Public Ethics Law. The bills include: HB246 – Open Meetings Act-Notices, Closed Sessions, and Minutes – Retention Peroids, Online Posting, Public Inspection; SB15/HB340 – Election Law – Campaign Finance – Enforcement; SB589/HB907 – University of Maryland – Employees – Authorization to Fund-Raise; and HB1059 – Bi-county Commissions – Ethics – Certification of Compliance.

<u>ITEM 10:</u> Executive Director's Report – New Training Module

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed new training module for elected officials effective January 1, 2023 and provided an outline of the training.

ITEM 11: Executive Director's Report – Financial Disclosure System

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on the proposed changes to the Financial Disclosure Statement Form 1 for certain State officials as a result of legislation passed during last session effective January 1, 2023.

ITEM 12: Executive Director's Report – Cyber Security Project

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Allgair briefed the Commission on DoITs collaboration with an outside vendor to perform an IT assessment from all agencies relating to cyber security.

<u>Discussion:</u> Ms. Henry briefed the Commission on a secondary employment request regarding an employee in the Department of Transportation working as a boards and commissions coordinator with an office of a county executive.

Decision: The Commission granted an exception to allow this secondary employment.

<u>ITEM 25:</u> Informal Matter – Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (22-0106)

<u>Decision:</u> The Commission staff will draft a letter stating that Commission neither approves of, nor endorses the idea of the official authoring a book at this time based on the information provided by the official. The letter will include information relating to the prestige, confidential information, secondary employment, and other provisions of the Public Ethics Law.
