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What We Do!

Garrett County Behavioral Health Authority/Local Management Board (GCBHA/LMB) is located in the Garrett County Health Department.

GCBHA is the management agency for publicly funded mental health and substance related disorder services. The agency strives to improve these services to residents of Garrett County, works to better integrate existing services, and to expand services currently available. We also assist persons in receiving medication, transportation to services, housing and employment.

LMB provides leadership in facilitating change in the community care system to assist families in obtaining the services needed to become more functional. We improve outcomes for children and families by working with community partners to plan, coordinate and monitor health and human services programs.

GCBHA/LMB is funded through grants from the Maryland Department of Health and the Governor's Office for Children.

Mission Statement

GCBHA/LMB will:

- Manage coordinated, comprehensive, collaborative, and accessible behavioral health services for individuals who have psychiatric and substance related disorders, in partnership with all stakeholders. We will promote treatment, support, and rehabilitation to foster recovery, resiliency, and wellness.
- Promote a stable, safe, healthy environment for children and families; thereby, increasing self-sufficiency and promoting family preservation.

Vision Statement

To support this mission, GCBHA/LMB will:

- Facilitate the continuance of a consumer focused behavioral health system in Garrett County that is comprehensive, coordinated and accessible.
- Maintain an advocacy role, assuring the availability of quality services to families in conjunction with promoting and assuring environmental and individual health through education; regulation; health promotion; disease prevention, detection, treatment, and care.

Leadership

Standing in the forefront for advocacy, quality of care and community collaboration.

Direction

Having a vision for improving the quality of behavioral health services, and to achieve success for youth within safe and healthy families and their communities.

Management

Insuring that the scarce resources will be optimized to the greatest benefit to the people we serve.

Education

Insuring the necessary cutting-edge training for all local professions and teaching detrimental effects of stigma, and enabling consumers to become more proactive in their own treatment.

Bringing together local child-serving agencies, local child providers, clients of services, families, and other community representatives to empower local stakeholders in addressing the needs of and setting priorities for our community.

PBHS Service Eligibility

- The Individual has a mental health disorder as defined in DSM-5
- Individual is a Medicaid recipient
- Individual is 'dually eligible' for Medicare but remains in the Medicaid fee-for-service system
- Individual is Medicaid ineligible and because of psychiatric and financial need may be eligible to have the cost of mental health services (in whole or in part) subsidized by the State and/or local funds.

The adult Medicaid population is eligible for all services within the 'benefits package' if they meet medical necessity criteria for that level of service. The Medicaid-ineligible individuals are eligible for all services, except inpatient and emergency room services, if funding is available, the individual meets medical necessity criteria for that level of services and the individual meets any of the specific eligibility requirements. All benefits listed in the Benefits Package may not be available within Garrett County. Call the Garrett County Behavioral Health Authority for all services.
